## Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Christmas Peace

**This Sunday, as we celebrate Christmas, many share what the Holy Family shared that first Christmas – being away from home or at least from their home as they were accustomed to having it be.** The Holy Family had to travel to Bethlehem from Nazareth and found there was no room for them. Many in the parish also have traveled over these past months from their homes to stay with friends or relatives, some have begun to return to their homes and are either living in trailers or in homes without floors and other things they were accustomed to.

For me, the call to live as the Holy Family comes from being open to receive the help needed to peacefully accept and live lovingly the challenges that come from these adjustments we all have been experiencing. More than ever, they are called to be our patrons as we share the experience they had that first Christmas.

**Through the weeks of Advent, we lit another candle of the wreath each week as we moved through Advent to Christmas.** A new twist which some churches have begun



doing is at Christmas placing a Christ Candle in the middle of the wreath. We discussed this at our Pastoral Staff meeting as we approached Christmas and thought this would be a good idea, but not to use just any candle, but to use our Easter Candle. After all,

Christ was born so that he might teach us of the Father's love, suffer and die as evidence of that love, and then rise from the dead.

**Two "gifts" I received as we prepared for Christmas were very meaningful and one was unexpected.** Back in

August, we had the initial Confirmation Orientation meeting with our candidates for Confirmation and they signed up for interviews with me in preparation for Confirmation. I have interviewed the candidates since my arrival here and this year we have 80 candidates and most of the interviews were scheduled while they were on Christmas vacation. So the days before Christmas and the days of Christmas were and will be pretty full with back to back appointments. It's a real gift though, for me, as it is good to see so much hope for the future. Our candidates are really well prepared and it is good to speak with them about their gifts. Some leave the office with a big grin, as they might not have realized just how gifted they are. They are real hope for the future. My first appointment was with **Cody Fourrier** on Friday, a week


ago. I went to Catholic High and graduated with his



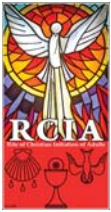
grandfather, Steve Fourrier. It was good speaking with him at the age Steve and I were 56 years ago. I had to smile as I wondered what we would have said to the priest. After several days of back to back interviews, it was great looking to the future with real hope expressed in so many ways.

The Confirmation Interviews were planned and scheduled even before the flood, but the second meaningful gift was unexpected and the result of the flood. As you may notice above, my temporary office for the past four months has been the corner of a classroom in the Faith Formation Center. My classroom/office is at the far end of the hall, near the rear exit/entrance to the building. Being there, I am able to hear a lot of what goes on in the hallways, especially the sound of excited voices of the children grades 1-6 who come for religion classes Monday and Wednesdays. It is a wonderful sound that really says they are happy to be here. On occasion I have reason to be going from my office to the front office (I have no phone in my office. ☺), and it is a real pleasure to see the smiles and excited looks on the faces of the children. They give me a thumbs up and a big smile. This speaks a lot about them, but also about our religion program. We have wonderful teachers and staff who work to organize the best possible experiences for them, making our Parish School of Religion not only educational, but fun for them. We are so blessed to have the formation programs which we have in place, for every age from the youngest to the oldest among us.

As we begin the Christmas Season, I offer a word of thanks to all who have assisted us in preparing the church and rest of the campus for the celebration of Christ's birth. May all he came to share, take more and more root in our lives, schools, homes and workplaces. Let us keep one another in prayer as we go through the Christmas Season and begin another year together. 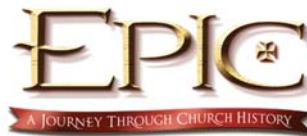
