

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Respect

This Sunday St. Paul in our second reading tells us to have the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus. This is easier said than done. In fact it would be impossible were it not for the gift of the Lord's Divine Spirit. Jesus humbled himself, and through the gift of his Spirit we can do the same, practicing virtue and choosing that which is good and life-giving. Even when our human faults and weaknesses cloud our understanding, we can still choose to follow God's command, as the first son in today's Gospel did. We may not know why he first refused, but what we do know is that by his actions he is the one who had the same attitude of Christ, for he did what his father asked. Let us pray for each other to do the same, to trust in God's promises, rely on Christ's help and allow the grace of the Holy Spirit to work within us that we all may have the same attitude of Christ.

In the United States, today is Respect Life Sunday and the Bishops of the United States have designated October as Respect Life Month. In presenting to us the theme for the month, "Be Not Afraid," the Bishops of the United



States stated: "When battered by life's storms, or immersed in a dense fog of suffering and uncertainty, we may feel alone and not equipped handle circumstances.

Yet with words that echo through thousands of years into the corners of

our hearts, the Lord says to us, "Do not fear: I am with you" (Isaiah 41:10). He speaks these words not as one who merely observes our pain, but as one who experienced immense suffering. And the very wounds that bear witness to his suffering indicate the essence of our identity and worth: we are loved by God. Reflecting on the healed wounds of the Risen Christ, we see that even our most difficult trials can be the place where God manifests his victory. He makes all things beautiful. He makes all things new. He is always with us. Jesus promised this when he gave the disciples the same mission he gives to each of us: Go. Go be my hands and feet to a world enslaved by fear. Go to the woman who is unexpectedly pregnant and fears the future. Go to your friend who fears reprisal at work because he takes a stand for the protection of human life. Go to your aging parent in failing health who fears being a burden. And go to others, too, for their support. We don't need to have everything figured out. We can simply follow the guidance

of Our Blessed Mother, the first disciple: "Do whatever he tells you" (John 2:5). Walk with each other. Do not be afraid to embrace God's gift of life. Whatever storms or trials we face, we are not alone. He is with us. "Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20)."

The Forty Days for Life began September 27 and will conclude November 5. Our parish has accepted the responsibility of Sunday, October 22, from 7:00 a.m. till 7:00 p.m. We will need at least 24 parishioners to fill the 12 hour time frame on 756 Colonial Drive, Baton Rouge, across the street from the Delta Women's Facility. Just call the parish office and we can sign you up.

The 13th Day - In a world torn apart by persecution, war, and oppression, three children in Fatima, Portugal, were chosen by God to offer an

urgent message of hope to the world. Based on the memoirs of the oldest seer, Lucia Santos, and many thousands of independent eye-witness accounts, The 13th Day dramatizes the true story of three young shepherds who experienced six apparitions of Our Lady between May and October 1917 which culminated in the final prophesied Miracle of the Sun on October 13. Abducted from their homes, thrown into prison, and interrogated under the threat of death in the government's attempt to silence them, the children remained true to their story about the crucial messages from Mary of prayer, repentance, and conversion for the world. Our Lady gave a secret to the children told in three parts, from a harrowing vision of hell, to prophetic warnings of future events including the advent and timing of the Second World War, the spread of Communism, and the attempted assassination of the Pope. Stump the Deacon!

What is the proper way of receiving Holy Communion?

Any Catholic, who is free of mortal sin and has fasted from food and drink for more than an hour, is eligible to receive Holy Communion. Water, medicine and food or drink necessary for the health of the individual is exempt from the one hour fast. Holy Communion (also called the Eucharist) is received by consuming either the Body of Christ (the consecrated Host) or the Blood of Christ (the consecrated Wine) or both. The Catholic Church believes that both the Body and Blood of Christ are contained in both the consecrated Host and the consecrated Wine. Before receiving the Eucharist, one should bow before each Eucharistic Minister and then say "Amen". The Body of Christ can be received on either the tongue or the hand. If received on the hand, it should be consumed immediately and not brought back to the pew. Any non-Catholic or Catholic who has not yet received their First Communion, is eligible for a blessing by the minister of Holy Communion. To obtain this blessing, one should approach the minister with his/her hand crossed over chest.
