Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Respect

**This Sunday's Gospel is a familiar one, the Wedding Feast.** We are all familiar with invitations with RSVP's. We all send them out. Seldom do we receive them all back. Sometimes those who didn't respond show up anyway. Other times, they may respond they are coming but aren't able to be there. Today's Scriptures reflect on God's invitations.

In our first reading, Isaiah tells us that God will provide on his holy mountain a feast for us, "a feast for all peoples, a feast of rich foods and choice wines...he will destroy death forever." It is a beautiful reminder of God's faithfulness, "Behold our God to whom we looked to save us! This is the Lord to whom we looked, let us rejoice and be glad that he has saved us."

Paul picks up in our second reading the same theme when he tells us "God will fully supply whatever you need, in accord with his glorious riches in Christ Jesus." At this point in time, for Paul (and us!) what Isaiah prophesied in the first reading had already come to pass through Jesus – death has been destroyed forever. St. Paul from his prison cell is telling them that they can be content with whatever circumstances come their way, because the banquet has begun.

All that has gone before with Isaiah and St. Paul, comes to fullness in the Gospel when Jesus speaks of the wedding banquet hosted by the king. The king provides everything and invitations are sent. Some of "the worthy" refuse to attend, so the king widens his invitation to all the servants can find, the good and the bad alike, and the hall was filled with guests. Jesus is highlighting the rejection his own people have shown him and the prophets who came before him. He is telling them that the invitation will now go out to the Gentiles.

**Bad and good alike are invited to the wedding feast.** This is all of us. We, the Church, are not a club where we gather to celebrate all our successes and tell all how much better we are than everyone else. Rather the Church is what Pope Francis calls a "field hospital where we come for healing, hope and help." We believe, as St. Paul said, that we can do all things in Him who strengthens us. We treasure the invitation and come to receive from the good Lord, the healing and gifts we need to live good Christian lives.

**A BEGINNING EXPERIENCE WEEKEND:** The Beginning Experience Weekend on October 20 - 22, 2017 is a wonderful healing opportunity for those suffering the loss of a spouse either through death or separation/divorce. The location of the retreat is the Rosaryville Spirit Life Center in Ponchatoula. Those who have attended this weekend attest to the new hope they have received and the powerful safe and loving environment they found in the experience. Stump the Deacon!

Why do we have to fast before Communion?

We need to fast one hour before receiving Holy Communion so that we will appreciate who we are going to receive—Jesus Christ. Fasting prepares us spiritually and mentally to receive our Lord; it creates a spiritual hunger and thirst that we ought to have. We should not want to spoil our appetite for God, but to increase it so that we will receive all of the graces possible when we participate fully in the sacrifice of the Mass by receiving the Body and Blood of Christ. Jesus said in the beatitudes, "Blest are they who hunger and thirst for holiness; they shall have their fill" (Mt. 5:6). Basically, fasting is an exercise of humility, hope and love—essential virtues in preparing ourselves to receive Holy Communion. The fast enhances our spiritual disposition that we need to receive Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.
