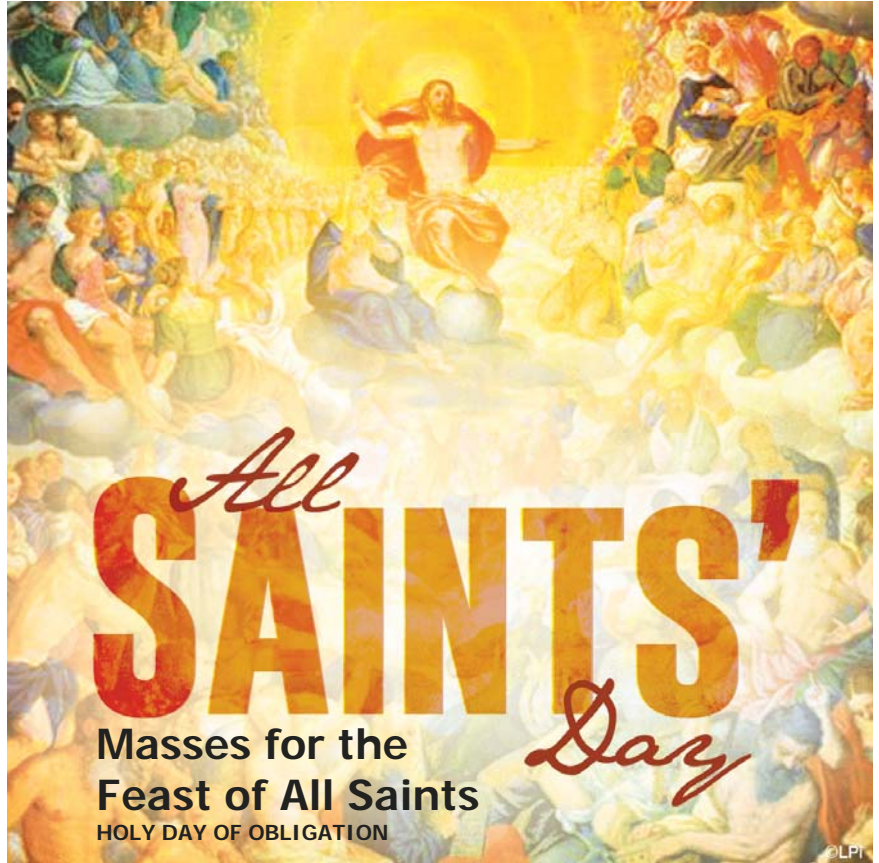

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Glory

The Scriptures this Sunday all seem to come together in the last part of the Gospel, in the familiar quote: *“You will love your neighbor as yourself.”*

Our first reading calls us to remember that others are not always like us – that others may not always enjoy the blessings that we too frequently take for granted. The Hebrews are reminded in this passage that they, too, were aliens in a foreign land. We are all aliens in one way or another. In spite of our differences, we recognize how blessed we are to be in the presence of a loving group of people who accept our differences. We are called to open our arms and hearts – sharing what little we have with love and joy. This reading prescribes how to treat others. When we tend to treat others in this way with an open heart and mind, we are blessed with humility and the opportunity to walk in solidarity with them – hand in hand, heart to heart, human with human. The Scriptures today call all of us to treat others well, with respect and love – including family members, friends, and strangers. Our gospel completes the story, Jesus basically reiterates the message from the Exodus reading and puts it in terms that all can understand. He updates it to the perfect guideline/model for living a Christian life. *You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.* Simply the greatest commandment . . . And then the second is how we put the first into action. We can do this in ministries or just by being present for those around us, by being kind and thoughtful to all *neighbors*, and by recognizing the opportunities to see God in all things. If we truly live this way everything else is details.

The month of November will begin this Wednesday with the celebration of All Saints Day, the opportunity to give thanks for God’s call which so many of our family members and friends both heard, and with God’s help, responded to. Some saints of God have been known and recognized by Christians for centuries, others may only be known and recognized by a small circle of family and friends. But the common denominator they all share is being called by God, the desire to respond to that call, and to receive all the good Lord came to share. Thus we begin the wonderful month of Thanksgiving, thanking God first for his loving call which brings us life and helps us be “the glory of our God and Father.”

THE BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE Christian Communities remember the names of their dead. These names are heard in the Prayers of the Faithful during the Eucharist and in the chanting of the Litany of the Saints at the Easter Vigil. Their names are seen on memorial cards, tombs in the Catacombs of ancient days and on the graves and mausoleums of today. Especially in the month of



November our deceased family and friends are remembered in prayer. During the month of November, we have the custom of giving a place of honor to a Book of Remembrance in which we write the names of our deceased relatives and friends. Beginning the weekend of October 28/29,

the book will be placed on a stand near the baptistery for the convenience of those who wish to begin writing names of their deceased in it. Beginning November 1, and until the beginning of Advent, the Easter Candle will be burning near the book and flowers will be placed by it. Those whose names are written in the Book of Remembrance will be remembered at the Eucharistic celebrations through the month of November. For the convenience of those who participate in the Sunday Eucharist at the Sacred Heart Mission, pages from the book will be available to sign beginning October 28. The presence of the Book of Remembrance in the church at Thanksgiving will be especially meaningful as we give thanks not only for the blessings of the earth, but the blessing of family, friends and eternal life.

Last Sunday I met with and gave talks to four cub scouts and fourteen girl scouts who were working on a Rosary



Patch. It was a good afternoon, and we thank the adults who worked with them last Sunday, and work with them on a regular basis. They were a joy to be with.

This weekend is our Fall Festival, and we hope you can come and spend time with us, enjoy good food, good music and a lot of other entertainment for all ages. Many thanks to all those who helped our Festival “rebuild” since the flood. Let us keep one another in prayer. Love,

Stump the Deacon!

Why are there only seven sacraments?

The Councils of Lyons (1274) and Florence (1438-1445) taught there are only seven sacraments, the ones we know today. The Council of Trent reiterated this teaching in response to Protestant rejection of some of the sacraments. So, why only seven? Let's look at the definition of sacraments. The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines sacraments as "...efficacious [effective] signs of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which divine life is dispensed to us. The visible rites by which the sacraments are celebrated signify and make present the graces proper to each sacrament." (CCC1131) When we look at this definition, the number of sacraments become clearer. For instance, baptism was instituted by Christ to convey grace or divine life (Mt 28:19; 1 Pt 3:21). The visible sign of baptism is water that is poured over the head or water where one is fully immersed, as well as the words spoken "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Baptism, therefore, fits the definition of a sacrament. Other rituals, such as Jesus washing the feet of His Apostles, were established by Christ, but do not convey grace, so they are not sacraments. Other sacramentals such as the rosary, may be an occasion of grace but were not instituted by Christ; therefore, they are not sacraments. Seven rituals of the Catholic Church fit the definition above: Baptism, Confirmation, the Eucharist, Reconciliation, Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders and Matrimony.
