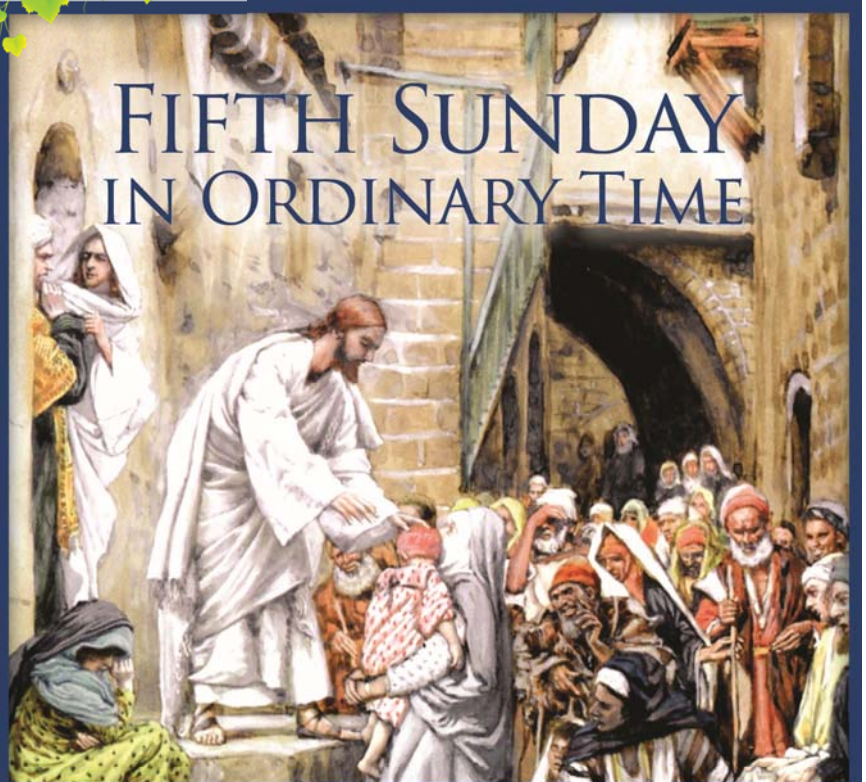

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Hearts

This Sunday Jesus heals Simon Peter's mother-in-law.

We can only imagine how she had been looking forward to Simon and his friends coming. The thought of having the new, dynamic teacher with them must have excited her. She wants everything to be just right. But she has a fever and cannot even get out of bed. All she wants to do is serve her guests and she cannot. What a delight it must have been for Jesus to cure her. We can see the servant heart in Simon's mother-in-law; as soon as she realizes she is healed, she begins to serve the group and make them comfortable in her home. We see the heart of a servant in Jesus, too. He spends most of the day healing the sick, and they keep coming and coming until after sunset. "The whole town was gathered at the door." Jesus had to be worn out, but he kept on serving. When he awoke from sleep the next morning, but before anyone else was up, he needed to get away to pray and he found a deserted place. Simon and the other disciples looked for him and on finding him said, "Everyone is looking for you." Jesus can stay and make a name for himself but he says that it is time to move on. Why? Jesus is a servant of God. He does not come to make a splash - to impress people - to become well known. He simply wants to proclaim the good news and heal people. Jesus knows who he is. He is not full of himself. He does not forget his mission. May our good God give us the grace to remember why we have been called, and to fulfill our calling as servants of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Soon CommUnity Hands will be resuming ministry to the poor and needy of our community. You may know this already, but CommUnity Hands is an ecumenical ministry in Livingston Parish which had its origins here at Immaculate Conception at our Leadership Nights. We reached out to nearby churches, and began the ministry and soon over twenty churches in our community had joined this ministry. Usually contacts are first made in the local churches and then the local church refers the people in need to CommUnity Hands. They are supported by donations from the member churches and from community fund raisers through the year. After the flood, they temporarily disbanded, but have recently been meeting again at First Baptist Church. At their recent meeting, they decided to resume their ministry the first week of April. When they resume, they will be open on Thursdays and will need two people there from 9 AM to 12 PM to operate the center. They are asking each church to supply volunteers for one Thursday a month. **We are asking for a few volunteers from Immaculate Conception to help us do our part.** No experience is necessary. They will be happy to explain and train volunteers. Would you be willing to give 12 days a year for four hours to an excellent ministry that helps those in need in our community? **What they need now are names of volunteers to take care of one Thursday. Immaculate**

Conception would have either the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd, or 4th Thursday and we would be responsible for that day. **Any interested in serving in this beautiful ecumenical ministry are asked to contact the parish office, me or Kay Keen at 225-287-6224 for more information. We really need your help with this beautiful ministry to the poor and needy.** Offering your name to serve once a month would be a great way of beginning Lent.

Many thanks and congratulations to Chad Street who brought together a group of scouts to work in the Prayer Garden and refurbish it for the approaching Lenten



Season. Doing this as an Eagle Scout project, they pressure washed the sidewalks, benches, pruned dead limbs from trees and azaleas, and did much to help the Prayer Garden be a refreshing place for those who come there for prayer and reflection. We thank Chad and all those who assisted him with this project.

Congratulations to Anais Odom as she celebrated her 100th birthday this Sunday.

I remember last year at this time so well. She was staying at Southside Gardens while her home here was being prepared and I thought I would bring her Communion as her birthday neared. What is the RCIA Rite of Election? This Rite marks a key moment. The catechumens travel to the Cathedral where the community, with godparents representing the parish, will wholeheartedly acclaim the participants' readiness. It is appropriate for the bishop to recognize them because he is the sign of unity of the particular Church, and it is the parish community's responsibility to bring those in RCIA into the fullness of the life of the Church. The godparents' role is very significant; they represent the community and are asked during this Rite to make serious statements about the catechumens. The decision of an RCIA participant to go through this Rite means that the judgment and decision-making about whether to enter the Catholic Church has ended. From this point forward, they are no longer catechumens but are called the "Elect." They have been chosen to enter into the final period of preparation for initiation, and called by the bishop, their shepherd, to the holy mysteries to be celebrated at Easter. Stump the Deacon!

If two people have children while they are married, and then they civilly divorce and obtain an annulment—what is the status of the children from that marriage?

If the couple was free to marry in the first place, any children born are legitimate regardless of the fact that a divorce or annulment was later obtained. This is confirmed by Canon Law paragraph 1137. The children are legitimate because the marriage was believed to be a good marriage when entered into, and there was no reason to think otherwise. Additionally, a divorce or annulment does not change the fact that the marriage was legal for civil purposes; therefore, the children's status remains legitimate. The fact that a condition was later established to render the union annulled does not change the fact that the couple was thought to be married. The Catholic Church, therefore, still considers their children to be legitimate.
