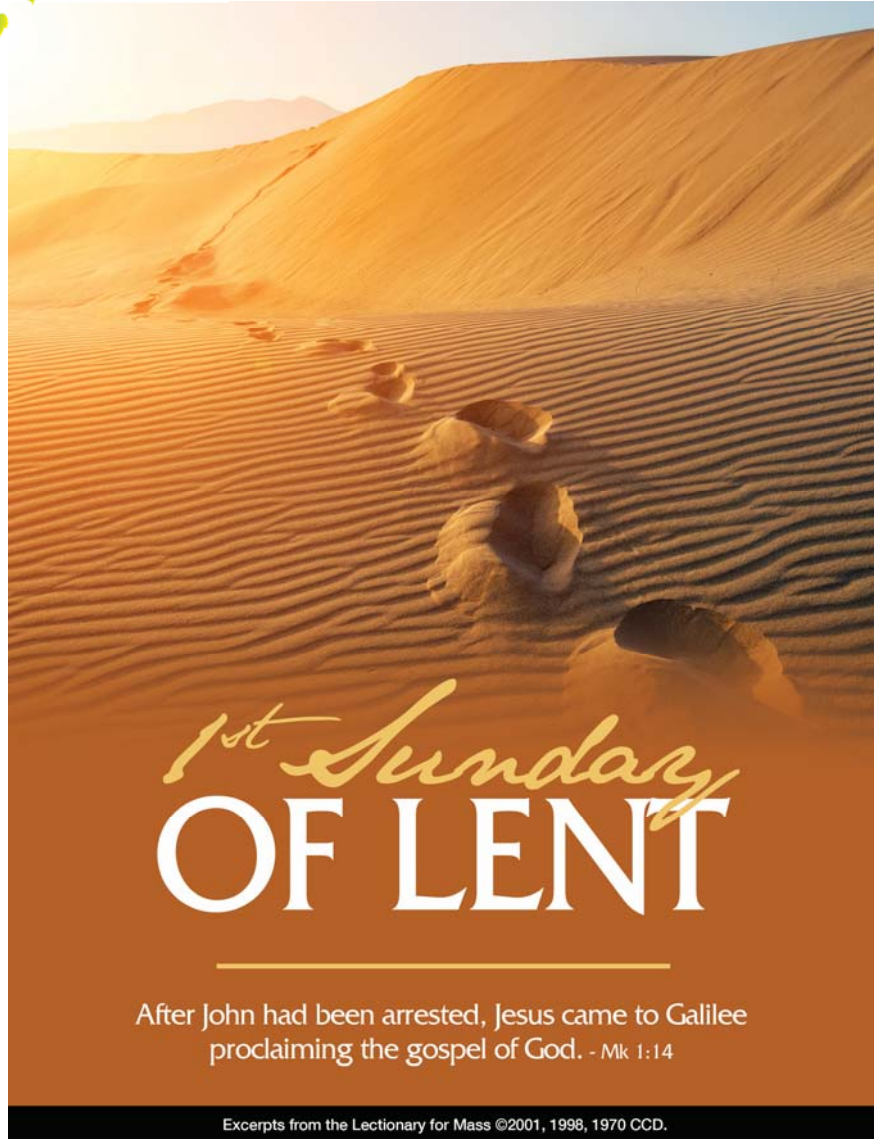

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: A Lenten Journey

This Sunday as we celebrate the First Sunday of Lent, we take time with the Lord to reflect upon our Commitment to Ministry. The Lord went into the desert for forty days to reflect upon his commitment to minister the Father's Unconditional Love – how could he best do it. His human nature allowed him to be tempted, but the Father's love and his love for the Father prevailed.

In the Scriptures, some numbers seem more important than others. One number which shows up in our Scriptures today is the number 40. I once read that the number 40 appears 146 times in Scripture, far too many to list here, but these are just a few of the more familiar times:

- + 40 days of rain during the flood at the time of Noah;
- + 40 years Moses spent in Egypt as shepherd and leader;
- + 40 days Moses spent on Mt. Sinai receiving the commandments.;
- + 40 years of wandering in the desert when Israel was disobedient;
- + 40 days Elijah spent in the cave awaiting the word of God;
- + 40 days Jonah spent preaching in Nineveh;
- + 40 days spent by Jesus in the wilderness after his Baptism;
- + 40 days Jesus appeared to his disciples between his Resurrection and Ascension.

So the number 40 appears frequently in the Scriptures, especially related to time of testing and preparation for great turning points. In the Gospel today, the 40 days Jesus was in the desert being tempted is more than a simple marking of how many days he was there. It links his experience to that of Moses, Elijah, the prophets and the people of Israel during the Exodus. Those 40 days of testing were also days of preparation, getting him ready for all he was going to reveal. After the 40 days or years of Noah and Moses and the Israelites, **there was always a great, new beginning**, so would it be for Jesus, and through Jesus for us. One thing stands out – **AFTER THIS TIME OF TESTING, THE PERSONS BEING TESTED SEEM TO BE STRONGER THAN EVER, AND READY TO BE OF SERVICE TO GOD, ANNOUNCING THE BEGINNING OF A NEW DAY FILLED WITH GOD'S LOVE.** I think it is good as we begin Lent to remember all those who have gone through 40 days such as we are beginning. Let us, in faith, prepare for what God may wish to be doing with us, for us and through us for his beloved world. In a lot of ways this ties in with Stewardship of Ministry below.

This Sunday we traditionally begin to reconsider our commitment to Stewardship of Ministry, Stewardship of Time and Talent. If we really wanted to be dramatic, in

light of what has just been written, we might want to spend 40 days considering that commitment, emerging from Lent into a new commitment of time and talent. But I think that would probably get old fast, and you would be ready to chase me out before Lent was over. 😊 **Instead, we have traditionally presented the invitation on the First Sunday of Lent, asking you to prayerfully consider your (re) commitments this First Week of Lent and then return your commitment cards next Sunday in the Commitment Procession.** Next Sunday, when we return them, we will hear the Gospel of the Transfiguration. **Isn't this what our commitments are intended to do? –Transfigure our lives, the lives of others, our world?**

As we celebrate the beginning of Lent, I would like to share with you another new beginning with a ministry that is associated with Lent, our R.C.I.A. Our candidates and catechumens will be received by the Bishop this Sunday afternoon in the Rites of Election at the Cathedral at 1:00. I plan to be there with them, and every family in the parish has received the names of one of our candidates or catechumens, those who are preparing to enter into Full Communion with “the living Church,” the Body of Christ, at Easter. Let us keep them all, but especially those whose names we may have received, in our prayers as we continue through lent.

You have also received the name of a parishioner or family in your packets. Keeping them in prayer is a good reminder that we are not in this alone. I have always enjoyed as we celebrate Easter, sending a card of good wishes to those whose name I received as we began Lent. Both of the cards I received are on the mirror of my bathroom in the rectory.

As we began the Lenten Season and were signed with ashes, I know many were aware it was also Valentine's Day.

I commented to some of the staff that perhaps we could place the ashes on peoples foreheads in the shape of a heart. But when you stop to think about it, the cross expresses a love that hearts or valentines can only try to imitate. The cross is the greatest expression of self-giving love we have ever had the grace to see. Of course while we all try to make crosses on the foreheads of those who come to us, the ashes don't always cooperate, but we know, and God also knows, what is in our hearts. Because I didn't have the early Eucharist here Ash Wednesday, I was able to celebrate an early Eucharist at Angola and sign the inmates. This was very humbling for me. Let us keep each other in prayer; Love,

Our journey of faith begins with a call from God. Our candidates and catechumens come before us today so that we, their faith community, may confirm God's calling to begin the final period of their initiation into the full sacramental life of the Church. After the Rite of Sending, the catechumens and candidates will be presented to Bishop Muench at the Rite of Election which takes place at St. Joseph Cathedral in Baton Rouge this afternoon. They will be honored at a reception at the Catholic Life Center where they will be able to meet the Bishop. It is appropriate for the Bishop to recognize them because he is the sign of unity of the particular Church, and it is the parish community's responsibility to bring those in RCIA into the fullness of the Church. The sponsors' and godparents' roles are very significant; they represent the community and are asked during this Rite to make a public testimony about the catechumens. The decision of the RCIA participant to go through this Rite means that the judgement and decision-making about whether to enter the Catholic Church has ended. From this point forward, they are no longer catechumens but are called the "Elect." They will enter into the final period of preparation for initiation into the Church.

Stump the Deacon!

Is it permissible to pray the rosary on an unblessed rosary?

The effect resulting from praying the rosary does not depend on whether the rosary is blessed. A blessing is a powerful assist, but the lack of blessing does not prevent us from using it. In fact, we could use any prayer-counter, including our fingers. The rosary beads themselves do not impart grace; they are a sacramental that facilitates our ability to grow in sanctifying grace through prayer. Prayer is always good. We should use all objects in our possession to show our love for God, even if they are not blessed.

Then why should I get my rosary blessed?

Having a rosary blessed attaches a sacredness that it would not have if it were unblessed. It sets it aside as a sacred object to be used for sacred use. Blessed articles are very much a part of the tradition of the Church. It does not mean that it could not have been used for sacred purpose before being blessed. The blessing dedicates the object to God and reminds us that we are meant to be dedicated to God. Any bishop, priest, or deacon can bless a rosary or other sacramental to be used for personal devotions.
