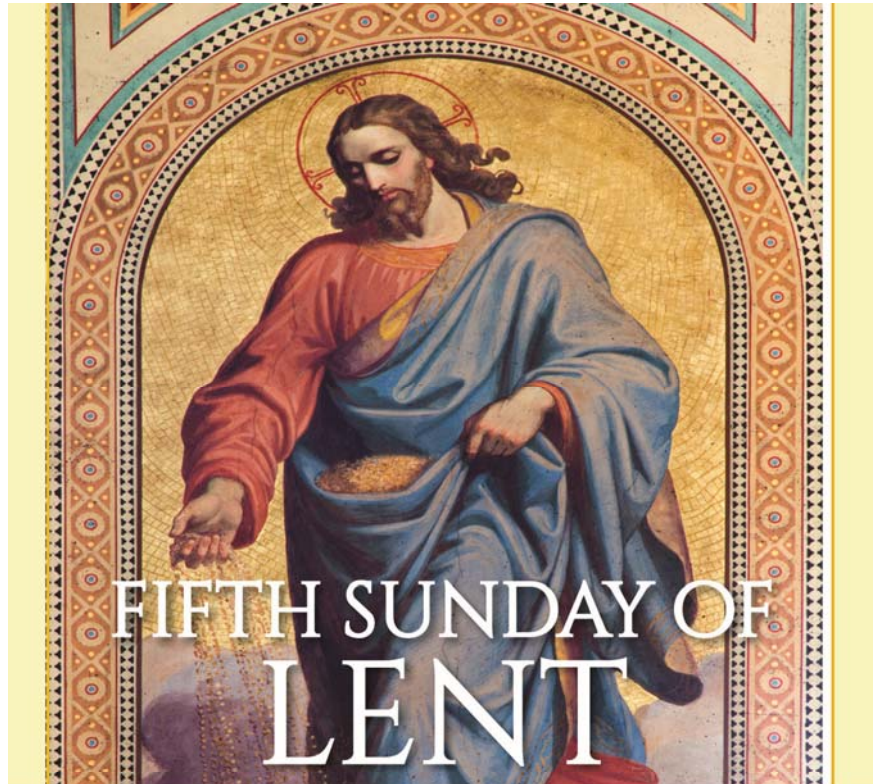

Passion (Palm) Sunday March 25, 2018

On Passion Sunday we begin Holy Week with the celebration of the Lord Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Before the 9 am, 11 am, and 6 pm Masses, we gather outside church for the "Blessing of the Palms".

Due to the freezes this winter, sago palms will be scarce. As in the past, we are encouraging parishioners to bring their own palms from home—they can be strips of palmetto leaves, sago fronds, or similar greens. Knowing that some may not have access to palms, we invite all parishioners with sago palms or palmetto leaves to bring as many extras as possible. We will have more palmetto leaves available this year. Please remember to trim a space near the base of the branch for easy holding. Please bring any extra palmetto leaves and sago fronds to the pavilion on **Thursday, March 22, Friday, March 23 or early Saturday, March 24**. Please be sure to make every effort to attend these special liturgies as we begin this most Holy Week of the Church year.

The Divine Mercy Novena begins here at ICC on Good Friday, March 30, 2018 at 5 p.m. in the Adoration Chapel. Everyone is invited and encouraged to attend. We will continue the novena every evening leading up to the **Feast of Divine Mercy on Sunday, April 8**.



A Special Promise of Mercy: Our Lord's promise to grant complete forgiveness of sins and punishment on the Feast of Mercy is recorded three times in the Diary of Saint Faustina, each time in a slightly different way: *I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy (1109); Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (300); The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion will obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (699).*

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: A Lenten Journey

This Sunday's Gospel Jesus speaks of the grain that dies and produces much, good fruit. We are reminded in the Lenten Season that our lives involve dying to self and producing good fruit. During our Lenten renewal, are we willing to be like garden seeds and risk being split apart so that we can renew ourselves and grow into a life rich with abundance to share with others? Are we willing to dedicate ourselves to growing our faith and our relationship with Christ so that we may become the Christians God wants us to be? Equally as important, are we willing to let the world's greatest gardener nurture us, not by sun and water, but by His never-ending love and His promise to us each and every day? If so, then through our death and rebirth we, too, can produce much fruit, fruit that we can share with others through our service to them.

As we journey through Lent much has been said about prayer, fasting, forgiveness, but one of the "pillars" of a good Lent is almsgiving. Almsgiving can be done in many ways, and it is really good when almsgiving extends beyond the 40 days of Lent into our ordinary lives. You might say Lent is a good time to develop the habits that will become more and more a part of our everyday lives. We have some good works of mercy that have occurred in the recent weeks and months. Some of the recent acts of almsgiving are listed below.

We have for some time now been collecting flip tops for St. Jude's Children's Hospital.



Last week we were so pleased when **Jim LeBoeuf** showed up with two jars of flip tops which the crew at the Walker Walmart collected over the past year. The same week Jim came by the parish office with the jars, I had brought Communion to **Elaine Maher** who gave me a zip lock bag of flip tops which she had collected from the Council on Aging which she attends. **The Early Learning Center last year raised over \$10,300 for St. Jude with the Early Learning Center's Trike-A-Thon which will be held Friday, March 23.** More

information has gone out to our parents and will be found in the bulletin. You are invited to come watch. We have two sons of E.L.C. teachers and other youth in our parish receiving treatment at St. Jude. It is wonderful to be a part

of something so good in any way we can.

We received word that the Baby Bottle Campaign held in January for Women's New Life Center



collected \$4,963.32. You can imagine how many women will receive help from this Center, and how many infants will receive a good beginning of life.

The flip tops for St. Jude, the Trik-A-Thon for St. Jude, and Baby Bottles for the Women's New Life Center are all forms of almsgiving which happily are not reserved for Lent. We thank you all for the help you extend to so many in our community and beyond.

Flip tops, baby bottles, Trik-A-Thon, St. Vincent de Paul, CommUnity Hands, Mighty Moms – These are all present throughout the year to give us the opportunity to die to self and

be life giving to others, not only in Lent but all our days.

I would like to call your attention to something that happened a couple of weeks ago and has continued to happen. Either my phone or computer was hacked and some people in my address book have been contacted by someone in another country who is using my name and asking for donations for some cause or person I am working with. It has changed with the persons receiving the call, but please know, I will never be emailing you asking for donations. If you receive such an email, please disregard it. Thanks for your kind response to me. Several have checked with me and when I told them what happened they closed the conversation by saying, "Please know that if you ever need something you can call." This is unfortunate to have happened, but it shows how we are tied in with the message of this Sunday's Scripture.

While I didn't have room this week for a photograph, I just want to express my appreciation to the R.C.I.A. ministry for last Friday's supper. It was a wonderful evening with good fellowship and fantastic food, but what I thought was really fantastic was how the Elect and Candidates for Full Communion were serving along with the R.C.I.A. Team. If you didn't know them, you would not know who was who. And if you really want to hear something – We had an inquirer who wishes to come this Fall to begin Inquiry Sessions serving with them. That's what it's all about, not simply a head trip, but also a journey of the heart. It was great. Love,

What is the procedure for appointing Bishop Muench's replacement? (continued)

If the nuncio doesn't already have a file on a candidate, he sends a standard questionnaire to the man's bishop or religious superior, some of his priestly colleagues in ministry, friends and coworkers; laity may also get this questionnaire.

Eventually, the nuncio narrows his list of names to three, ranked according to his recommendation, along with his reasons. He then forwards this secret list, called a *temus*, to the Congregation for Bishops in Rome.

The Congregation then discusses the appointment. The Congregation may follow the recommendations of the nuncio, add, delete, change, or re-rank candidates, or even ask the nuncio for more names. Eventually the members of the Congregation vote and agree on their own *temus* of three names ranked in order of their preference.

The head of the Congregation presents its recommendations to the Pope. The Pope typically chooses from the list, but is free to name anyone else or send the matter back to the Congregation or to the nuncio for a new round of recommendations. After the Pope makes his decision, the nuncio is notified; he in turn contacts the candidate. If the candidate accepts, his bishop or religious superior and the archbishop of the province are notified. The nuncio coordinates with the Holy See and the candidate (and the outgoing bishop) concerning the date of the announcement and the date of the ordination/installation.

In the past year or so, the process from vacancy to the announcement of a new bishop has taken as little as three months (e.g., Evansville) and as many as eighteen months (e.g., Tucson). —*Deacon George Hooper; ghooper@icc-msh.org*
