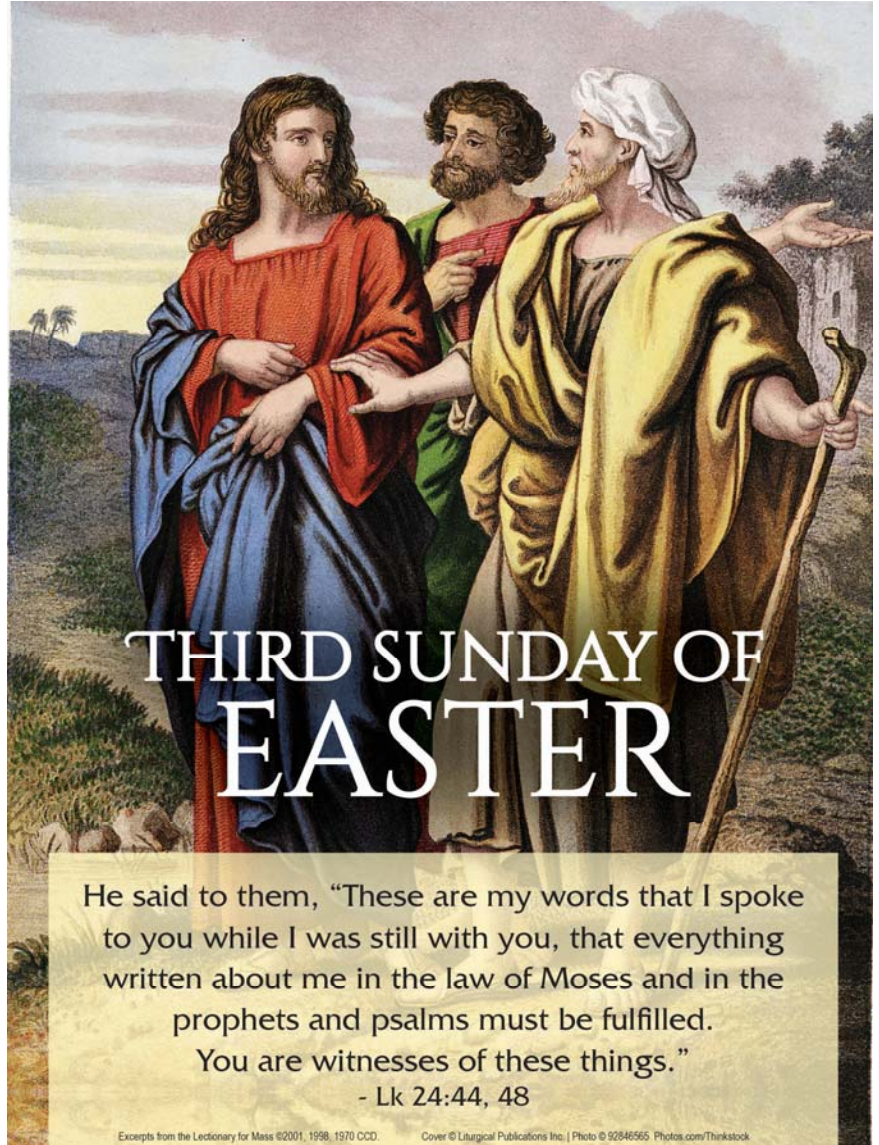

## Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Easter

As we continue through this Easter Season on this Third Sunday of Easter, Jesus, the Risen Lord, joins his disciples and shares a bit of baked fish. The Gospel for today has a simple liturgical flavor to it. The famous two disciples who had been traumatized by the death of Jesus were returning to the safety of Emmaus. They are pictured as relating the experience of being spun around by their meeting with Jesus, who had broken bread with them. Their hearts were on fire during this intimate liturgy and so back they come to relate their experience. As they were speaking, Jesus arrives and convinces them that He is really present to them in His humanity and divinity. Jesus then does the historical review, proving from the Holy Writings that He would have to suffer. Then, as results with any good homily, the minds of the little congregation were opened with understanding.

This is all very intimate and comforting of course. But intimacy has consequences, and Jesus ends the discussion with a dismissal. "Leave here and go preach repentance and the forgivingness of God, beginning right here, right outside that door." It was Jesus's own dismissal rite for his disciples, pretty much as he dismisses us at the end of the Eucharist. We have gathered to give thanks, and to then be sent as "Easter People."

A few weeks ago, I mentioned in the bulletin how Fr. Ron Walker, O.M.I., pastor here at Immaculate Conception from 1978-1982 had been called to his reward. I received a nice note from the Provincial Office with his funeral card. On it was a beautiful quote from St. Eugene de Mazenod, founder of the Oblates. He had written this on 22 July 1828. I don't know what the occasion might have been, perhaps the funeral of another Oblate, but it goes like this: *"There is already an ample community of Oblates in heaven. You might say that they are living in our mother-house, our headquarters. They are still our brothers and we are theirs. The love they have for us will draw us someday to share with them the place of our repose."* I thought this was too beautiful not to share with you.

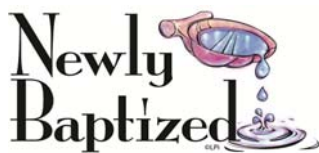

Stump the Deacon!

Sometimes at Mass we say the Apostle’s Creed which includes the words “He [Christ] descended into hell.” What does that mean?

Christ Descended into Hell is addressed in the Catechism of the Catholic Church in paragraphs 632-637.

The expression “He descended into hell” confesses that Jesus really did die, just like all men and He joined them in the land of the dead (hell) as their Saviour proclaiming the good news to those imprisoned there. In the Old Testament, “hell” refers to “the place of the dead” where all souls, good or evil, were deprived from being in the presence of God and were awaiting the Redeemer. The sin of Adam and Eve had closed the gates of heaven. Jesus descended into hell, not to deliver the damned from their punishment, but to free the just, the holy ones, and open up the gates of heaven for them.

An Ancient Homily of the early Church for Holy Saturday captured this event: “The whole earth keeps silence because the King is asleep. The earth trembled and is still because God has fallen asleep in the flesh and He has raised up all who have slept ever since the world began...He has gone to search for our first parent, as for a lost sheep. Greatly desiring to visit those who live in darkness and in the shadow of death, He has gone to free from sorrow the captives of Adam and Eve, He who is both God and the Son of Eve...’I am your God, who for your sake have become your Son...I order you, O sleeper, to awake. I did not create you to be held a prisoner in hell. Rise from the dead, for I am the life of the dead.” The souls of the damned, however, remained in the place of damnation.
