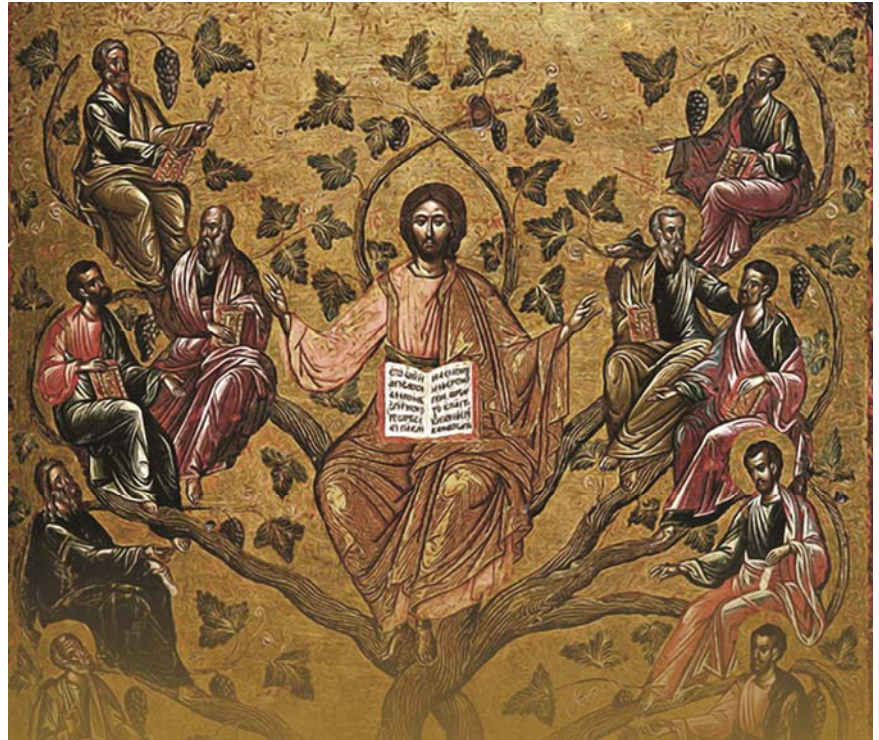

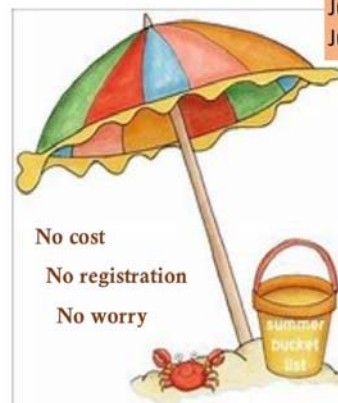

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Easter Unity

As we continue through the Easter Season, on this Fifth Sunday of Easter Jesus reminds us with the beautiful image of the vine how we are attached to Him and He with us for two reasons, first to have life ourselves, and secondly to bear fruit, be life-giving to others.

First we are connected to Him, like branches that are lifeless and useless unless they are connected to the vine. Sometimes we may feel that we are on our own and it may seem that He is so distant, but the Lord reminds us that we are connected, regardless of how we may occasionally feel. Secondly, we are called to bear good fruit. We are not connected simply to enjoy the benefits of salvation for ourselves. The grace of God comes to each of us on its way through us to others. Our purpose on the vine is not just to be like waving leaves, but to bear good fruit, to help feed the world with the good news for which they hunger. A branch that doesn't bear fruit is destined for pruning. We shouldn't take that occasional pruning as a sign that God no longer loves us, but rather preparation for an even better response to His love, even better fruit.

It is good for the vine to come together and celebrate its attachment and unity, and Pentecost, the Birthday of the Church, is a great day to do this. We invite you to make

This weekend, I will be celebrating Easter Unity not only in prayer with you, but in prayer with family ancestors as I land Sunday morning in Paris for vacation days and take the train to Divers-sur-Mer in Normandy where my ancestors lived before leaving with William the Conqueror for England. I hope to celebrate the Eucharist Sunday Evening at the Cathedral Church of Notre Dame in Divers-sur-Mer as they did that fateful day in September of 1066, when they sailed from Normandy, France, for the coast of England. On Wednesday, May 2, I will head for England also, not by boat, but by train. There is a fast speed train which leaves Lille, France, and travels under the English Channel, arriving in London in two hours. On Thursday, May 3, I hope to take a train from London and spend the day in Canterbury. One of my Norman ancestors had a brother, **Hubert Walter, who was Archbishop of Canterbury from 1193-1205**, only twenty-three years after St. Thomas



Becket's martyrdom. In fact, I read that he is buried, photo above, next to St. Thomas Becket, as he was considered to have done a lot for the Church and people of England. I hope to update you on how things went next weekend.

This Sunday after the 9:00 Eucharist, the neophytes who were received into the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil will receive their certificates of completion. It is a real joy celebrating the Eucharist and serving with them, and we wish them God's every blessing in the years to come. Evidently, they must be doing a good job sharing how they feel about journeying with us. We already have 18 people inquiring about being on the R.C.I.A. journey next year when we begin in August. We thank Tammy Jackson and our R.C.I.A. Team for their ministries with us and in our name.

As we continue through this Easter Season may we continue to grow as Easter People, witnesses to the Lord's Resurrection. Let us pray for one another. Love,

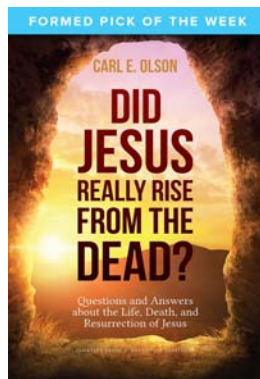

First of all, they cannot be baptized. All sacraments, including baptism, are for the living. If, however, death is doubtful in any way, baptism could be administered in case the person is still alive.

So, what happens to an unborn child or one who dies after birth without being baptized? Does he go to heaven, hell, or purgatory? God has told us much about His plan for salvation, but there is also much He has not told us. We do know; however, that God offers the grace of salvation to everyone who does not place a deliberate obstacle to that grace. Obviously, that includes children who die too young to have consciously chosen any obstacle to God’s love. St. Augustine uses this principle to support his teaching that God gives the grace of baptism, and therefore salvation, to such children.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* approaches the same idea from another direction when it states, “Baptism is necessary for salvation for those to whom the Gospel has been proclaimed and who have the possibility of asking for this sacrament.” Unborn children and young children have not had that possibility of seeking baptism. The Catechism further states, “God has bound salvation to the sacrament of Baptism, but he Himself is not bound by His sacraments.”
