## Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Easter People

**As we gather this Sixth Sunday of Easter**, the Lord calls us to remain in his love. What gives us joy? Family, friends, the beauties of nature, good health, freedom from worry? The deepest source of joy for Jesus was his loving relationship with the Father. Jesus tells us in today's Gospel that wherever he might go, whatever he might do, he remains in his Father's embrace. In today's Gospel he tells us those beautiful words, "remain in my love." He tells us "I have told you this that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete." He tells us to love one another as he has loved us. It's not a warm, fuzzy love, a romantic love, but HIS LOVE—UNCONDITIONAL LOVE. This is the love that exists between the Father and Son for all eternity, which he has shared with us. We hear the same message from John today in our second reading.

Saying that love is the basis of Christian joy does not mean that love is easy. Loving others is difficult at times because of the sacrifice it may demand of us. And yet it is precisely these demands that give love its joy, for the more we give of ourselves to love as the Father does, the more room we make in ourselves for God who is nothing but love. To love others is to completely will the good of the other, to desire their own growth in love and virtue, making us true people of joy.

I have been in the United Kingdom the past few days and there is something interesting here in the news. About two or three months ago the Prime Minister for Great Britain announced the formation of a new cabinet level appointment – Minister for Loneliness. This new appointment is a response to a study within the United Kingdom revealing that over 9 million elderly people in the country go for months without any meaningful conversations with family or friends. Half of those in the country over 75 years old live alone. The Prime Minister said, *"For far too many people, loneliness is the sad reality of modern life. I want to confront this challenge for our society and for all of us to take action to address the loneliness endured by the elderly, by careers, by those who have lost loved ones – people who have no one to talk to or share their thoughts and experiences."* I visited someone in assisted living before leaving for vacation and had coffee with her. I was so impressed with the care givers in the home. They knew and addressed each of the residents by name as they checked on them, asked if they wanted coffee, etc. They even seemed to know how they liked their coffee fixed. I was so impressed with them. Driving home, I couldn't help but think of our own ministries to those in assisted living homes in our parish. They go and get them from their rooms for Eucharist, calling them by name. They know if they wish a whole host or a portion of a host, if they need water to help swallow. The weeks Fr. Raj and I don't come for

Eucharist, they still come and gather them together for Rosary and Communion. It's a wonderful ministry and it is great to see our parishioners taking charge of it in such a good and graced way. Then there are those who bring Communion to the Sick and Homebound each week. They are so faithful and attentive to those they visit. Perhaps the Prime Minister could interview our parishioners in these ministries. 😊

**Next weekend we will be happy to welcome Fr. Aloysius Nzekwe, of the Mission Society of St. Paul, to the Parish to present to us our annual Mission Appeal.**

Our church is missionary by nature. Each of us, as baptized Catholics, are called to share in the work of evangelization. The diocese of Baton Rouge collaborates with mission groups every year to raise funds for their missions through a program called the Missionary Cooperative Plan. **Fr. Aloysius** from the Missionary Society of St Paul will be speaking to us, and **there will be a second collection to support them in their work.** The **Missionary Society of St. Paul (MSP)** is a congregation of priests founded in Nigeria in 1977. The Society now has 260 priests. They are working in ten countries of Africa, (South Africa, Malawi, Botswana, Cameroon, Liberia, Chad, The Gambia, Nigeria, Kenya and Southern Sudan), Grenada in the West Indies, the United States, England, Sweden, and Ireland. They also have about 127 seminarians in their seminary in Nigeria. Their mission in Malawi provides rehabilitation and support for over 300 orphans who lost their parents due to AIDS. They need our financial assistance to continue this mission. They also need funds to: 1) provide fresh water wells and education in rural communities of Chad, Malawi, South Sudan, Kenya, and Nigeria; 2) sponsor seminarians, our future priests; 3) support priests in the founding/building of new churches. Your support to this worthy cause will be an immense encouragement to the Missionary Society of St. Paul as they continue to take the good news to those desperately in need of it.

**This Sunday I will be joining you in prayer around the Table of the Lord in Wales.**

Some of my Norman ancestors (FitzGerald) settled in Wales and actually built castles there. On Wednesday, I hope to take a boat from Pembroke, Wales to Wexford, Ireland. It was in May 1, 1169, that several of my Norman FitzGerald ancestors sailed to Ireland. The Irish call it the Norman Invasion of Ireland, but in little time, they became identified with the native Irish and settled there. I will be settling in Ireland also for the rest of my vacation days. Next Sunday we will celebrate the Ascension of the Lord here in the United States, but here in Wales, it will be celebrated Thursday as we used to do. Love,

Why should I go to Confession if I have not committed any mortal sin?

Confession is not only for those who seek forgiveness of a mortal sin. There are many spiritual effects of Confession:

- Reconciliation with God—Sin is an offense against God; it weakens our connection with Him. Confession restores or strengthens our intimate relationship with God.
- Reconciliation with the Church—Sin damages our relationship with others; the Church suffers from the sin of one of her members. Confession repairs that relationship with others.
- Decrease of time in Purgatory—Before we gain heaven, our souls must be purified of all attachments to sin. Our souls may be purified either here on earth or in Purgatory. The penance assigned by the priest during Confession can reduce our time in Purgatory.
- Peace and serenity of conscience and spiritual consolation—Confession can bring about a true “spiritual reconciliation” that can remove doubts and anxiety and help us feel connected to God.
- Helps us lead a better life—By examining our conscience before Confession and with the help of the priest, we can pinpoint weak and sinful tendencies and ways to combat these tendencies.

Additionally, one of the precepts of the Catholic Church is to confess our sins at least once a year. This helps prepare us for the Sacrament of the Eucharist.
