Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Service

In today's Gospel Jesus reminds us that whoever does the Father's will is his brother, sister and mother. In another passage of the Gospels, Jesus was asked what was the work he did, and he responded, "the will of my Father." He defined himself as one who sought to do the will of his father. One form of service to the Father's will that has been a real blessing since it first began in the early church is the ministry of deacon.

DIACONAL MINISTRY was a blessing to the early Church when it first began, and it has been a blessing in our parish for many years. This summer we have welcomed two who are and will be involved in diaconal ministry among us for the coming months

DEACON JOHN VU was ordained to the diaconate May 26 at St. Joseph Cathedral and was photographed with his parents prior to his ordination. John began moving into the parish on the 28th, and then on Monday, June 4th officially began his approximately five months of ministry with us. The plan is to have John enter into almost every kind of ministry possible, from attending Finance Council meetings, going with us on sick calls, preaching, Baptisms, working with children (Vacation Bible School, ELC Summer Camp, Youth Ministry), in short, doing whatever he can and accompany us in doing what he cannot do alone. The Staff will be an official part of his internship with us, and will be asked to speak with him, evaluate him in different ways. He will also have a lay support group made up of parishioners. When he leaves us in October to return to Notre Dame, we all will have been a part of his internship, and hopefully part of many years of graded priestly ministry after he is ordained a priest next year.

ordained deacon –yet! He has had three years of tough academic formation at the Franciscan Missionaries of Our Lady University, and the plan is that this summer for two months, he will be with us. Having completed phase one, the academics, this summer he will have phase two of his formation, applying what he learned in a teaching ministry. He is being asked to participate in at least one teaching ministry with 1. Children and Youth; 2. Adults, perhaps participating in one or more of our Adult Formation programs, maybe even being a guest speaker at a Men's Club or That Man Is You meeting; 3. A pastor's choice teaching ministry; and 4. Candidate's choice – After getting to know what is happening here a bit more, he could ask about doing something. Alec will be working, so he will not be here full time as will John. When Alec leaves us, he will have another year of academic formation with more emphasis on the practical and then next summer, have a real internship when he will do pastoral ministry and accompany clergy with ministry as Deacon John is doing now. Alec had a fantastic history of evangelization ministry before entering the permanent diaconate, going overseas as well as around the United States, with evangelization ministries. Just speaking of his story to others could be considered a real good teaching tool.

The R.C.I.A./R.C.I.C Team met late last month to evaluate the past year and plan for the coming



Pastoral Year. It was nice to see that in addition to some of our regulars, we had new team members coming from the ranks of those who had been received into the Church this Easter. We thank **Tammy Jackson** who led this ministry for the first time this year. **The next team meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, August 14 at 7:00 p.m. and the Inquiry Sessions will begin again on Thursday, August 16 at 7:00 p.m.** Presently 25 potential inquirers have inquired about beginning the journey in August. Parishioners are encouraged to spread the word and invite inquirers in the name of the parish and Church.

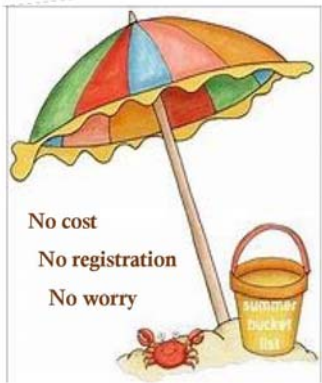

A Meditation Before the Blessed Sacrament

Have you no favors to ask of yourself? Write, if you like, a long list of all your needs of your soul—and come and read it to Me. Tell Me simply how self-indulgent you are, how proud, how touchy, how selfish, how cowardly, how idle; ask Me to help you to improve. Poor child! Do not blush! There are in heaven many saints who had the same faults as you; they prayed to Me, and, little by little, they were cured.

Prayerfully consider an hour with Jesus especially as a substitute adorer. We need substitutes for all hours and divisions!
