The recent 90° temperatures have let us know that summer is here! The soaring temperatures can lead to increased safety risks. Most people spend more time outside, travel more and just want to have fun! Here are a few tips to make summer the fun, relaxing time that it should be. There will be a series of articles with tips for children and adults.

- 1. Be Sun Savvy-**A person's sunlight exposure during childhood and adolescence is generally considered to increase the risk of melanoma.

 - Apply early and repeat-**Children six months or older (including adults) should use sun screen with 15 Sun Protection Factor (SPF) or higher. Apply 30 minutes before going out and reapply every two hours.
 - Cover-** Dress children in light -weight clothing that will be a barrier of ultraviolet rays. Don't forget hats.
 - Keep infants out of the sun-** Keep babies six months or younger out of direct sunlight. Dress them in cool, comfortable clothing and hats with brims.
 - Plan early morning play-**Avoid outdoor activities during peak sun hours (10 am-4pm).
 - Beware of shade-**Many people think sitting in the shade is a simple sun compromise. It is cooler in the shade but you can still get sunburned in the shade.
- 2. Splash Safety (and Other Water Rules)-**Drowning is quick and quiet. It is the leading cause of unintentional injury or deaths in kids one to four years old.

 - Stay off cell phones-**Don't allow yourself to get distracted when your kids are in the water. And, yes, chatting with other parents is a common distraction as well.
 - Know your skills-**Refreshing your knowledge of Infant/Child CPR is always good at this time of the year. Kids should never swim alone, and having adults or caregivers know water safety skills is smart.
 - Put a guard up-**Kiddie pools in backyards should be drained after use. For houses with swimming pools, a four foot fence should surround the pool on all sides. Pool supply companies offer many options for safety. Also teach your child never to go near the pool without an adult.

Stump the Deacon!

Hurricane season started June 1st. Some of our prayers asking to be spared from hurricanes are addressed to **Our Lady of Prompt Succor** [Our Lady of Quick Help]. Why? (Part 2)

In 1727, French Ursuline nuns founded a monastery in New Orleans and began to organize schools in the area. In 1803, short on teachers, Sister André Madier requested more sisters from France. She wrote her cousin, Sister Michel Gensoul, who was running a Catholic boarding school for girls. The matter was referred to Bishop Fournier of Montpelier, France. Because of the repressions of the French Revolution, he was short-handed, so he declined to send any sisters. Sister Michel was given permission to appeal to the pope. At this time, Pope Pius XII was a prisoner of Napoleon, and it seemed unlikely he would even receive her letter of petition. Sister Michel prayed:

O Most Holy Virgin Mary, if you obtain for me a prompt and favorable answer to this letter, I promise to have you honored at New Orleans under the title of Our Lady of Prompt Succor.

She sent her letter on March 19, 1809. Against all odds, she received a response on April 29, 1809. The pope granted her request, and Sister Michel commissioned a statue of *Our Lady of Prompt Succor* holding the Infant Jesus. Sister Michel and several postulants came to New Orleans on December 31, 1810. They brought the statue with them, and placed it in the convent chapel in the View Carré. Since then, Our Lady of Prompt Succor has interceded for those who have sought her help.

Next installment: How Our Lady of Prompt Succor saved New Orleans, not just once, but twice.
