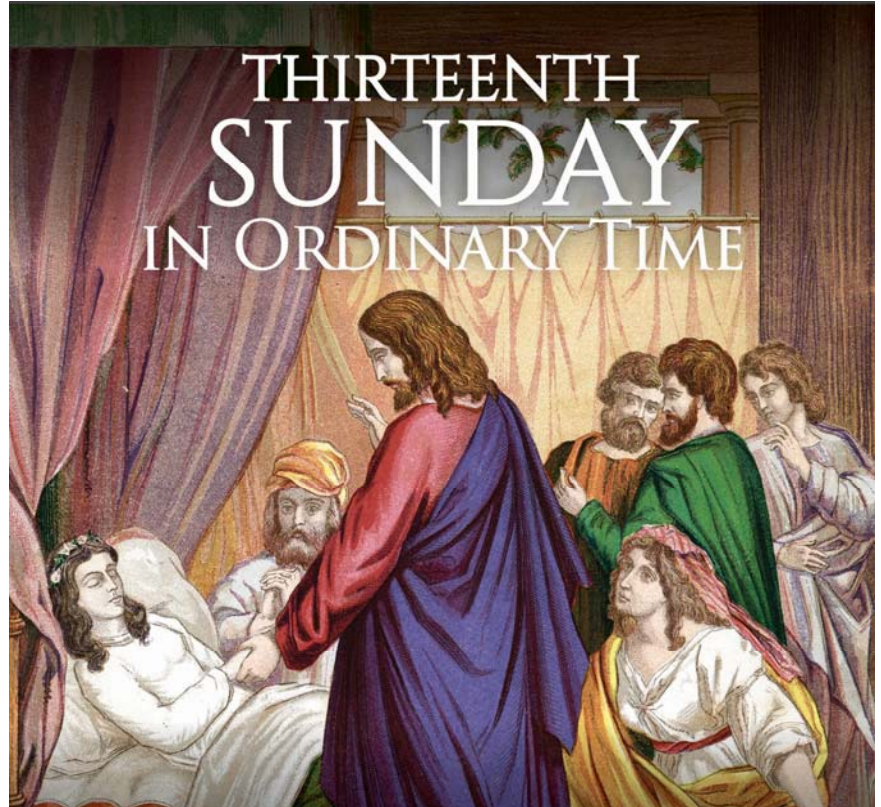

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time In Summer

As we gather this Sunday for Eucharist, this Thirteenth Week of Ordinary Time, we also celebrate with our country an extended Fourth of July Weekend. It is a good time to relax a bit and give thanks for our many blessings, those the Lord alone could share with us, and those others have helped us receive.

It is about midway in the summer vacation time, and plans are being made in the parish for the coming Pastoral Year:

The Parish School of Religion is happy to announce that 72% of our youth have completed their registration for the coming school year. This is a good number, and we hope that as we move through the weeks of summer, we can move closer to 100%. Plans are being made for a really good school year. Grades 1-6 will meet as they have met over the years. They seem to like the present structure and respond to it well. Grades 7 and 8 will meet with the Edge program for religious ed that involves both teaching and activities. Grade 9 will use the Life Teen program which has had great success at Our Lady of Mercy, St. Aloysius, and other parishes around the Diocese. We feel that both of these are well structured programs that will engage the junior high and ninth grade youth more. RCIA Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults/Children

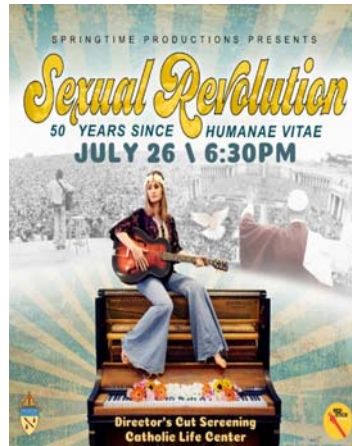
Each week during the next few months, we will be sharing the R.C.I.A. experience and stories of our new Catholics who joined the Church this Easter as well as comments from their sponsors.

When I came into RCIA, I was looking for guidance to grow in my faith. My mother had recently had a TIA (a mini-stroke), and the residual effects were hard for me to deal with on my own. I knew I was lost, and I felt led by the Holy Spirit that it was time to come home to the Church. What I found was a group of very caring people that would guide me on my journey. I didn't realize what a deep emotional journey I would be on. I found things I had been suppressing and was finally able to let them go. Not only have I been able to understand God's teachings more, I've been able to hear God speak to me, and I've been able to better articulate my needs to Him. I have found deep joy and true happiness. Also, by the end of all the classes, I was starting to look at the lessons in a greater picture beyond what this means to me and instead, what it means to everyone.

Fifty years ago, at the height of the sexual revolution, Pope Paul VI issued his prophetic encyclical, *Humanae Vitae*, alerting the Church and society to the dangers of this revolution and especially the potentially harmful consequences of contraceptives.

Now, a beautiful film entitled, *Sexual Revolution: 50 Years Since Humanae Vitae*, seeks to examine the effects of the free-love experiment of the hippie generation as well as the sacred view of life-giving sexuality outlined in *Humanae Vitae*. This beautiful documentary closely examines the history of the parallel developments of the Pill and modern Natural Family Planning (NFP) by telling the little known story of the founding doctors—Dr. Gregory Goodwin Pincus and Drs. John & Evelyn Billings—who were once colleagues but eventually chose completely divergent paths.

The film's co-director, Rickard Newman, will be present for a short presentation and Q & A after the film.
