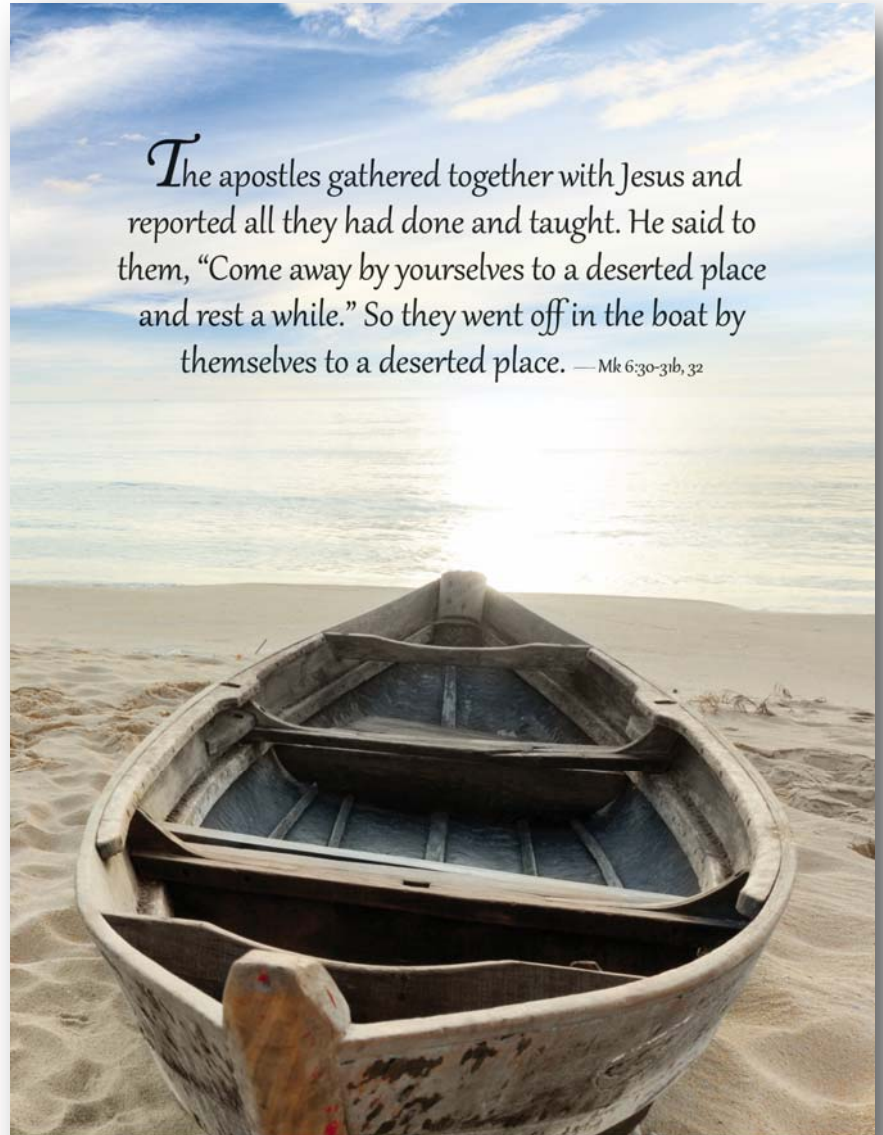

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Shepherds

As we celebrate this Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, our Scriptures relate to shepherds in one way or another.

I thought this was a nice coincidence, as several things I wanted to share with you this Sunday also relate to shepherds in one way or another.

I would like to share a word about a wonderful ministry that we will soon be resuming, Children's Church.

We would like to have additional shepherds to minister to the young members of the congregation on Sunday at the 11:00 Eucharist. If you have ever been at that Eucharist when we announce Children's Church and the leader(s) step into the main aisle, it's a fantastic sight to see the children running toward the main aisle from pews in the church, even the cry room. Then the leader begins to walk out with all the "little sheep" following him or her. It doesn't last that long as the children leave after the Opening Prayer and before the First Reading and then return during the Preparation of Gifts. We provide materials, worksheets which explain the Gospel. The sheets are either games, color pages, or both, depending upon what the service provides us. The leader, on arriving, would have the children find their places, then proclaim a reading from the day's Scripture, and then guide the children with the worksheets. Around the time the collection is being taken, someone goes to get the children, so they can be back with us for the Eucharistic Prayer and the rest of the Liturgy. We presently have several dedicated parishioners who have been working with children's church for several years, and a new couple who will begin this September. If we had more persons wishing to give it a try, they would end up leading Children's Church perhaps once every five or six weeks, and possibly extend it a bit more into the summer. We presently end the Sunday before the Memorial Day weekend and begin the Sunday after the Labor Day weekend. Anyone interested in giving it a try can contact Sherry Leger or me in the parish office (665-5359) and we can work you into the schedule with someone else for a week or two and then if you feel ready, you can lead it yourself.

We would like to have some persons offer their services to shepherd the really young, primarily the infants and children up to age five in our nursery.

We are looking for several people, age 21 and over, who would commit to being scheduled on a rotating basis. We would also like to have a director in charge of scheduling. This would be a paid position and we would like to offer the services of a nursery on Thursday evenings, roughly from 6:30 till 9:00 p.m. during R.C.I.A. and Sunday mornings during the 9:00 and 11:00 Eucharists. We think we would need the services of two adults over age 21 per session, one to remain with the children and one to travel in case a child needs to go to the restroom. They could be assisted either by high

school students who wish service hours, or it could also be a paid position. We are happy to work with those who apply for this position to have the best possible child care services for parents and their very young children. We had this service before the flood but never resumed it. We feel it is definitely time to begin again. Tammy Jackson would be the supervisor of the program. We would be happy to answer your questions about this position. A lot has been written, but it is too much to include here at this time, and some aspects can be tweaked and changed as we put this ministry into operation by mid-August.

We were happy to welcome Fr. Joseph Vu, brother of Deacon John Vu, to the 4:00 Anticipated Eucharist early this month.

Fr. Joe is pastor of the Cluster of parishes on Bayou Lafourche which includes St. Philomena, Labadieville, St. Ann, Napoleonville, and Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Plattenville. Deacon John continues to serve his Deacon Internship with us until he returns to the seminary in October. We look forward to Deacon John's ordination next year, and are happy to have Fr. Joseph visit us whenever his time and ministry permit. Both are and will continue to grow as good and faithful shepherds.



Finally I have been asked to shepherd a pilgrimage which will take place in June, 2019.

It will be a pilgrimage to France, June 12-22, that will include visits to Lourdes and the Grotto; Nevers, to the Shrine of St. Bernadette; Ars, to visit the parish church and tomb of St. Jean Vianney; Lisieux and the Basilica and tomb of St. Thérèse of Lisieux; the Normandy Cemetery; and Paris with the Basilica of Sacré Coeur, Notre Dame Cathedral, and other sites. **THERE WILL BE AN ORIENTATION/INFORMATION MEETING ON WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 8 AT 7:00 P.M. Each week we continue to share with you the R.C.I.A. experiences and stories of our new Catholics who joined the Church this Easter.

I was baptized Catholic as an infant, primarily attended the Episcopal church during my youth and was married in a Methodist church. My attendance was irregular at best regardless of the church, and this was reflected in my knowledge about God and relationship with Him. My wife and I felt it would be important for our family to attend church on a regular basis, but we were undecided about the church we would attend. The decision to enroll my daughter in the Early Learning Center three years ago ultimately brought me to the Catholic Church. My wife and I were encouraged to begin attending Mass as a family by the daily stories of what she'd learned at school. After going to Mass for several months, my wife and I decided to enroll in RCIA to further inquire about Catholicism. I was concerned that I would be lost in the classes considering my weak Christian background. However, the RCIA staff, speakers, and sponsors are wonderful teachers, and their willingness to help cannot be overstated. I feel that in most cases, the more you learn about something, the more you realize you need to learn. That said, the most beneficial aspect of RCIA for me was the staff's ability to teach to all levels, thus providing the resources and tools to develop and grow a relationship with God.

I was baptized Catholic at around three months old. I started out in Our Lady of Mercy for kindergarten, but due to family circumstances, never began the children's religion classes. During my early adulthood, I didn't find it important to go to church or practice my faith. I went to a few different Christian denomination churches but never really stuck anywhere. I did find it important to get my children baptized at an early age however. When my third child was born in 2016, she contracted RSV (a respiratory illness) at a very young age and ended up in the hospital. I brought her to Our Lady of the Lake Hospital and took comfort at the statue of Mary asking her to intercede for my daughter to get better. From that point, she was my first child to get baptized in the Catholic Church. After that, I felt a call to get involved and become confirmed. The RCIA team was amazing from the start. If not for the support team and my sponsor, I would have never made it through. They were so thorough with every single lesson, and I feel like I went to Confirmation with a strong sense that this was the right thing for me.
