Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Blessings

In the Gospel today, Jesus multiplies the loaves and fish.



Every three years, as we move through the cycle of assigned Sunday readings, we proclaim the sixth chapter of John's Gospel which begins with the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fish and ends four weeks later with the beautiful teaching of Jesus on the Bread of Life. I look forward to these weeks as they begin with Jesus' miracle of the loaves and fish, continue with a beautiful teaching on the Bread of Life,

and end with Peter's response to the Lord, "Lord, to whom shall we go?" This year the Sunday Liturgies will be complimented by the opportunity to see and hear really good teachings on our phones and computers on the Eucharist, the Bread of Life, through the program **FORMED**, which is free and available to all in the parish. We will share more on this wonderful opportunity in the coming weeks.

Earlier this month, the Festival Committee continued to meet in preparation for the Fall Festival, October 19, 20 and 21. There was one difference, we have a new Festival Chairman, **Donald Drone** and Co-Chairs, **Ray and Donna Nichols**, who will be working together with the



committee. In long range planning, David Stringfellow will, in time, take over the role of chair from them. There will be an auction again this year and Gerald Charlet will handle it. Things are moving along well, and the next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, August 8th at 7:00 p.m.

Next month we will begin RCIA with the first Inquiry Session on Thursday, August 16 at 7:00 p.m. We are happy to have **45 persons** who have thus far either called or come by and signed up to attend. Realistically we realize that perhaps not all will show up and begin with us, but we also realize that some may simply walk in and introduce themselves. We thank Tammy Jackson and the R.C.I.A.

Team who have been preparing to begin this new ministry year with our Inquirers.

Our PSR is gearing up for another year, and as of this writing, 77% of our students have been registered which is always good to see. There have been some changes being planned out which we think will be really good for the junior high and 9th grade levels, and teachers have been preparing for the new programs. **Catechists will be needed for the coming school year and we encourage any who may wish to join our team to get in touch with the Religious Ed Office.** We are happy to announce that **Tory Landry**, a young parishioner who works at L.S.U. with Freshmen Orientation, has been hired to assist with the P.S.R. program this year.

This year we give thanks as we celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Restoration of the Permanent Diaconate by Blessed Pope Paul VI in 1968. We are blessed here in the parish to enjoy the ministry and services of three permanent deacons and over the summer to have had the services of Deacon Candidate Alec Campbell who hopes to be ordained in Spring of 2020. Back in 1968 when it was restored, I was being ordained a deacon, but I was not that aware of the ministry of permanent deacons. Over the years, we all have become more and more aware of the wonderful contribution permanent deacons make in our church communities and how blessed we are to have them. In the Acts of the Apostles, we read how blessed they felt to have them, and happily we can echo their gratitude



here in the parish. Last week our deacons were able to participate in a national meeting of 2,800 permanent deacons which was held in New Orleans. It was both a celebration of 50 years and a time of education and formation. We thank our deacons for their ministries.

As we move closer to the beginning of another ministry year, let us keep one another in prayer. Love,

Each week we continue to share with you the R.C.I.A. experiences and stories of our new Catholics who joined the Church this Easter.

Our daughter was learning about God at the Early Learning Center here. She would come home telling us Bible stories, singing songs, and saying prayers which encouraged us to begin reading Bible stories, praying as a family, and eventually attending Mass together.

It was wonderful from the beginning. My husband and I had both experienced some uncomfortable situations at certain churches throughout our lives, and we were unsure what would be a good fit for us. We knew from our first Mass that we had found what we were looking for in the Catholic Church. It was peaceful and holy, and we knew it was something we wanted our family to be a part of.

A few months later we met with Mrs. Tammy to discuss RCIA. At first the time commitment involved with this process seemed too much for us with two small children, so we were thinking one of us could go through and the other the next year. But, that didn't seem right. This is something we felt God was guiding us to do as a family, and we needed to approach it as one. It turned out to be a blessing. We got grandparents to babysit on Thursday evenings, and the classes quickly became something we looked forward to each week. The classes were amazing, and we were learning more than we ever expected. We were assigned wonderful and loving sponsors who made us feel comfortable every step of the way. They answered questions, provided guidance, and helped us navigate the process. God was leading the way!

I was to be baptized at the Easter Vigil, and I must admit I was nervous. But, the Holy Spirit was there to take over. When I was in that water and Father Frank was praying over me, I felt more at peace than I can ever remember feeling. As I stepped out and walked along the side of the church to change clothes I was smiling, laughing, and absolutely giddy. It was amazing! The entire experience of being confirmed and receiving First Eucharist was amazing and something I will never forget!

The next day I woke up feeling like a new person. I couldn't stop smiling and enjoyed every second of my day. I texted my lovely sponsor to share with her how I was feeling, and I don't think she was surprised. She simply told me that the Holy Spirit was working in my life.

Since that time we have all been attending Mass as a family. We are so grateful for this experience and all of the wonderful people who helped guide us through it. I believe this is the beginning of a blessed life as a Catholic family. God brought our daughter to this preschool to show our family where we belong, and in the fall our second daughter will begin there as well. God bless all of the wonderful people who have been with us through this process.

Growing up, we did not attend church regularly as a family. With the exception of the occasional Christmas or Easter service, I had little to no religious upbringing. The July/August 2018 issue of *Catholic Answers* magazine addressed the issue of the origin of the “sign of the cross”.

“The earliest reference to making a ‘sign of the cross’ comes from the Church Father Tertullian, who described around the year A.D. 211 how Christians make a small sign of the cross on their foreheads. He writes ‘In all our travels and movements, in all our coming in and going out, in putting on our shoes, at the bath, at the table, in lighting our candles, in lying down, in sitting down, whatever employment occupy us, we mark our foreheads with the sign of the cross.’ In the fourth century, the small forehead sign of the cross developed into the larger sign that involves the head, chest, and shoulders.”
