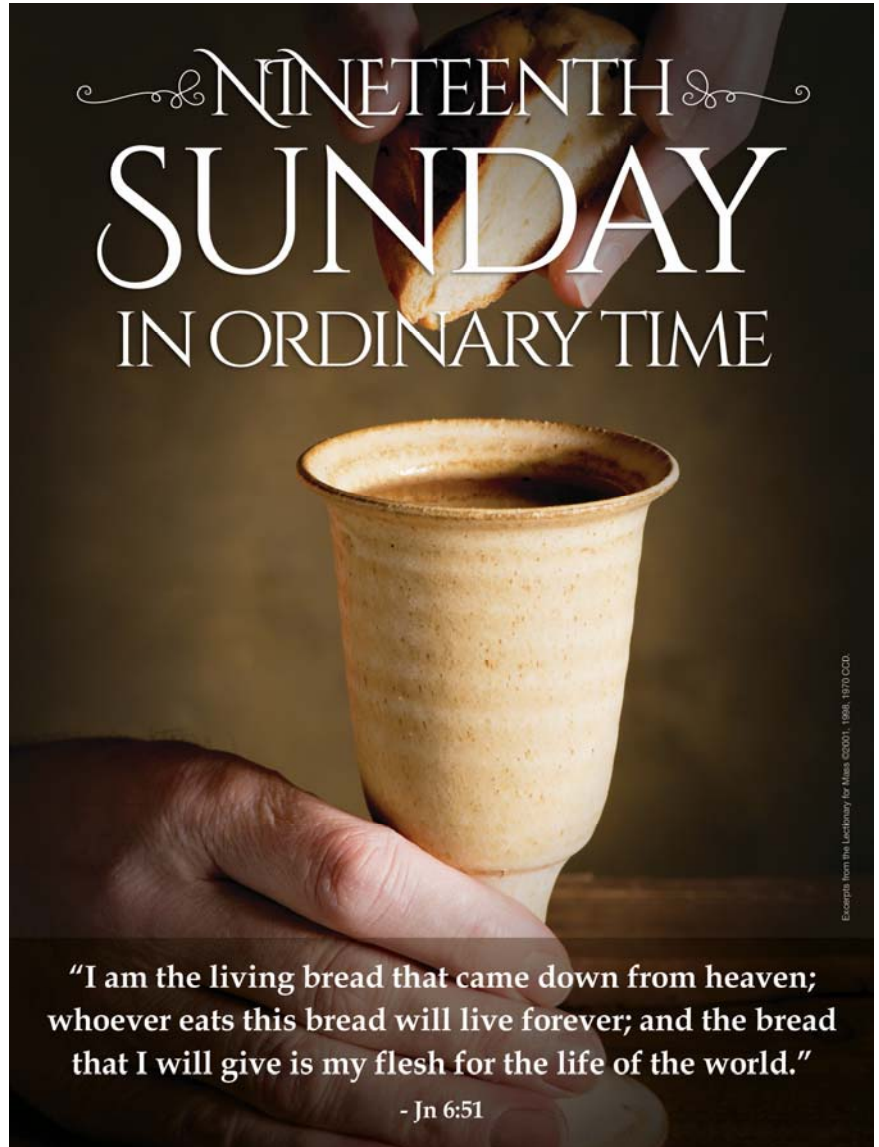

Parish Wide Invitation to The Bread of Life | August 12, 2018

Presence: The Mystery of the Eucharist is a powerful 3-part series about Christ's real presence in the Eucharist that invites us into an intimate union with God himself. It examines the effects of the sacrament, its setting in the Mass, and explores its scriptural foundation. This study is sure to move hearts and inspire families and friends to have meaningful discussions about God's active involvement in our lives.

Week One: August 12, 2018

God Is With US

In this first session we discover that God's plan from the beginning is to unite us to himself, pour his love into us, and receive our love.

Week Two: August 19, 2018

The Story of the Eucharist

In the second session we discover that the Eucharist is foreshadowed from the very beginning in the story of salvation history.

Week Three: August 26, 2018

Bread for the Journey

In the third session we discover that the nourishment for our journey to heaven is "bread that came down from heaven."

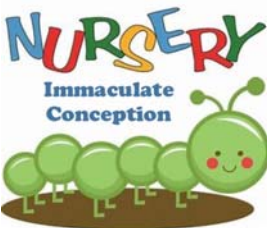

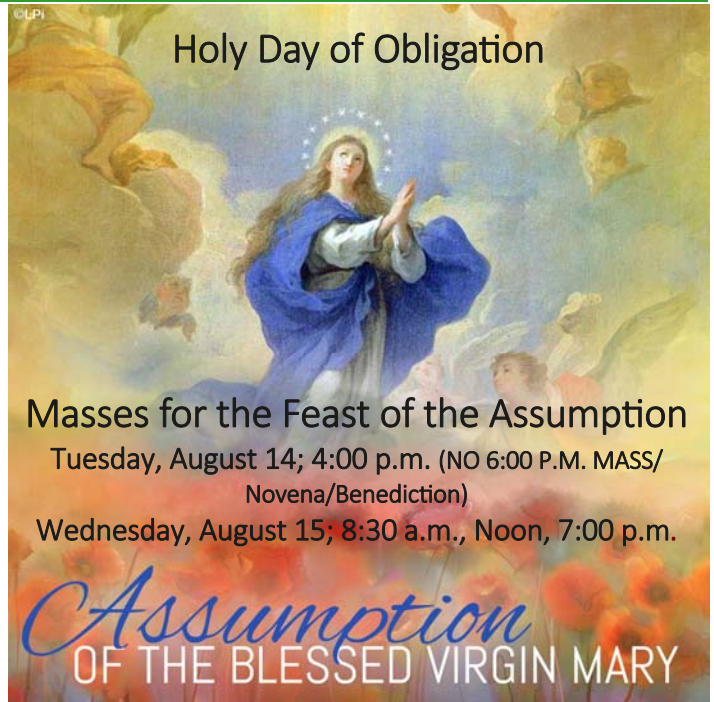

It is a Tradition of the Catholic Church that the ordination to the priesthood is reserved for men. This tradition goes all the way back to Jesus. Had Jesus wanted women priests, certainly He would have selected one, or several women, to be part of His twelve Apostles. Women formed a vital part in Jesus' followers, such as the women who stood with Him at the foot of His cross (His mother, Mary Magdelon and Mary of Clopas). Jesus had nothing against women; remember, Jesus gave Mary Magdelon the privilege of being the first witness to His resurrection. So there were available candidates, but Jesus elected not to select any women. The Church has imitated Christ in choosing only men to the priesthood.

The ordained priest acts in *persona Christi* ("in the person of Christ"). For someone to act "in the person of Christ" they must resemble Him; in other words, they must be a man.


In 1994, Pope John Paul, II professed "I declare that the Church has no authority whatsoever to confer priestly ordination on women and that this judgement is to be definitively held by all the Church's faithful (Ordinatio Sacrodotialis 4). On October 28, 1995, the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith issued its *Responsum ad dubium* ("Response to a Doubt") which declared that this teaching is an infallible teaching (a teaching without error) of the Church.



If you want to find out more information on this topic, google "Why the Church Doesn't Ordain Women". It is an excellent article on this topic.
