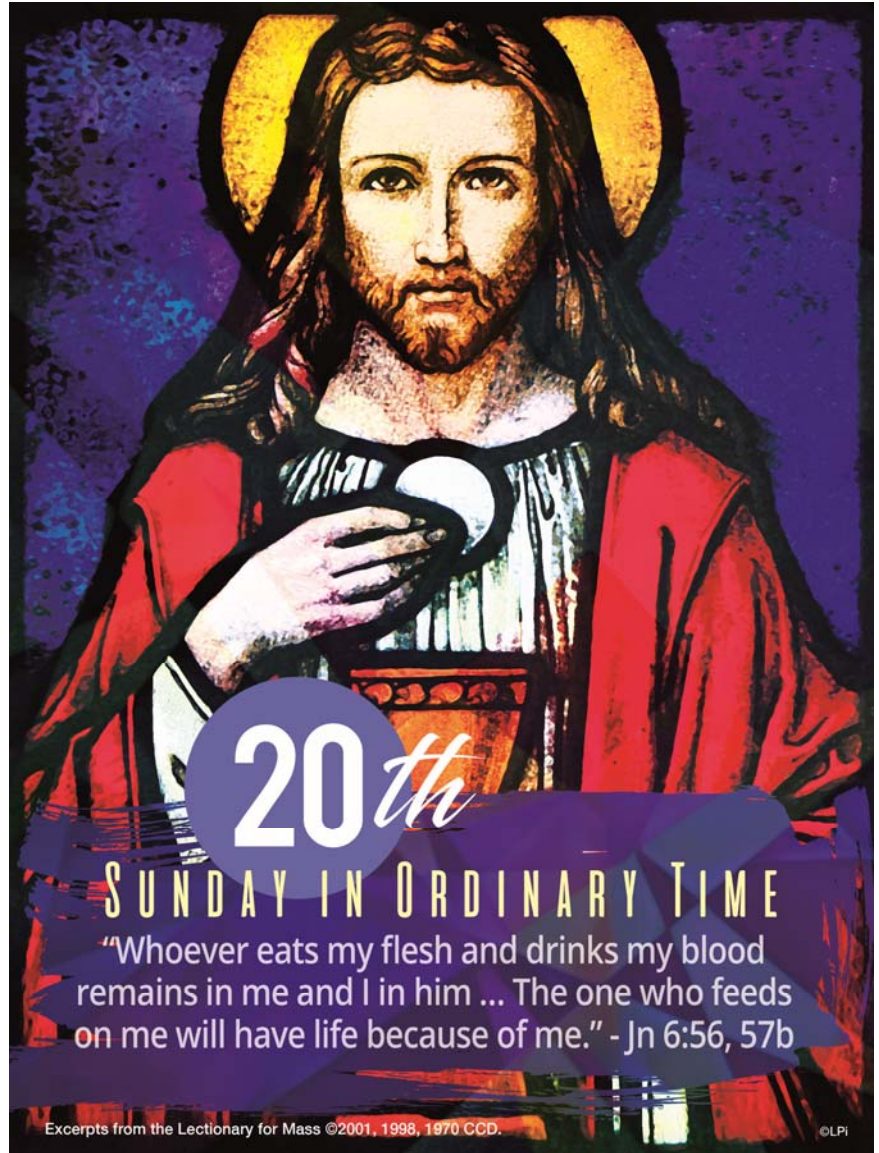

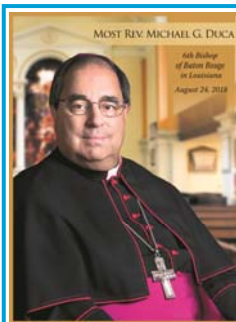

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Life Numbers

In the Gospel today Jesus repeats what we have been hearing these past Sundays and tells us, “the one who feeds on me will have life because of me...whoever eats this bread will live forever.” Last Wednesday as we celebrated the Feast of the Assumption, we officially began another ministry year. Some ministries began a bit earlier and a few will begin a bit later, but we call this our beginning.

Each year our parish, like all others, is required by the Diocese to submit an annual report that outlines not only parish finances but also statistics such as the number of Baptisms that were celebrated, how many people received the sacrament of Confirmation, the number who were welcomed through RCIA, how many weddings were celebrated, the number of funerals, and so on. It’s a lot of interesting and helpful information, and on one level it can look like so many numbers. But it is so much more than that! The annual parish report is about life and activity. It is a way of reflecting on our growth as a parish family. These numbers are about the life of our parish – your life and ours. When we look at these numbers, it can make us stop and wonder how we managed to get so much done. It can also make us wonder how and why things happen.

The Lord has been reminding us this Sunday and for the last few Sundays that he is here to nourish us, to be food for the journey. We can find in him the refreshment and help we need to keep going. God reminds us that he is with us each day, sending us forth with his strength, love and nourishment to continue our journey of faith.

On Saturday, August 4 we had our 80<sup>th</sup> Plus Birthday celebration put together by Stephanie Gaudin, our parish nurse, and the Outreach Commission. The parish hall was filled with celebrants and families who came to join



them. Our parishioner with the most years is Anais Odom at 100 years, but she was unable to attend. The parishioners attending with the most years were Sadie Marsh and Kathleen Snyder at 97. Al Szur just made it to 80 that weekend so he cut the cake inviting me to join him. It was

a great evening, and we thank Stephanie and all who assisted her.

**Bishop Duca’s Reception following his 2:00 Installation this Friday on August 24<sup>th</sup> is open to all.** Unfortunately

the Cathedral can only hold so many people, but at the Catholic Life Center, we have the large auditorium and Christ Court which can hold many more. I received a call last week from those who are preparing the reception to be sure and let you know if you cannot come to the Installation which is by invitation only due to lack of space, all are welcome at the reception which follows. So you can maybe watch it on television where it is being live streamed and then hop in the car and come to the reception at the Catholic Life Center. Given afternoon traffic going east, you would probably get to the Life Center from Livingston Parish before we could from the Cathedral. All are welcome!



**We will begin Children’s Church on Sunday September 9 at the 11:00 Eucharist.** We are happy to have a new couple who have offered to lead Children’s Church. They will assist some of our regulars for a few weeks before taking over classes themselves. **We will be happy to welcome any more parishioners (you don’t have to be couples) who might want to “put their feet into the waters” and test it out.** It is a beautiful and much appreciated ministry. Just let Sherry Leger or me know, and we will place you within the schedule, first as an apprentice, then as a “master.” 😊

**Just a reminder – FORMED** is a parish wide, free program which enables parishioners to view and receive a lot of information relative to our faith. It is a special blessing right now as we continue through the sixth chapter of John’s Bread of Life Gospel. *Presence* is the name of the parish-wide study which now is in its second week. As we thank the Lord for being the Bread of Life and nourishing us for the journey, we also thank him for calling us all together that we might support each other. Wishing you all good days as we move into another ministry year.

WHAT DO YOU THIRST FOR??



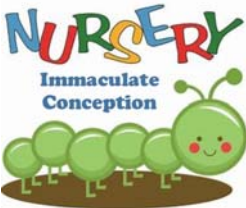
Do you know someone who is thirsting for what it means to be a Catholic Christian or someone who is seeking a closer relationship with Jesus?

Stump the Deacon!

Why do we change our positions so often during Mass, alternating between standing, sitting and kneeling?

Every posture that we take during Mass has a specific meaning, and it unifies us with others in the pews.

- **Standing** (seven times including the Entrance Procession, the Gospel, Distribution of Communion, Final Procession): This position indicates our active role in the Mass and honors the presence of Christ when we stand at the Gospel and the Distribution of Communion. It is a sign of reverence and prayer.
- **Sitting** (four times including the first part of the Liturgy of the Word, the Homily, the Presentation and Preparation of the Gifts): This is a posture of learning, a receptive mode when we should be open to hearing what God is telling us during the readings before the Gospel. When the gifts are being brought down the aisle, we should join ourselves with the bread and wine that will be offered up to the Father.
- **Kneeling** (three times including the Eucharistic Prayer, Invitation to Communion, Private Prayer or singing after Communion): This is a posture of worship and humility; we are in the presence of God. It reflects our reverence and devotion to Him.

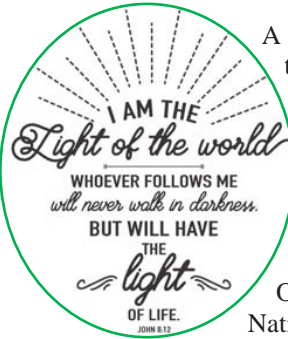
