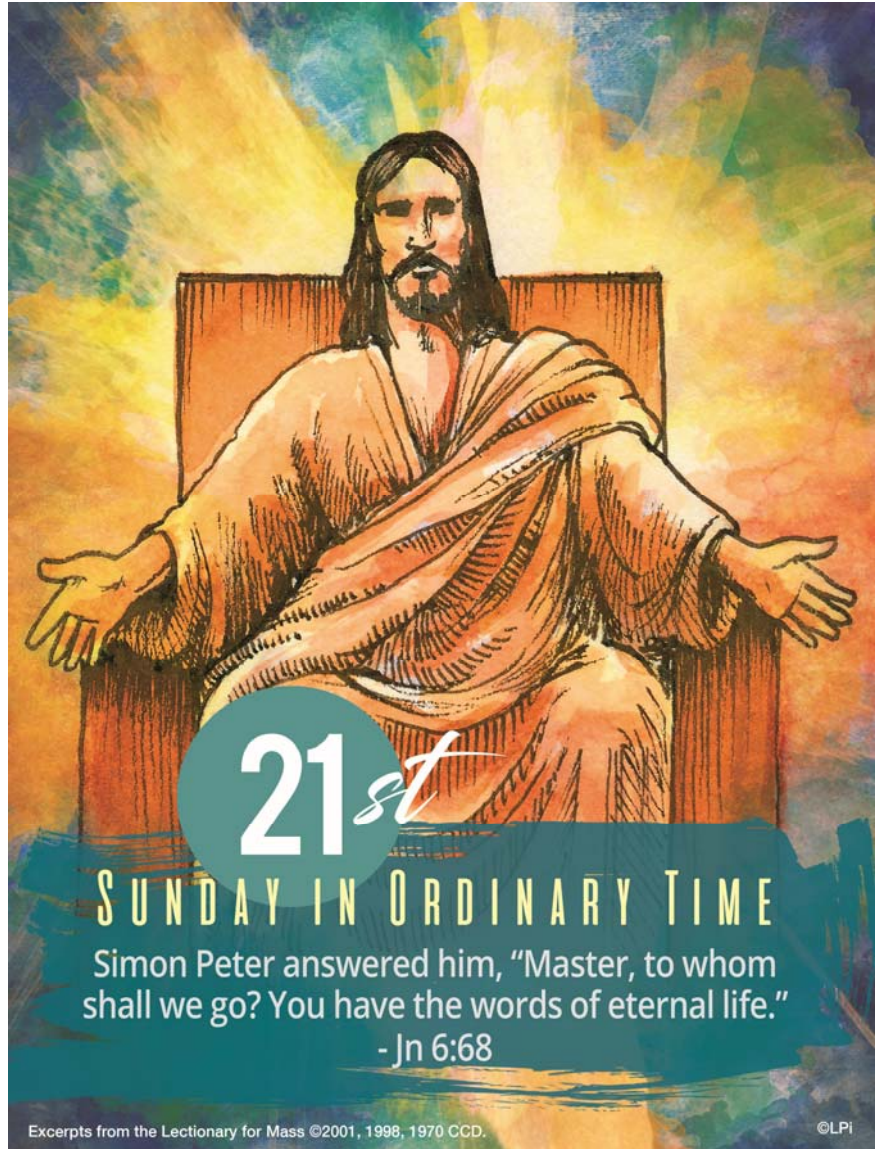

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Beginnings

As we continue through Ordinary Time, today's Gospel speaks of those who couldn't accept what Jesus was teaching and began to leave. Peter responds to the Lord when the Lord asks if he will leave also, "To whom shall we go? You have the words of everlasting life..." Sometimes difficult things may be asked of us, but it is necessary to remember who the loving person is who is asking these things of us. No one offers us what He lovingly does – Everlasting life.

Many of our ministries have begun and those which haven't yet will soon be beginning. We began our nursery a few weeks ago, have already begun a number of our Bible Studies, That Man Is You, and had Confirmation meetings with parents and candidates. Our wonderful Choir began singing at our Liturgies on August 15. Financial Peace will begin August 28, the Early Learning Center will begin again September 4, the day after Labor Day, and the Respect Life Committee has planned their activities for the year. We will soon begin Children's Church on September 9th. PSR sessions will begin the week of September 10. As of this writing, 90% of our students have registered, and we are still in need of a few teachers for them on different grade levels. Young At Heart starts back September 12 and Mats for the Homeless begins September 19th. Many plans and dreams for this Pastoral Year are moving forward and we thank all who are involved with these ministries as well as those who pray for us who are involved with them.

Our RCIA team had its coming together for another ministry year on August 15 and got everything set for the Inquiry Sessions for those interested in inquiring and



learning more about the Catholic faith and tradition.

Inquirers came for their first meeting on August 16. We were happy to welcome Adult, Youth and Children Inquirers to our first inquiry session on August 16. We are pleased to have a wonderful RCIA Team coordinated by Tammy Jackson and know they will be ready to serve these inquirers in good and graced ways.

It is such a humbling experience to be pastor of a congregation which is so involved in sharing the Gospel in such a cheerful and graced way. It is hard to imagine being a pastor of a congregation that is doing more than you could ever keep track of, much less participate in it all. I try my

best to show my support to all who are in ministry, but it is fantastic to recognize how much is going on and how many people are involved, all in gentle, happy and graced ways. There was a time when perhaps I thought I needed to be an active part of everything that was happening in a parish. Those days are long gone, and it is so wonderful to be able to offer support as best I can to parishioners who "pick up the ball and run," trusting in the good and loving God who calls them.

In the midst of all these new beginnings, last Friday we began life in the Diocese of Baton Rouge with a new Bishop.

I am writing this article a few days before the installation, but have served on the Installation Committee. I thought you might be interested to know that the service began with Bishop Duca knocking on the door of the Cathedral, much as the Inquirers will be doing later this fall when we celebrate the Rites of Acceptance. I believe we will be blessed to minister with him in our part of the Diocese.

The Stewardship Material we received for the coming year has a wonderful theme, "A Future Full of Hope." I thought the timing of this year's theme was really great as the materials were prepared and sent to us before we ever received word about our new Bishop. There are many reasons to look forward to "a future full of hope."

- + Beginning a new ministry year with so many dedicated and loving parishioners ready to serve.

What is the origin of the “sign of the cross”?

The July/August 2018 issue of *Catholic Answers* magazine addresses the issue of the origin of the “sign of the cross”:

“The earliest reference to making a ‘sign of the cross’ comes from the Church Father Tertullian who described around the year A.D. 211 how Christians make a small sign of the cross on their foreheads. He writes ‘In all our travels and movements, in all our coming in and going out, in putting on our shoes, at the bath, at the table, in lighting our candles, in lying down, in sitting down, whatever employment occupy us, we mark our foreheads with the sign of the cross.’ In the fourth century, the small forehead sign of the cross developed into the larger sign of the cross that involves the head, chest, and shoulders.”
