Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Beginnings

As we continue through Ordinary Time, we celebrate both the 22nd Sunday of Ordinary Time and Labor Day this weekend. Both celebrations seem to come together well in our second reading from the Apostle James. He tells us to “Humbly welcome the word that has been planted in you and is able to save your souls. Be doers of the word and not hearers only.” We hear on Sunday and do during the week, a nice coming together. There was a time when Labor Day signaled the end of summer, the beginning of school and new beginnings as we moved into another ministry year. Most of our parish ministries have begun anew and others will begin again in the coming weeks. We ask God’s blessing upon them all.

One important beginning was celebrated last weekend as we received Bishop Michael Duca as the sixth Bishop of Baton Rouge. The installation ceremonies at St. Joseph Cathedral were really beautiful and it was great being recipients of the warmth of Bishop Duca as the ceremonies continued through the afternoon. Following the installation ceremonies, there was a reception at the Catholic Life Center. Among those representing the parish at the



installation and reception were **Heather and Kevin Acord**, pictured above with Bishop Duca.

Parker Berthelot was not officially representing the parish, but he is a parishioner and was among those officially greeting the Bishop during the ceremony after he was installed in the cathedra. (The Cathedral takes its name from the cathedra, a chair representing the Bishop’s teaching authority and our unity as a Local Church.) Parker represented College Campus Ministry as he is very involved as a student at Southeastern. I was happy to visit with him, Sr. Renée, and two of his classmates from St. Albert’s Student Center before the installation.

He was installed on Friday, but on Saturday Bishop Duca celebrated the Anticipated Eucharist in Brusly and had dinner with the seminarians. Traditionally this has been the evening seminarians gather to have their photographs taken for the vocation poster, then celebrate Eucharist and have dinner with the Bishop. It was great knowing two from



our parish were there having photographs taken for the poster. **Deacon John Vu** is not “from” our parish, but we are happy to have him with us these five months for his deacon internship as he prepares for ordination to the priesthood May 25. Of course **Kolbe David** is from Immaculate Conception, and we keep him and all our seminarians in prayer as they begin this school year.

The ceremonies and weekend brought back memories of the installation of Bishop Tracy. It was my first year in the seminary. I had transferred from L.S.U. and had only been in the seminary a few months when they put us on a bus and brought us to the Cathedral for the installation of Bishop Tracy as the first Bishop of Baton Rouge. Of course it was not only the installation of a Bishop, but also the celebration of the establishment of the Diocese of Baton Rouge. All the ceremonies, the memories and the excitement of receiving a new Bishop at this stage of my life and ministry took its toll last weekend. It was a happy toll, but when I arrived home after the reception Friday evening, it was just around 6:00 or 6:30, and I couldn’t keep my eyes open. I didn’t even want to move and turn on the television. I made myself stay up until finally I gave myself permission around 8:30 to go to bed and read the paper. I woke up Saturday morning with the newspaper still in bed with me. 😊 Last weekend was a good new beginning, and it was great seeing the parish well represented with all that was going on.

As we move together into this new ministry year, let us keep one another in prayer. Love,

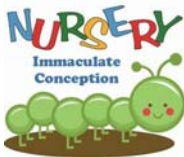

Stump the Deacon!

Can a deacon administer the “Last Rites” to a dying person?

The focus of the sacrament that used to be called the “Last Rites” or “Extreme Unction” has changed. The Sacrament of “The Anointing of the Sick” is no longer limited to those on their death bed. It is now available to those preparing for a serious operation, the elderly whose frailty becomes more pronounced, as well as those in danger of death from sickness or old age. Therefore, one should not wait until the last moments before death to seek this sacrament.

The special grace of this sacrament has the following effects:

- Unites the sick person to the passion of Christ;
- Confers strength, peace and courage to endure the sufferings of illness or old age;
- Forgives sins if the person is unable to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation;
- Restores health if it is conducive to the salvation of the soul; and
- Prepares one for passing over to eternal life.

According to Canon Law, only a priest (which would include a bishop) can administer this sacrament. However, in addition to the Anointing of the Sick, the Church offers the Sacrament of the Eucharist as “viaticum” (food for the journey) for those who are about to leave this life. It is food for the passage of life through death to eternal life. A deacon, as well as anyone permitted to bring the Eucharist to the sick, is a proper minister of “viaticum”. One might truly call this the sacrament of the dying.
