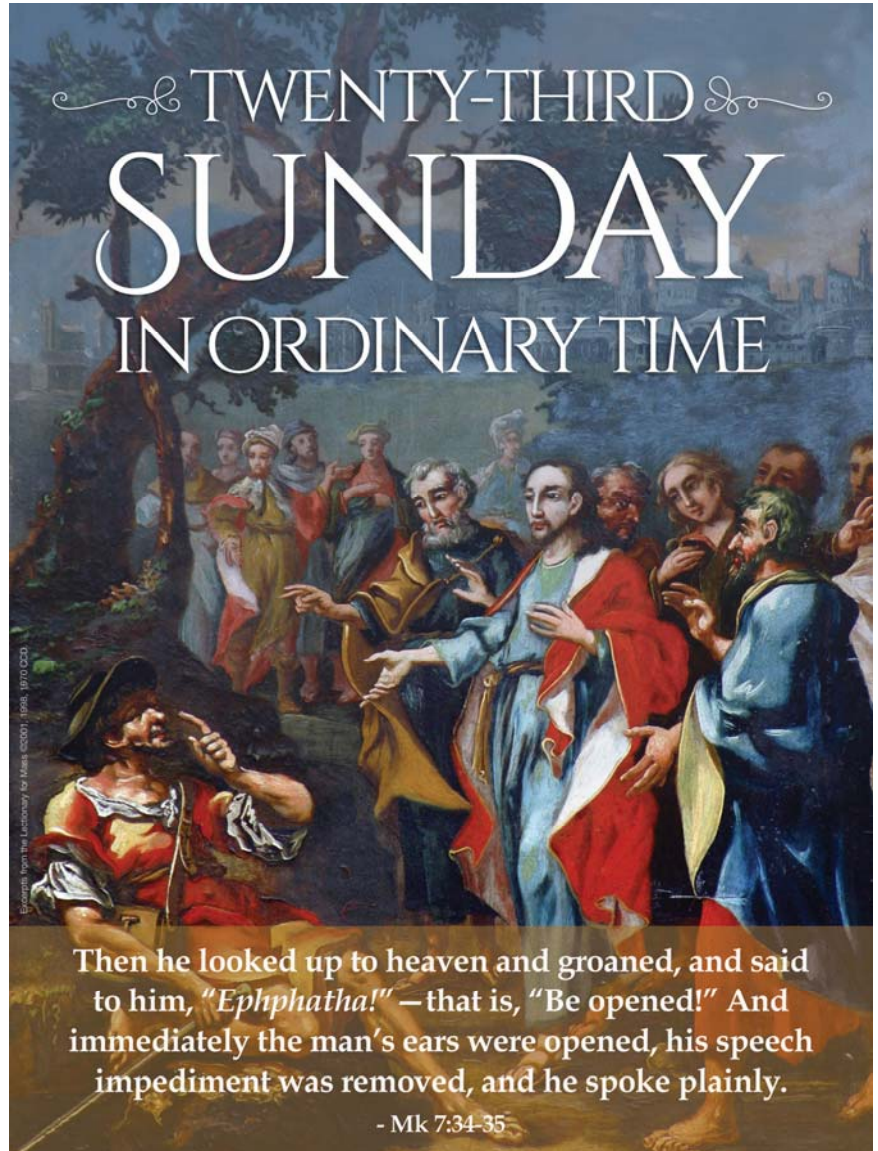

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Beginnings

This Sunday as we celebrate the Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, the first reading and the Gospel speak of the Lord opening the eyes of the blind and the ears of the deaf. It's a good day to give thanks to God for all those whom he has called to help us see and hear of his love and goodness and the great hope to which we are called. As I write this, I think of Mama and Daddy, of grandparents, extended family and friends. I think of teachers, parishioners and so many people who through the years opened my eyes and ears to hear and see a little better the God who loves and was calling me. To the present day, God continues to place people in my life who do this so beautifully. It is a good day for us to give thanks for those persons who have touched us in so many ways.

Moving forward with that same theme, we give thanks for our Parish School of Religion Staff who will be doing the same thing with and for our younger parishioners this school year. We have a wonderful PSR Staff, generous teachers, some of whom have been teaching for years. We are always in need of more, and welcome substitutes and teacher aids who may wish to "get their feet wet" in the classrooms before making a teaching commitment. I thank you all for your efforts here in the parish. You are truly doing what the prophet Isaiah foretold in this Sunday's first reading and what the Lord did in this Sunday's Gospel. We can't thank you enough.

As we moved into September, several of our catechists attended a conference in Lafayette to help prepare for the PSR year which soon begins. The Empower Core Team training conference was a one day Life Teen event held at 20 different locations across the country August 25/26. Our catechists attended the session hosted by St. Pius X in Lafayette with 15 other parishes from across Louisiana and Texas (ours was the only parish from our diocese). The main theme for the training was how to develop the Purpose, Vision, and Mission for their ministry. There were also breakout sessions on evangelization, small groups, and avoiding isolation. They all attended Eucharist together in the beautiful new church of St. Pius and closed the day with



a time of prayer together as a team. They say it was a truly blessed day for them, and we believe it will also be so for our PSR students. Our EDGE Core teams will be ministering with the 6, 7 and 8th grades, and Life Teen Core Teams will work primarily with the 9th grade.

This Tuesday at the 6:00 p.m. Eucharist we will have the Rite of Election for the eleventh grade Confirmation Candidates who are beginning their second year and last months of preparation for Confirmation which will be celebrated here at Immaculate Conception on Friday, January 18, at 7:00 p.m. **There will be no Novena or Benediction this Tuesday because of the addition of the Rite of Election** to the Liturgy this Tuesday. Let us keep our candidates, their sponsors and families in our prayers as they begin these last months of their journey to complete their Christian Initiation.

The parish was recently blessed with the gift of a giant screen which was installed in the large hall. This will be really good for presentations in the large hall, such as those with our Confirmation classes, RCIA, and others who meet there.

Some have asked about the Pilgrimage to France June 12 -22 – if we had enough signed up, if the trip was filled, etc. Currently there are 26 of us signed up for the Pilgrimage, among the staff members going are Deacon Rudy and Jane Stahl, Elaine Matherne, Gwen Richard, and Don and Sherry Leger. The rest are from the parish. As mentioned earlier, the trip will leave by bus from the church parking lot to the airport, then on to Paris. The visits will include Lourdes, Nevers, Ars, Lisieux, the Normandy Beaches and Paris. Stump the Deacon!

Is a Catholic annulment the same as a divorce?

A civil divorce is not the same as an annulment. A divorce severs the bond of a marriage that legally existed. The annulment process is an effort to look beneath the surface of a marriage to see if there are any causes for the marriage not to be binding. A civil divorce does not do this. The Church assumes that all marriages are valid and has always disavowed divorces. In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus renounced divorces: "...what God has joined together, no human being must separate." A Catholic annulment establishes that a valid marriage never existed in the first place. That's the difference. If a valid marriage never existed, an annulment (a declaration of nullity) can be granted. The Catholic Church defines marriage as "a total community of life and love established by the personal irrevocable consent of a man and a woman for the mutual support of the spouses and for the procreation and rearing of children." If both parties are baptized, their union is a sacrament. If an essential element is missing at the time of the marriage, an annulment can be granted. These elements, according to Catholic understanding, include being married in accordance with the canonical laws of the Catholic Church, maturity, free choice, and emotional capability on the part of the spouses, as well as other, more technical, elements. The Church office entrusted with this special ministry of evaluation is the Tribunal. Internal Church law, known as canon law, strictly governs its procedures, which can begin after a civil divorce is final. Marital breakdown is always a painful thing, but many find the annulment process can lead to personal growth and healing. In an upcoming bulletin, we will discuss the annulment process.
