Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Catechesis

This Sunday the Lord in today's Gospel tells us that "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." It was a difficult thing for Peter and those first disciples to hear. Like Peter and those first disciples, we also need to let Christ change us if we are going to truly follow him as his witnesses. We began our relationship with Christ at Baptism, and the rest of our lives Jesus is there, helping us to refine and grow in that relationship. This is what brings us together this Sunday around His Table of Word and Sacrament – allowing Him to continue our formation which began at Baptism. We thank God for all those who have assisted in that formation over the years – parents, teachers, family, friends and priests and religious.

Today is Catechetical Sunday, and we give thanks to God for all those involved in Catechetical Ministry in the parish. The theme for Catechetical Sunday this year is given to us by the Bishops of the United States, and it is **"Enlisting Witnesses for Jesus Christ."** This Sunday, those who have offered their time and talent to serve as catechists in our Parish Schools of Religion will be called forth to be commissioned for their ministry. Catechetical Sunday is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the role that each person plays by virtue of Baptism in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel. Catechetical Sunday is an opportunity for all to rededicate themselves to this mission as a community of faith. The first week of September, some of our catechists who were able to come, gathered with over 200 catechists from around the Diocese for a Day of Reflection and Prayer. The theme of the day was "Enlisting Witnesses for Jesus Christ," the Catechetical Sunday theme. Bishop Duca was scheduled to celebrated the opening Eucharist with them but had a schedule conflict, so I was asked to celebrate the opening Eucharist. The main thing I thought to share with them was based on the theme. Later in



the morning, Bishop Duca addressed the assembly and tried his best not to use the word classroom and students, but instead, gathering places and disciples. I could see Gwen Richard smiling. A lot of what Bishop Duca said is what our Parish School of Religion has been trying to move toward, and moving well at a good and graced pace.

Enlisting Witnesses for Jesus Christ is a beautiful reminder that our PSR is not simply an educational ministry, but a formation ministry. We are not simply teaching catechism, but are forming witnesses, and what we teach in the classrooms is simply an important tool which we use for the ultimate goal, formation of witnesses. It all happens not in our "Education Building," but in our Faith Formation Center.

Last Saturday it was good to welcome our Scout Troop to the parish campus for another Eagle Scout Project.



Earlier in August, I had met with **Patrick Keen** to sign the paperwork authorizing him to approach the Scout Office with his project – pressure washing and cleaning of the rectory, cleaning the gutters, and pressure washing the statues in the Prayer Garden. He assembled quite a group and they spent a good bit of the morning washing down the rectory, the columns, porch ceilings, etc. It has been good welcoming the

scouts who are working on Eagle Projects – **Abren Prestridge** assembled a group to pressure wash

and touch up the paint on the Livingston Chapel. **Chad Street** assembled a group to trim the shrubs and pressure wash the walkways and Stations



in the Prayer Garden. **Adam Giarrusso** striped the parking area in front of the Adoration Chapel, side of the rectory, and Early Learning Center drop off. **Garrett Maggio** made benches for under the walkways. Other scouts from the parish, **Dylan Naquin, Trevor Zeringue, and Dillon Songy,** worked on projects elsewhere. We have a lot of eagles on the horizon.

Last Saturday was another one of those Saturdays which is so good to see.

Mighty Moms were giving out food under the pavilion, the scouts were working around the rectory, a Disaster Recovery session was being held in the meeting room, and I had a wedding in Church – all happening one Saturday morning. Let us keep one another in prayer. Love,

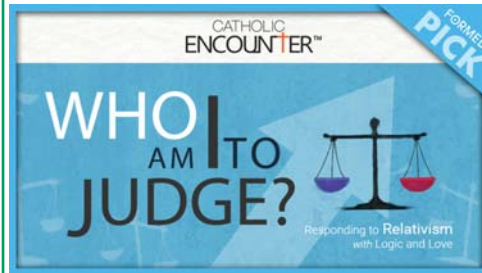

What is "right" and "wrong"? Is what's right for you, right for me? Is there a right and wrong for everyone, all the

time? These are difficult questions to discuss in our culture. We live in a society that supports the opinion that each person should make up his or her own morality—that there is no moral truth that applies to everyone. Many of us have been affected by the relativistic outlook that pervades the modern world. Maybe some of us wonder whether there really is an absolute right and wrong for everyone. Or maybe we accept that there is a moral standard for all, but we don't know how to explain our moral convictions in a convincing way. Maybe some of us are afraid of saying something is immoral because we're afraid of offending others or of being labeled intolerant. How do we talk about morality in a relativistic world? In this small group study program featuring Edward Sri, we'll explore the classical view of morality and find that it's not merely a set of guiding principles for theoretical situations—it is an entire way of life.

Stump the Deacon!

What is the process of obtaining an annulment?

One should contact the church office (or the tribunal office at the diocese of Baton Rouge) to begin the process. A case sponsor (usually a priest or deacon) will be assigned to assist drawing up and sending in the actual petition. The petition is accompanied by pertinent documents (marriage and divorce papers, plus baptismal certificates of any Catholic parties). At the tribunal, an initial review is made to ensure that there is sufficient reason to proceed with the case. Additional information is usually collected from the former spouse, witnesses, and possibly from the petitioner. When needed, an interview follows with each of these parties to clarify issues and offer a chance for personal dialog. After weighing all of the facts, the tribunal makes a decision. Unless the matter is challenged by a formal appeal, the declaration of nullity is issued if warranted. The information gathered in this process is confidential and available only to those responsible for that case and then only with special safeguards to protect the privacy of all concerned. At Pope Francis' request, all annulment cases are now free. The entire cost is borne directly by the Diocese of Baton Rouge and indirectly by its individual parishes. While some cases can be concluded fairly rapidly, the average formal case takes 5 to 8 months to complete. No guarantees can be given that a case will be concluded at a specific date.
