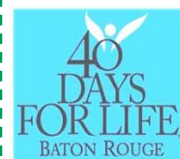

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Humility

This Sunday the Lord speaks of the importance of being of service to one another, and not only service, but HUMBLE service. Humility has always had a hard time, from the days of the first disciples till today. Social media sites lure us into conversations with friends and strangers that focus on ourselves, complimented by a worldwide phenomenon of photos, posts and accomplishments. Twitter accounts encourage users to tell others what they think, what they are doing, and unfortunately, what we should think.

Jesus addresses humility this Sunday. He and his disciples have left Caesarea Philippi and are now back in the small fishing village of Capernaum. Along the way there, some of his disciples questioned him about what would happen as he would lead them from Galilee in the north to Jerusalem in the south. He tells them that suffering, rejection, death and resurrection await, but they do not understand. Jesus asks them what they were arguing about along the way. Perhaps Peter was feeling proud that his Lord had told him the Church would be built on the rock of his life and faith. Maybe James and John were filled with pride because they, along with Peter, had been with Jesus when he was transfigured with Moses and Elijah. The other nine disciples may have felt left out, even ignored. The murmuring was there – the traditional “elephant in the room.”

Aware of this conflict among his disciples, Jesus sits down and tells them that “If anyone wants to be first, he must be



the very last, and the servant of all.” He then asks a child to stand in their midst as an example of humility. “Whoever welcomes one of these little children in my name welcomes me and whoever welcomes me does not welcome me, but the one who sent me.” The child, simply standing in the small gathering of men, was the parable.

After the Resurrection, Ascension and Pentecost, the early Church in Jerusalem was having similar problems. It was led by the Apostle James, the first of the Apostles to be martyred and Bishop of Jerusalem. In our second reading this Sunday, James is writing them asking where all these quarrels and fights were originating. James speaks of

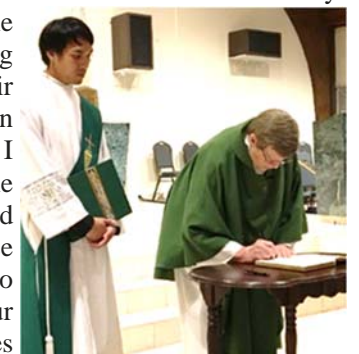
“envy and selfish ambition.” Though he does not speak in a lot of detail about what is happening, he makes it obvious that some in the early Church had forgotten that humble service is the hallmark of being a follower of Jesus. Both Jesus and his Apostle James point the way forward for the early Church and for us today. James describes humility as “rooted in wisdom that comes from heaven” that is “peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy, and good fruit, impartial and sincere.” Such wondrous truths are entrusted to us. Humility acknowledges that we are **not “possessors” of grace as much as “stewards” of grace.** God gifts us with his gifts so that we can become a blessing for others. When we are peace-loving, we invite others to find the peace only God can give. When we are full of mercy, we show our Lord’s way of love is indeed the way of life. When we are impartial and sincere, we acknowledge what the founders of our country declared, that “all are created equal.” In humble service, in gratitude, we seek to serve and share all that has blessed our lives, our parish, and our world.

On September 11 we had the Rite of Enrollment for our Candidates for Confirmation. The candidates first declared their readiness to move ahead and their desire for



Confirmation; then their Sponsors expressed their confidence in them, that they were ready to continue on, and then sponsors, families and parishioners expressed their

support of them as we moved ahead. The ceremony continued as they signed the Book of Enrollment expressing their desire to continue their preparation for Confirmation on January 18. When finished, I had the privilege of signing the book witnessing to all that had taken place. Let us keep these candidates and those who journey with them in our prayers. Half of the candidates will be going on retreat this Saturday, the 29th.



Let us pray for one another as we seek to imitate our loving Lord in humble service. Love,

Why is Cholesterol Important?

September is National Cholesterol Education and Awareness Month. Here are a few facts and tips about keeping cholesterol in a healthy range.

Reducing blood cholesterol levels through exercise, diet, and drugs can reduce the chance of heart disease and death. A diet that is high in fat can contribute to heart disease and cancer which are the two leading causes of death.

Some cholesterol is a good thing. The trouble comes when there is too much because extra cholesterol is stored in the arteries (large blood vessels) and narrows them or even blocks the artery. This can lead to a heart attack or stroke.

Cholesterol comes in two forms, good and bad or also known as HDL and LDL. HDL (good) helps remove cholesterol from the blood stream. LDL builds up in the arteries.

If a blood cholesterol level comes back high, the medical personnel looks at the HDL and LDL levels. If the overall cholesterol level is high due to a high HDL (good cholesterol) the patient is not at higher risk. However, if the overall cholesterol level is high because of a high LDL (bad cholesterol), then the patient is at a higher risk for heart disease and stroke.

The place to start to decrease cholesterol levels is with health habits, healthy low fat diet, quitting smoking, and exercise. This may be easier than you think. It mostly takes common sense and an interest in making these changes. It does not mean giving up your favorite foods, just eating them less often and replacing them occasionally with healthier choices. If developing healthy habits fail to lower the cholesterol level enough, medicine may be prescribed by the doctor.

How often should a cholesterol level be checked? This is usually up to the family doctor. The frequency will depend on family history, and what other risk factors for heart disease are present.
