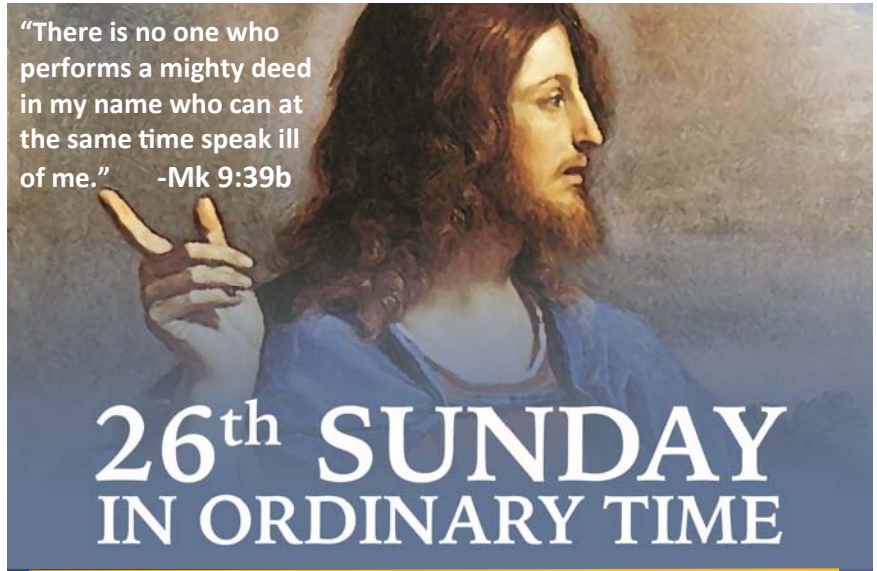

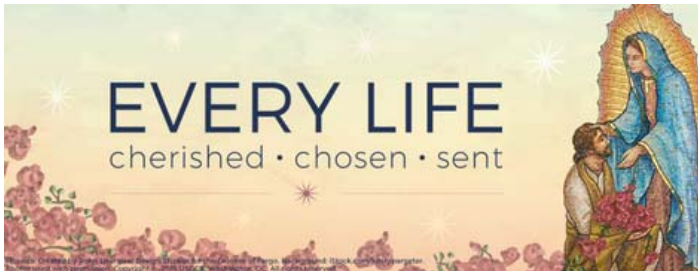

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Respect for Life

This Sunday the Scriptures begin with Moses telling Joshua, "Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets! Would that the Lord would bestow his Spirit upon them all!" What Moses prayed for was fulfilled at Pentecost and continues to find fulfillment in our own days and time.

This Monday we begin the month of October, traditionally known by the Church as RESPECT LIFE MONTH in the United States. The theme this year is EVERY LIFE – CHERISHED + CHOSEN + SENT. There



are so many ways in which we can cherish the lives of others around us. While there will be a display in the church next weekend, I thought it would be good to call it to your attention now, that Monday, October 1, we might together prayerfully think of ways all life can be seen as a gift from God and worth our love and care. **On Saturday, October 13, from 9:45 till 11:00, there will be the NATIONAL LIFE CHAIN in front of Denham Springs High School.** Participants will gather at 9:45 in front of Denham Springs High School for a short prayer and then stand along the side of the road about 5 feet apart to pray silently for one hour. There will be signs along the road that will state our purpose – prayer for all ways in which life can be better respected and protected. **Our parish will be joining others in the greater Baton Rouge area for 40 DAYS FOR LIFE from September 26 through November 4.** It is a peaceful vigil of prayer from 7:00 a.m. till 7:00 p.m. Our parish has selected Sunday, October 28 as the day we will fill those time slots. Some have already committed to time slots, but some are empty, and prayer partners and others are always welcome. You can contact Elaine Matherne, 665-5359, to commit yourself to a particular time on the 28th October.

Fr. Raj will be on vacation days the month of October, leaving Monday, October 1, and returning October 31. While he has had vacation days every year, this will be the first time in several years he will be returning to India to visit family, friends and sites close to his heart. We wish him good and graced days and a safe and happy return. While he is gone, Fr. Joel Labauve and Fr. Johnson Kuriappily will be taking turns assisting me with the liturgical schedule.

This Monday, October 1, I will leave after the 8:30



Eucharist for my annual Retreat at Manresa with the Bishop and priests of the Diocese. I will

be back in the office late Thursday afternoon. This will be Bishop Duca's first chance to be on

retreat with the priests of the Diocese. Directing the retreat will be Fr. Whitney Miller from the Diocese of Lake Charles. Please keep us all in your prayers this week. Deacon John will be coming with us since he will be ordained a priest this spring. Because there will be no priests in the parish at this time, Deacon Rudy and Deacon George will lead Communion Services Tuesday through Thursday. In case of emergencies the Diocese will have priests available and on call and will give their names and contact information to the office staff.

While we begin the month of October reflecting it is Respect Life Month, we here at Immaculate Conception also remember that the month draws toward an end with the celebration of our parish Fall Festival October 19, 20 and 21st. **Our Fall Festival enables us to do many things through the year which enrich lives of others,** young and old, so in many ways it expresses our respect for life. We thank all those who signed up last weekend to assist in one way or another, and we look forward to a good Festival of which we all have "ownership."

This year the Festival will be dedicated to the memory of Clyde and Jean Meyers who were both called to their



reward over the last two years. They both worked with the Festival in different ways and many of you might remember Clyde as the "voice of the Festival," as he made announcements, and called attention to what was happening here and there. It will be really good beginning the Festival with them in our

minds and hearts.

Heal the Sick

Did you know that top Vatican officials encourage blood donation saying it is a powerful and practical way to carry out Christ's command to heal the sick. Former Pope Benedict XVI said Christ could be an inspiration for blood donation, for He is who "redeemed us with his blood."

Javier Lozano Cardinal Barragan once celebrated Mass near the Vatican for several hundred blood donors. In his homily he asked the question why people should give blood. He stated there are many reasons. There is a need despite the millions of units donated each year, especially in poor countries. He went on to say that many give blood to help the sick, but for Christians, donating blood should have another special meaning. "Christ gave to his disciples a specific mandate: 'Heal the sick'. Beyond solidarity and natural compassion, there is this mandate of Christ, whom we obey with our innermost nature by giving blood. This is a great satisfaction, fulfilling from our hearts Christ's command to give health."

If that is not enough motivation, The American Journal of Epidemiology reports that donating blood at least once a year can lower your risk of heart attack by 88%! It's also known to boost the immune system and lower stress levels in donors, and it might even reduce the risk of colon, lung, bladder, and esophageal cancers. All this for a total process that takes one hour or less!

Donors must be at least 17 years of age, weigh at least 110 pounds and have not donated in the last 56 days. A few days before you donate eat foods rich with iron (red meat, fish, poultry, iron- enriched foods, raisins and broccoli). The day of the donation eat a good meal and drink several glasses of water.

If you still are not positive you need to donate, let me give you one more quote:

Jesus said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive." Acts 20:35
