Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Riches

This Sunday the Scriptures call our attention to RICHES, riches of the Kingdom and riches of the world. Were Christ to ask of us what he asked of the rich man in the Gospel for today (Mark 10: 17-20), that I sell all of my possessions to follow him, I wonder if I might be able to do so. Could I turn away from all of my attachments to wholly serve my God? *I would want to*, just as the rich man and the disciples wanted to. But I fear that I would have difficulty.

St. Ignatius of Loyola has a beautiful prayer, but it is difficult sometimes to pray it with 100% commitment: *Take Lord, and receive all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, and my entire will, all that I have and possess. You have given all to me. To You, O Lord, I return it. All is Yours. Dispose of it wholly according to Your will. Give me only Your love and Your grace, for this is enough for me.* ~ Ignatius Loyola

It may be difficult for us to reflect this same disposition, even though we may wish we could, but the beautiful thing is that God understands. God created us to be human and imperfect, incapable of the kind of love that God alone can provide. God has chosen us, and we have chosen God: *God loves us in spite of ourselves.* I am so grateful for this truth that what I can do is simply try my best. We can live in solidarity with others and share, to the best of our ability, the gifts that God has provided. We can work to co-create a community in which others are safe and empowered to share their gifts as well. We open our hearts to give love, show respect, and spread peace.

While these efforts may fall short of what Jesus asked of the man in today's Gospel, I believe that in striving, we are fulfilling God's call. I pray today for courage and faith for our journeys, and for our striving.

Children's Church has gotten off to a good start and we

Last Saturday the sixth graders had a retreat which I mentioned in the homilies at the Liturgies I celebrated. I thought it was too good not to mention in the bulletin this Sunday – with photographs. In a way it ties in with the riches of today's Gospel. The name of the retreat was **Inside Out**, and it was themed around King David and learning to view ourselves and others the way God does. The retreat verse was 1 Samuel 16:7, ““But the Lord said to Samuel, "For the Lord sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart." An important part of the theme's development was that “Sometimes God will allow a Goliath in your life so you can discover the David inside you.” We are called to recognize the



riches of faith and trust which our good God has placed in our hearts, and what our faith and trust can help us do. The

youth decorated mirrors and were encouraged to look at



themselves (their external reflections) and see at the same time what was within them. I thought it was a great idea to share with them. Many thanks to the retreat team who led them through the day.



Let us keep one another in prayer that we may always live aware of the riches placed within our hearts by our loving God. Have a good week. Love,

What can WE do to support the health of our Clergy?

Here are just a few suggestions for how you can be a 'health promoter' and help care for our clergy.

- ♦ *Celebrate their special days.* Celebrate birthdays and ordination days.
- ♦ *Pray for your clergy!* This is the most important thing a parishioner can do for their clergy.
- ♦ *Offer to help.* Don't wait to be asked. Volunteer to support your parish
- ♦ *Go to Mass and/or Confession.* Nothing makes clergy happier.
- ♦ *Write them a note expressing your gratitude.* If nothing else, just say "thank you."
- ♦ *Look out for their wellbeing.* Be respectful of their days off. We should also respect family time for our deacons.
- ♦ *Say "Thank you" and compliment them.* After Mass or confession sometimes just thank them or "That was a beautiful Mass, Father."
- ♦ *Invite him over.* Invite especially the priest to family gatherings—special birthdays or anniversaries—even holiday gatherings. Even if he cannot attend, it is nice to be asked.
- ♦ *Strive for holiness.* There is nothing more exciting for priests than witnessing holiness in the lives of the people to whom he ministers. Not only is that an experience of grace that his labor is bearing fruit, but it's also tremendously edifying in his own pursuit of holiness.

I'm sure many of you may have other ideas. What an awesome way to share the love of Christ by caring for those called to care for us! Thank you Father Frank, Fr. Raj, Deacon Rudy, Deacon George, Deacon John and Deacon Mike!
