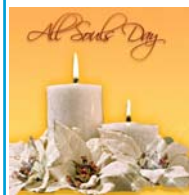
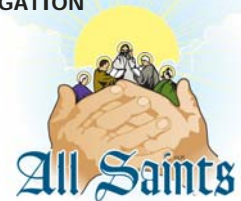

## Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Festivals

**This Sunday the Scriptures** remind us again of the importance of service within our Christian Community. They relate how the Lord accepted our human condition that he might better serve us and be a model for our own Christian service in imitation of him. We are grateful for both his ministry to us and his call to follow him.

**The Early Learning Center celebrated Grandparents Day** last week, and it was a treat seeing so many parents and grandparents coming to enjoy doughnuts with our young students.



I remember reading years ago how many of a person's learning skills and approach to life are learned in these early



years and stay with them the rest of their lives. Thus it is a real consolation to me that though we do not have a Catholic school in Livingston Parish, our Early Learning Center is such a good and graced ministry in the parish.



**This weekend our Fall Festival is dedicated to Clyde and Jean Meyers**, two dedicated parishioners who served the parish as well as the Festival so well over the years. On a personal note, I was told that this was our 49<sup>th</sup> Festival. Just a coincidence, I have been ordained 49 years. So it would seem that in 1969, I was ordained in March and the first Festival was celebrated later in May. I love coincidences like this. It was nice to be able to write at the time this bulletin went to press this past Tuesday that we had already sold **273 \$10,000 raffle tickets. This raffle is a big part of the financial success of the Festival, and we encourage you to purchase your ticket before the drawing Sunday afternoon.** It would be wonderful if we could sell them all. There will be rides, music, games, fantastic food, and fellowship - something for all - this weekend, and I hope you can join us.

**THE BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE: Christian communities remember the names of their dead.** These names are heard in the Prayers of the Faithful during the Eucharist and in the chanting of the Litany of the Saints at the Easter Vigil. Their names are seen on memorial cards, tombs in the catacombs of ancient days and on the graves and mausoleums of today. Especially in the month of November are our deceased family and friends remembered in prayer. During the month of November, we have the custom of giving a place of honor to a Book of Remembrance in which we write the names of our deceased relatives and friends. **Beginning the weekend of October 27/28, the book will be placed on a stand near the baptistery** for the convenience of those who wish to begin writing names of their deceased in it. Beginning November 1, and until the beginning of Advent, the Easter Candle will be burning near the book, and flowers will be placed by it. Those whose names are written in the Book of Remembrance will be remembered at the Eucharistic celebrations through the month of November. For the convenience of those who participate in the Sunday Eucharist at the Sacred Heart Mission, pages from the book will also be available to sign beginning next weekend, October 27-28. The presence of the Book of Remembrance in the church at Thanksgiving will be especially meaningful as we give thanks not only for the blessings of the earth but the blessing of family, friends and eternal life.

**The damaging impact of Hurricane Michael on the state of Florida has been historic. In order to assist the Dioceses in Florida who were affected, we will have a second collection for Hurricane Relief next weekend, October 27/28. Monies collected will be sent from the parish to the Diocesan Finance Office and from there, directed to Hurricane Relief efforts in Florida through Catholic Charities.**



As we move through October, the Fall Festival, and into November, we remember how we travel through our days united as one Body in the Communion of Saints, together with each other and those who have gone before us. Let us keep one another in prayer. Have a good week. Love,

Stump the Deacon!

At one time I heard that Church was doing away with Purgatory, is there any truth to this rumor?

No, purgatory is still in the Catechism of the Catholic Church and in the Bible. Paragraphs 1030 and 1031 of the Catechism state: "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but, after death they undergo purification so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification..." Paragraph 1472 goes on to state: "...every sin, even venial, entails an unhealthy attachment to creatures, which must be purified either here on earth, or after death in the state call Purgatory." Although the word *Purgatory* itself is not in the Bible, the reference is there. Scripture is very clear when it speaks of heaven, "...but nothing unclean will enter it" (Rev. 21:27). In other words, we must be purified of all attachment to sin before we can enter into heaven. Another biblical passage that alludes to purgatory is 2 Maccabees 12:38-46 where Judas Maccabee and his army prayed for those who had fallen in battle while fighting for the Lord asking that their sinful deeds would be wiped away: "...for if he were not expecting the fallen to rise again, it would have been useless and foolish to pray for them in death. But if he did this with a view to the splendid reward that awaits those who had gone to rest in godliness, it was a holy and pious thought..." Our ultimate goal in this life should be to get to heaven, but how many of us are completely purified with no attachment to sin at the time of our death? Most of us will need Purgatory to be purified because God's "eyes are too pure to look upon wickedness and the sight of evil [He] cannot endure". (Hab 1:30).

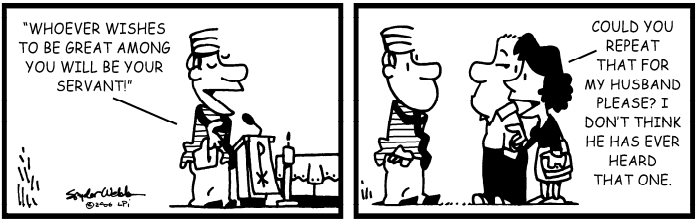
