Alzheimer's Services of the Capital Area will offer free, confidential Memory Screenings here in November to individuals concerned about memory loss. A memory screening is not used to diagnose any particular illness but can alleviate the fear of the unknown. This event provides a valuable opportunity to learn more about healthy lifestyle choices for successful aging. Attend to receive a memory screening and learn more about dementia and community resources available for your assistance.

Memory Screening Goals

- * Provide free, confidential memory screenings to those with memory concerns or who want to check their memory.
- * Eliminate the stigma and fear associated with dementia.
- * Encourage those with memory concerns to follow up with an exam by a physician or other qualified healthcare professional for an accurate diagnosis, treatment, social services and community resource.
- * Educate the public about Alzheimer's disease and successful aging.
- * Alleviate the fears of those who do not have a problem
- * Provide information about the education and support services available through Alzheimer's Services of the Capital Area.

You may benefit from a memory screening if you answer "yes" to any of these questions.

- * Am I becoming more forgetful?
- * Do I have trouble concentrating?
- * Do I have difficulty with familiar tasks?
- * Do I have trouble recalling words or names?
- * Do I forget where I am or where I am going?
- * Am I misplacing things more often?

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Providence

This Sunday, the Gospel speaks of the love of God and love of neighbor as the greatest commandments. One way God expresses his love for us day to day is called Providence. I first became acquainted with the word Providence in high school when reading the biography of St. Jean Vianney, patron of parish priests. He named the convent/school he founded in Ars, Providence. (Just a little aside – many years later as a priest I traveled to Ars thinking there would be hotels, etc. there. When I arrived, it was at night; there was no hotel to be found, and it looked like everything was closed. I walked around a bit, saw Providence, the convent he had founded, and rang the doorbell asking for directions. The nun, Sister Emelie, C.S.J., who answered the door said there was nothing open at the time, but I could stay there. She brought me some bread, ham and wine, and told me about Ars, and that she would arrange for me to celebrate the Eucharist at St. Jean Vianney’s tomb with his chalice. I stayed a few days there in the convent built by St. Jean Vianney. Now that was really Providence in action!)

When at the Cathedral, we celebrated the Bicentennial of the Cathedral Parish in 1992, and parishioners and friends of St. Joseph Cathedral raised funds to build the balcony and purchase the organ that is there to commemorate the Bicentennial. I suggested that the organ be named Providence, expressing our gratitude for God’s protection and care over the centuries. They agreed, and it happened.

When on retreat this past October, the retreat director reminded us, several times, how we often times express certain happenings as a “nice coincidence” when it was actually God’s loving Providence at work. I would like to share with you a recent story of Providence that means a lot to me. Four years ago, our staff gathered for a luncheon to celebrate our fifth anniversary of coming together as the Immaculate Conception Staff on July 1, 2009. I invited Fr. Paul Gros since it was also the fifth anniversary of his ordination and his coming here with us. He asked if he could bring a young seminarian who was spending the summer with him – Seminarian John Vu! I told him sure. We had a nice time; young John Vu didn’t say much as he was a bit shy, and when we all get together as staff, a shy person doesn’t say too much! 😊 After the meal, when thanking everyone, I made mention that in 2019 I would be ordained 50 years. We all heard from John Vu, loud and clear, “That’s the year I will be ordained.” It struck me, and I took a photograph of him and Fr. Paul for the 2014 bulletin. A few years later when John Vu was at Notre Dame, that day still stuck in my mind, and I asked him if he would like to have my chalice when he was ordained. He said yes, and one thing led to another. I had the chalice box repaired, the

paten re-plated, and it was ready to go.

Then one day out of nowhere I received a call from the Vocation Office asking if the about to be ordained Deacon John Vu could come here and do his five month internship with us. It was a real shock. No one knew about the chalice story or that I even knew Deacon John. So he came. While he was here, I had a name plate made with his name for the chalice box and told him I would have my name taken off and have his placed there. He said “No, leave it, and one day I will be able to give it to someone, and all three names will be there.”

So finally the day came, he was leaving Immaculate



Conception and returning to Notre Dame. I gave him my chalice after Communion at his going away Liturgy. **Having him receive the chalice was a great feeling, but back in my**

mind I couldn’t stop thinking of how Providence had been at work all those years, bringing things together at this Eucharist. I trust that this same Providence will be lovingly at work with and for us all in the coming years.

I’d like to share with you a quote from St. Frances de Sales. He wrote the book, *Introduction to the Devout Life*, which was the first book my spiritual director gave me when I entered the seminary. To me it describes Providence so beautifully: *“Do not look forward in fear to the changes of life; rather look to them with full hope that as they arise, for God, whose very own you are, will lead you safely through all things. Do not fear what may happen tomorrow; the same everlasting Father who cares for you today will take care of you today and every day. He will either shield you from suffering or will give you the unfailing strength to bear it. Be at peace and put aside all anxious thoughts and imaginations.”*

Beginning this month with the celebration of All Saints and All Souls Day, we continue this Sunday with the Memorial Service at noon and the Blessing of Graves during the day. As we remember those who have been a part of our lives, even those from ages past who perhaps inspired us, God’s Providence was at work, placing them in our paths, allowing us to journey with them. Blessing of the Graves, November 4

St. John the Baptist prepared the way for our Savior by fasting and penance. Shouldn't we do the same? Fasting makes room in our heart, mind, and soul to prepare us to receive Jesus, to make us worthy that He "should enter under my roof." For centuries, the fast was from all food and drink from midnight of the evening before receiving Communion. Since 1964, the requirement of fasting is at least one hour before receiving Communion. Water and medicine are exempt from any fast.

Fasting is about the disposition of our soul. To prepare the soul, we must prepare our body. Fasting from food and drink before receiving Holy Communion goes back to at least the third century. The Christian writer Tertullian, who died between 220 and 240 A.D., described the Eucharist as the bread which Christians ate before taking any other food.

The Church considers fasting a means of spiritual preparation for the Eucharist, a way of showing reverence for the Sacrament. It creates a physical hunger that reminds us that we are going to receive something special, the Bread of Life. It shows our respect for Jesus and our desire to receive Him as the most important nourishment of our lives. It helps us fully appreciate receiving Jesus.
