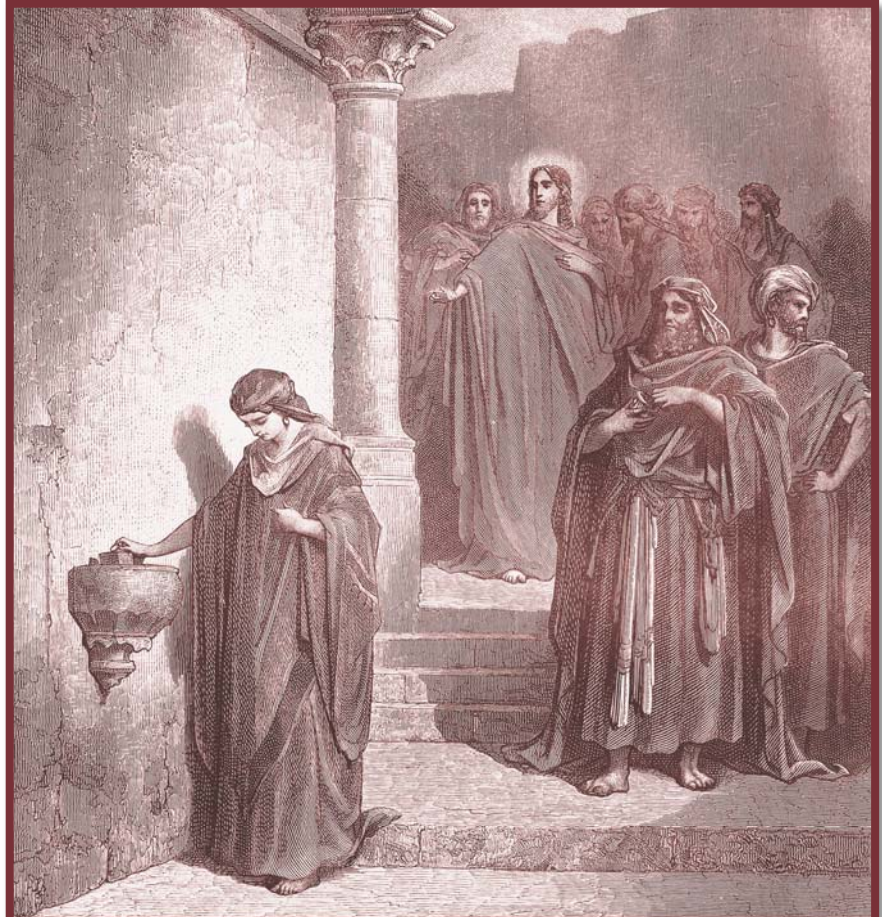

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Gratitude

This Sunday as we continue through these last weeks of Ordinary Time, we are invited to trust in God's Providence. Last weekend I had written about Providence, and how often times we might see things as a nice coincidence, instead of realizing that perhaps it was God's loving Providence at work. This weekend two widows, one in the Old Testament, and one in the Gospel show how they trusted in God's Providence and were willing to give what they felt God was asking of them. **Trusting Providence has a lot to do with responding to a possible call to the priesthood, diaconate or Religious Life,** as sacrifices, sacrifices made with trust, will have to be made as with the two widows in today's Scriptures.

The Catholic Church in the United States celebrated National Vocation Awareness Week, November 3-11. This annual event is a special time for parishes in the U.S. to foster a culture of vocations for the priesthood, diaconate and consecrated life. We conclude the week this Sunday as we begin the annual Adopt a Priest or Seminarian here in the parish. Though Vocation Awareness is celebrated for a week in the United States, we will continue to focus on prayer for vocations here in the parish during this month of November.

Pope Francis, in his message for the 2018 World Day of Vocations, emphasized that it is at the loving initiative of God, and by His personal encounter with each of us, that one is called. "Even amid these troubled times, the mystery of the Incarnation reminds us that God continually comes to encounter us. He is God-with-us, who walks along the often dusty paths of our lives. He knows our anxious longing for love and he calls us to joy. In the diversity and the uniqueness of each and every vocation, personal and ecclesial, there is a need to listen, discern and live this word that calls to us from on high and, while enabling us to develop our talents, makes us instruments of salvation in the world and guides us to full happiness." Parish and school communities across the nation are encouraged to include in November, special activities that focus on vocation awareness and provide opportunities for prayerful discernment. Contemporary society is all too often saturated by constant activity and noise, so it is important to encourage young discerners to take time for silent, contemplative prayer. Results of studies conducted by the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA), notes that **72% of those ordained to the Priesthood or solemnly professed within the last year cited participation in Eucharistic Adoration as a prayer experience that proved influential in their discernment.** Cardinal Joseph Tobin, Chairman of the Committee on Clergy, Consecrated Life and Vocations echoes this finding,

stating: "Quiet reflection and prayer are essential elements for vocational discernment. It is in the interior depths of our heart where we hear the voice of Christ, where he speaks to us, and where he reveals his will for our lives." Let us encourage prayer and silent reflection among our young parishioners, especially in terms of their possible vocations.

We received word that our gross income from the Fall Festival was \$160,533. We have paid some bills, but still have more to pay. We will let you know what our real income (profit) will be when all bills are paid. It looks like it will be our most successful festival in recent years. We already know it was great if measured in terms of fellowship and welcome. We thank, along with our Festival Chairperson **Donald Drone** and festival workers, **Michelle Holmes** who has done the bookwork and much paperwork before, during, and continues to do after the festival.

Many thanks to Tonda Delahoussaye who painted the "Banner of Remembrance" which was in the church foyer for the Annual Memorial Service the Sunday after All Saints Day. It is a beautiful gift she makes for us each year. I believe one aspect of this banner which is really important is it is a means of Evangelization, of letting others know how we reverence the lives of those who have shared in our lives here on earth. It was wonderful seeing so many non-parishioners taking photographs of the banner with their phones and making comments of how they were going to send the photo to this relative and this friend.

I was so pleased last Monday to go into the church and see the two Giving Trees nearly empty. If they have names on them this Sunday, it is because they were added. Last Saturday, the two trees were filled with names, and by Monday they were empty. It is a beautiful way of seeking to help younger members of our community and their families as we approach the Christmas Season, and we thank **Ricky and Tina Guillory** for leading this ministry for us, as well as you who participate in it.



Banners of Remembrance, Giving Trees, and many other things we almost take for granted as being part of our parish life and ministry, speak volumes about who we are to those who visit us, and I thank all who minister in the parish in so many ways. As we continue through this month of gratitude, let us thank God for one another and all who journey with us. Let us keep each other in prayer. Love,

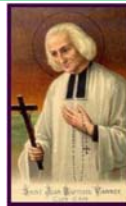
