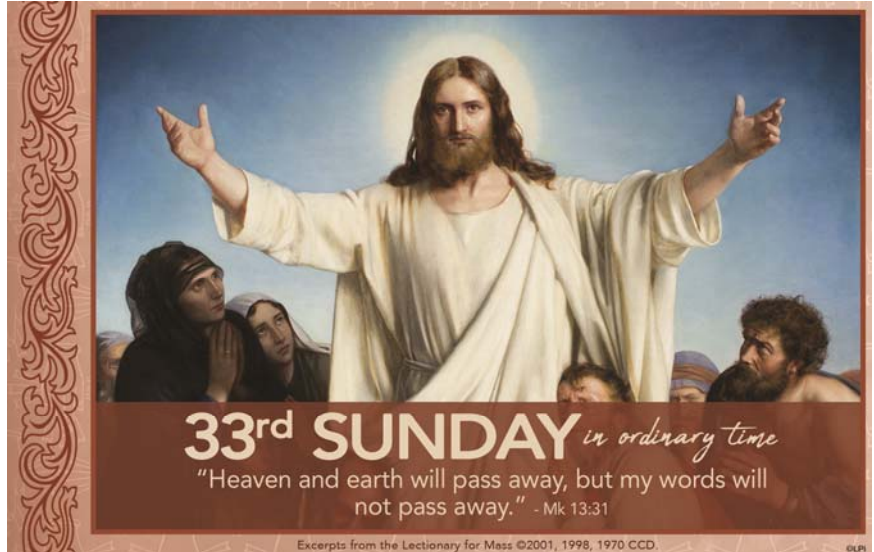

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time

It was good beginning this month gifted with the Feast of All Saints, and as we continue through this month of Thanksgiving, we near the end of the Liturgical Year, and our Scriptures remind us of the coming of the Son of Man when all shall be reunited in his Heavenly Kingdom. As we prepare to celebrate the end of the Liturgical Year next Sunday and the beginning of a new one on December 2, the First Sunday of Advent, we are reminded that heaven and earth will pass but the saving word of the Lord will endure forever.

This Sunday we celebrate the Rite of Acceptance for those Inquirers who have been seeking to learn more of the Catholic Christian way of life. Most of them have been joining us on Thursday evenings since August 16th seeking to learn more about the Catholic way of worship and living. We express our sympathy and prayers to Jean Floyd on the death of her sister-in-law, **MARY LOUISE BOUDREAUX;**

Mary and the saints do hear our prayers. This is supported by Scripture. Even though they have left this earth, Mary and the saints are not dead as we normally think of death. Jesus said “And concerning the resurrection of the dead, have you not read what was said to you by God, ‘I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob’? He is not the God of the dead but of the living.” (Matthew 22:31-32) Jesus is telling us that the saints are alive in heaven, probably more alive than we are on earth. If we can hear, they can also hear. In the letter to the Hebrews, the author states “Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses [in other words, those faithful who have died before us], let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us and persevere in running the race that lies before us.” In other words, those in heaven surround us like spectators at a race; therefore, they must know about us and can see our earthly struggles from heaven. (Hebrews 12:1) The Letter of St. James states “The fervent prayer of a righteous person is very powerful.” Who can be more righteous than a soul who is already fully sanctified and in heaven? (James 5:16) The Book of Revelation probably gives the best scriptural evidence that our prayers to the saints in heaven are heard. Revelation states that “the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb, each holding a harp, and with golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints.” (Revelation 5:8) To rephrase this passage, “The saints in heaven facilitate the praises and petitions of the saints of earth.” Revelation 8:3-4 goes on to state that the prayers of the saints on earth rise with the prayers of the saints in heaven “from the hand of the angel before God.” But, how can a saint understand all of the prayers offered to him? There may be thousands or even millions of prayers offered at the same time in many different languages. See next week’s installment for the answer.
