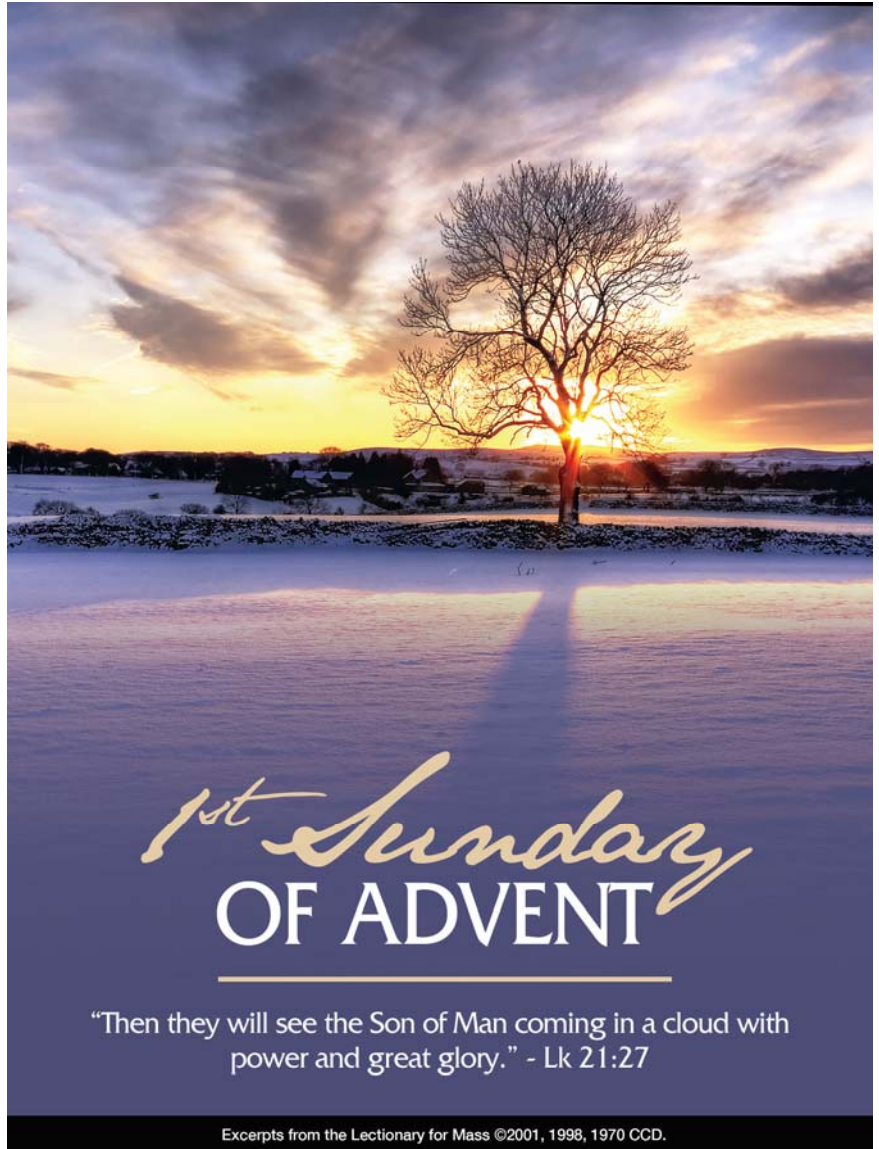

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: New Beginnings

This Sunday as we gather for the Sunday Eucharist, we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent, the beginning of a new Liturgical Year, and Prayer Commitment Sunday. We hear in today's Gospel about the Final Coming of Jesus. As we first hear the Gospel, it may seem like a cause for anxiety.



On the other hand, we are called to hold fast to the hope that our faith gives us even in times of trial and tribulation – Christ's Triumph is our triumph. This is what we celebrate in the Advent season – a time of preparation and anticipation. We look forward to the coming of Christ, and as we look forward, we try to be vigilant, prayerful and worthy to stand before him when he comes in glory. **We seek to stay awake in prayer as we make our re-commitments to prayer this Sunday.**

There will be a special collection next Sunday for St. Joseph Abbey and Seminary. St. Joseph Abbey and



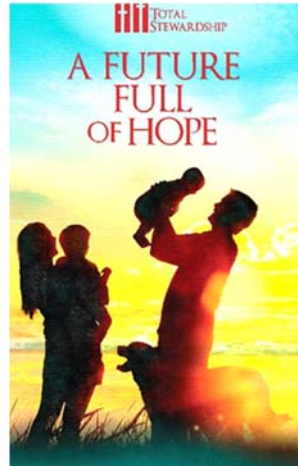

Seminary College in Covington, Louisiana, have had a profound influence on the life of the Catholic Church in the Deep South. For over 125 years the monks of the abbey have been educating and forming young men as candidates for the priesthood. This has been their primary mission and their lasting legacy. Most of our own diocesan priests, myself included, studied there.

The monks began this ministry in 1889, and following the Benedictine tradition of balancing prayer and work, the monks instilled in the seminarians personal formation, a prayerful spirit, a love for the liturgy, a thirst for knowledge, and a respect for manual labor. As a result, the influence of the monks has been felt throughout the Dioceses

of Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama through the dedicated service of the 900 plus priests that have since been ordained after seminary formation with them. **Today, St. Joseph Seminary College is the largest Catholic seminary college in the United States with 138 students from 22 dioceses in seven states (and one from our parish 😊).** Given the urgent need for priests, the continued contribution of the monks of the abbey is invaluable, and we appreciate your helping them next Sunday.

For those who may have forgotten them, there are a few extras in the rear of the church which can be placed in the collection basket in the coming weeks. We trust that our commitment to prayer will make this a real year of grace, not only to ourselves, but to those whom we serve.

As we begin Advent, we are grateful for the Catechumens and Candidates for Full Communion who will begin

Advent with us. Pictured above are the former inquirers



who participated in a retreat in preparation for the Rites of Acceptance November 18th. Joining us this Advent are 8 Catechumens seeking baptism at Easter and 19 Candidates for Full Communion, already baptized, but seeking to complete Christian Initiation with us at Easter through Confirmation and Eucharist. In addition to these adults and older youth, we have 18 children who are going through RCIA-C to receive the Sacraments of Initiation. In addition, there are seven adults who will be confirmed.

As we begin this Advent Season together, we thank the Father for the gift of hope, the gift that keeps giving. Let us pray for our Candidates and Catechumens and for all who journey with us. Love,

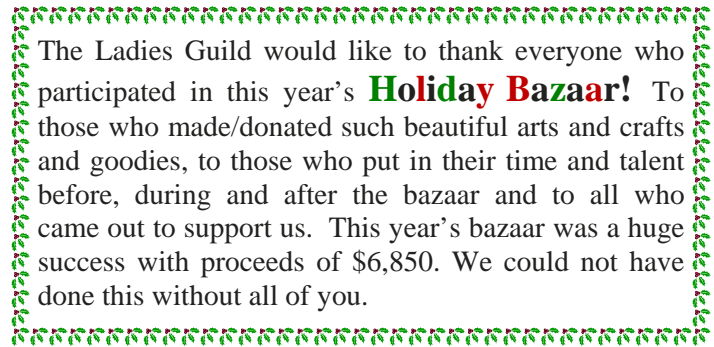

Stump the Deacon!

What is the difference between miracles and magic?

The Gospels are filled with stories about the miracles of Jesus. But, are they miracles or magic? Magic is always about something unnatural—making something disappear, sawing a person in half without hurting them, turning a frog into a prince, etc. Magic involves things that don't go with nature—things can't just disappear, sawing a person in half would hurt, frogs and princes don't go together. Miracles, on the other hand, are natural. A miracle is God intervening in the natural order of things to reveal Himself to us. When Jesus heals a sick person, He is restoring that person's health, a natural phenomenon. When He feeds five thousand men, He is doing something natural, feeding people. When Jesus brings a dead person back to life, He is revealing His power over life and death, natural consequences of our life on earth. Some may want to dismiss the Gospels as fairy tales with fairy tale magic. The Gospels, however, are "faith stories" that present facts that really happened while teaching life lessons. Jesus was not just a wonder-worker; His miracles show us that He is always with us, stretching out His helping hand to us.

The above is essentially a summary of *Miracles and Magic, What's the Difference?* By Fr. Dwight Longenecker, published in the December 2018 issue of *Catholic Digest*.
