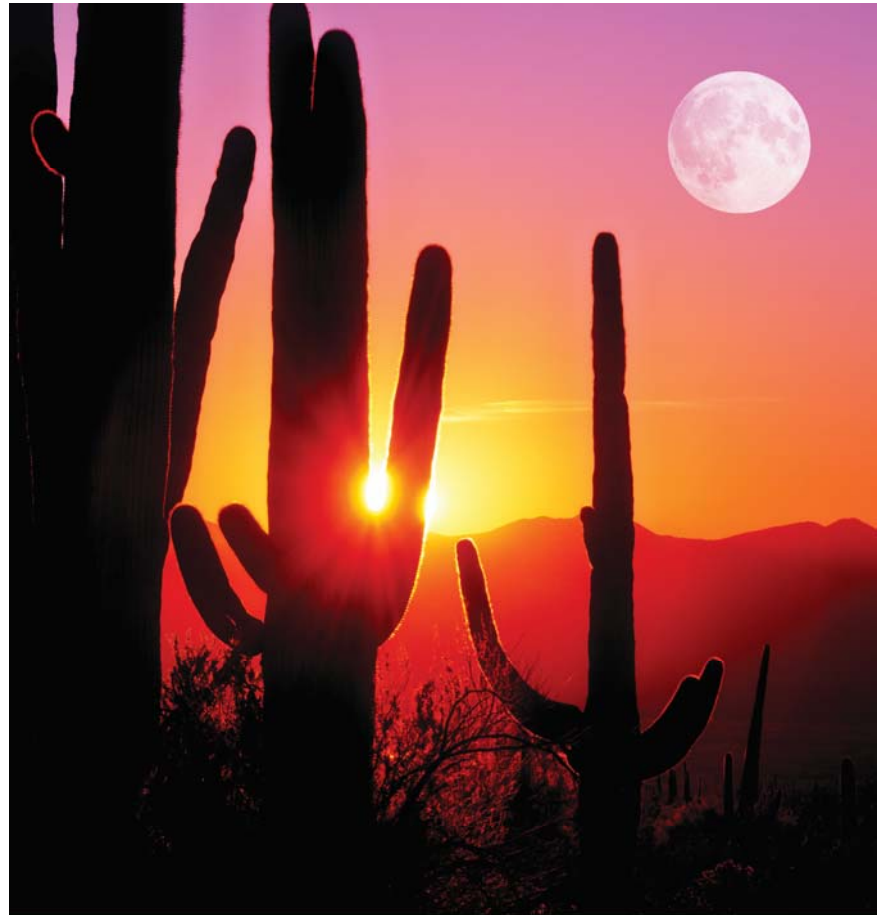

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Preparing the Way.



This Sunday, the Second Sunday of Advent, John the Baptist in our Gospel tells us to “prepare the way of the Lord. Make straight his paths.”

# Continuing the Journey

## RCIA Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults/Children

The Catechumenate Phase marks the beginning of formal instruction in the Catholic faith. Prospective Catholics learn the basics of the faith and how to live the Catholic way of life. During this time, the catechumen/candidate will take part in the Sunday Liturgy of the Word although they do not participate in the Eucharist. They will leave the assembly after the homily with a blessing, and they will continue instruction with a catechist. This dismissal is a powerful sign and public witness to the community of faith of the sincerity and determination of those seeking to become Catholic. It shows that they are seriously pursuing their call and preparing to become full-fledged, committed Catholics. After this Sunday, the Catechumenate phase will resume **January 6**. We ask that you continue to offer your prayers for those on this spiritual journey.

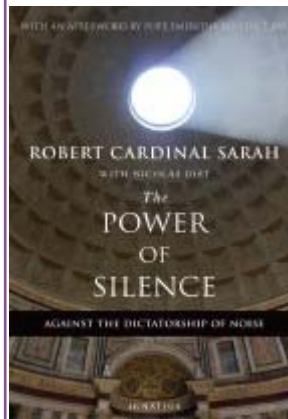

In a time when technology penetrates our lives in so many ways and materialism exerts such a powerful influence over us, Cardinal Robert Sarah presents a bold book about the strength of silence. The modern world generates so much noise, he says, that seeking moments of silence has become both harder and more necessary than ever before.

Silence is the indispensable doorway to the divine, explains the cardinal in this profound conversation with Nicolas Diat. Within the hushed and hallowed walls of the La Grande Chartreux, the famous Carthusian monastery in the French Alps, Cardinal Sarah addresses the following questions: Can those who do not know silence ever attain truth, beauty, or love? Advent is a season of the Church that lasts about four weeks, beginning four Sundays before Christmas and ending on Christmas Eve. It is a time for hope and the joyful expectation and prayerful preparation for the second coming of Jesus, as well as the anniversary of His birth. It has a pro-life focus. The predominant color of vestments during Advent is purple because Advent is truly a time for penance, preparation and sacrifice. Some people call Advent a "little Lent." Just like during Lent, the Gloria (one of the most festive hymns of the Mass) is not sung. Here are some interesting facts about Advent from the Catholic Apostolate Center:

- The word "Advent" comes from the Latin word *adventus* or coming.
- Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical year, representing the time in history that Chris was not known to us. With His birth, the beginning of our faith was founded.
- Hope is the predominant theme of Advent. The Israelites hoped for a Messiah to come, and Jesus entered their world. We are hopeful for His arrival again into our world.
- Advent is a reminder of the Old Testament promises of the coming of the Messiah. Readings from the prophet Isaiah are often used to remind us that we are waiting for the day when the Messiah will come again.
- Advent focuses on light, as opposed to darkness. Christ enters our dark world as the light of the world and casts away the darkness of sin to redeem us.
- Advent, as we know it today, was developed in Rome. Pope Gregory I in the late 6th/early 7th century composed many of the prayers, antiphons and psalm responses.

In the next bulletin, we will discuss the Advent wreath.

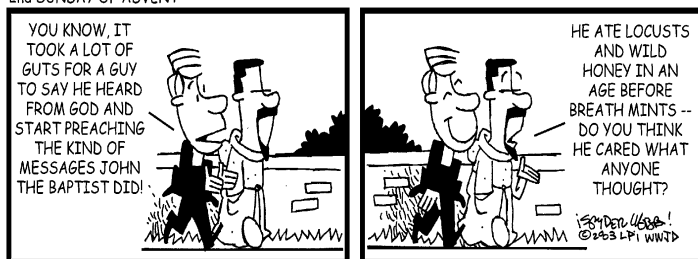
