Consideration of Our Christian Commitment: Awaiting Fulfillment.

As we begin the Third Week of Advent, this Sunday is traditionally called Gaudete Sunday (Rejoicing Sunday) – a rejoicing reflected in the rose candle which we light and the Scriptures which we hear. We are more than halfway through our season of vigilant preparation and prayer and are more and more ready to celebrate both the coming of Christ in history and his eventual final return in glory. For us as Christians, the theme of rejoicing lies at the heart of our faith. Even if we are struggling with life’s challenges, we are still called to be people of joy and to be ready to share that joy with others.



Obviously this joy is not the same as pleasure or human satisfaction. These are emotions that are short-lived and are derived from outside of us, external conditions. Spiritual joy arises from our interior, our hearts, and our relationship with the Lord. Spiritual joy can rise in our lives even in the midst of life’s struggles and becomes the hallmark of the true Christian.

In our first reading, the prophet Zephaniah is excited in his description of God’s faithfulness and promises. St. Paul in our second reading calls upon the Philippians and upon us to be joyful, not with a superficial rejoicing but with a joy that flows from the Lord. To maintain that joy, St. Paul encourages them to stay prayerful at all times.

In the midst of all this rejoicing, we hear another voice, the voice of John the Baptist calling us to repentance and justice. His first followers ask what they should do. John suggests that they not retreat from life, but be engaged in living justly, to be sharers rather than simply takers. Tax-collectors are not to resign but be just, soldiers are not told to leave, but to use their power fairly.



It seems like all of our Scriptures come together this Sunday around the themes of living joyfully and lovingly. A good example of this is below:

This Sunday is the deadline for gifts to be brought to the Church for distribution to the poor and needy. While we thank **Ricky and Tina Guillory** for heading up this ministry to the young and needy among us, we also thank all of you for your thoughtfulness in purchasing the gifts which will be distributed for Christmas. I joked with Fr. Raj one week that I was glad we didn’t have reconciliation scheduled, as there

was no way I would be entering my reconciliation room. It was almost impossible to walk in the area, which was a real joy to see. Over these past weeks, Ricky and Tina have come to the church over and over picking up the gifts when they are returned. They have been making many trips to pick up gifts, but this photograph just about says it all. The back



seat, the floors, and the trunk of their car were filled. I asked them to pose for this photograph as it speaks so much about the comfort and joy parishioners wish to share with younger members of our community.

This Thursday, December 20, the parish offices will be closed as we come together as Staff for our own Christmas outing and prayerful time together. We will be going to New Orleans and St. Mary’s Assumption Church where the Fr. Francis Xavier Seelos shrine is located. We will be given a tour of the history of the church and Fr. Seelos, and then celebrate the Eucharist at the altar of the Assumption Church where he celebrated the Liturgy in the 1800’s. After, we will go for a dinner together thanking the good God for all he does with us, for us, and through us. **Looking ahead, the parish offices will be closed December 24-January 1 for Christmas.** I will be having Confirmation interviews during these days as our candidates will be off from school and have scheduled times when they can come see me.

I thought it would be good to give you a heads up about something you will be hearing a lot about come January. We have contracted for another parish pictorial directory from a firm called **Lifetouch**. They will begin taking photographs of families the end of January and go for 23 days so we can have our next directory printed and distributed in August, 2019, when we begin another pastoral year. It is amazing all they are offering us, and I will follow-up with more information in the coming weeks. Meanwhile, wishing you good days. Love,

The Catechumenate Phase marks the beginning of formal instruction in the Catholic faith. Prospective Catholics learn the basics of the faith and how to live the Catholic way of life. During this time, the catechumen/candidate will take part in the Sunday Liturgy of the Word although they do not participate in the Eucharist. They will leave the assembly after the homily with a blessing, and they will continue instruction with a catechist. This dismissal is a powerful sign and public witness to the community of faith of the sincerity and determination of those seeking to become Catholic. It shows that they are seriously pursuing their call and preparing to become full-fledged, committed Catholics. The Catechumenate phase will resume **January 6**. We ask that you continue to offer your prayers for those on this spiritual journey.

What is the meaning and symbolism of an Advent wreath?

Traditionally, the Advent wreath is a circle of evergreen branches. Both the evergreen branches and the circular shape symbolize the passing of time and eternal life. The shape of the wreath, with no beginning or end, reflects the complete and endless love that Jesus has for us. During the Advent season, we eagerly anticipate His coming and the promise of eternal life in heaven with Him. As a Christian tradition, the wreath holds the four Advent candles. The candles represent Jesus coming as the light in darkness. One candle is lit each Sunday until all four candles are lit, and sometimes a fifth candle is lit on Christmas. As Christmas draws nearer, each candle brings a little more light into the darkness. Each of the candles represents an aspect of preparation during the season of Advent:

The first candle: The Candle of Hope—Color: **Purple**. Purple is the primary color associated with Advent. Within the Catholic Church it symbolizes penance, preparation, and sacrifice. During the first week of Advent, we look forward to Jesus' coming with hope.

The second candle: The Candle of Peace—Color: **Purple**. During the second week of Advent, we reflect on our lives and work on becoming better-versions-of-ourselves in preparation of Jesus' coming.

The third candle: The Candle of Joy—Color: **Rose**. This candle is pink, symbolizing anticipation and rejoicing. During the third week of Advent, we are filled with joy for the near arrival of Jesus on Christmas day.

The fourth candle: The Candle of Love—Color: **Purple**. During this final week of Advent, we rejoice in the endless love that God has for us, which is made apparent in the birth of His Son.
