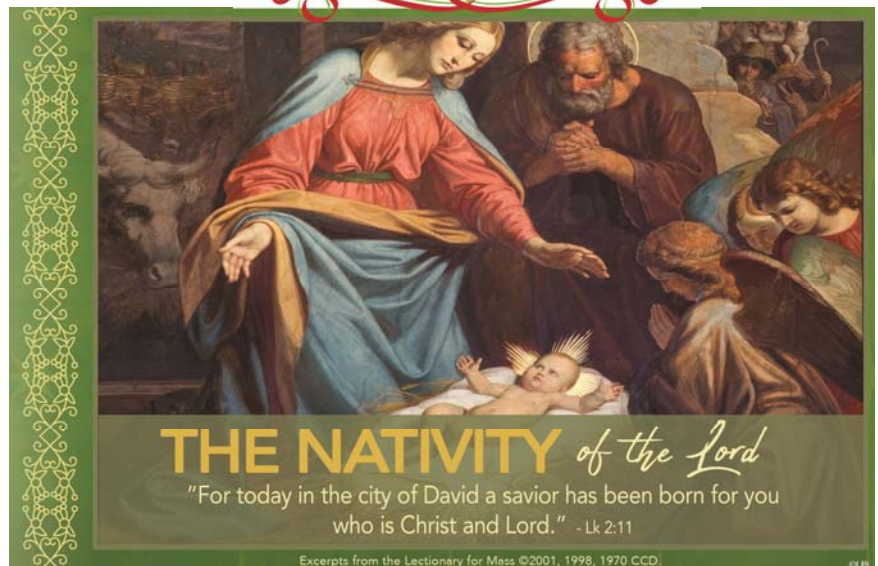

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Moving into Christmas

As we begin this very short **Fourth Week of Advent**, the Scriptures give us a lot to reflect on about Jesus these last days of Advent. Micah tells us that from Bethlehem will come a ruler who will stand firm and shepherd his flock. St. Paul in our second reading reminds us that Jesus didn't come with offerings, but obedience to his Father's will. Finally, in the Gospel Elizabeth listens to the Holy Spirit within and praises Mary and her child.



In two days we will be reading in the Christmas Gospels how there was no room for Jesus, Mary, and Joseph in the inn. While this was sad, it was no tragedy. The only tragedy would be if there is no room in our hearts for them and all they have come to share this Christmas. Décor in the church is wonderful and we are grateful to our décor committee. The music is great and we are appreciative to our music ministry and all the other liturgical ministers who have prepared to begin this Christmas Season with us, but when all is said and done, the only transition which really matters is the transition which takes place in our hearts and lives. We thank the good God for the gift of his Spirit who assists us in this daily conversion and transition.

The birth of Jesus, the Messiah gives us, the Church, great hope. Although secular celebrations of Christmas may ignore the significance of the holy day, the Church always gives us Advent to help us keep our focus. We reorient our hearts and minds to recall, once again, the mysterious glory of the Incarnation. In these weeks of Advent preparation, we have been called to remind ourselves what it means to be Christian in case we have begun taking it for granted. To be Christian is to believe that God is truly with us in the most personal, intimate way imaginable; he is one of us! His life and Spirit is within us. "They shall name him Emmanuel, which means 'God is with us.'" Through the Incarnation, God became human and lived among us to love us, to guide us, to heal us, and to strengthen us. It is the promise of a Savior given through the early prophets, a promise that the faithful held dear as they waited. As the most beautiful of all anniversaries approaches, we move into Christmas to celebrate this season remembering the greatest gift ever given to every person--the gift of a Savior.

This Sunday, we light the fourth and last candle on our wreath and Monday and Tuesday will be the lighting of the Christ Candle in the center of the wreath. The purple

ribbons will be changed to red. Let us ask our God to bless our families as we near Christmas.



Now that we are about to make this transition from Advent to Christmas (in this bulletin article at least 😊), I would like to offer a word of thanks to many. I would like to begin with our staff. A lot of times, we have a photograph of the staff in this article, a photograph taken on our Christmas outing. Unfortunately, this bulletin article was



due before we left for our outing, but I am enclosing a photograph of "the flock" when we attended the Deanery Christmas social. We were told to dress in a way which would identify us as coming from Immaculate Conception. Not all could go, but those who were able to attend went as sheep. Guess who was the "black sheep!" I cannot thank our staff enough. It is fantastic how a staff of our size works and ministers together throughout the year without harsh words or looks. They minister so well to those who come to the office and other buildings on campus, and to each other, assisting us all to accomplish what the good God has set before us. Our staff not only keeps me going, but keeps me energized and at peace. I thank all those who are liturgical ministers, from the choir to the altar servers and greeters. You are the most visible representatives of the parish to those who come to us. Many may not encounter someone in the office, but they encounter you and witness your faith, love and dedication. 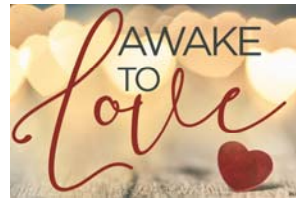

She has recently received the greatest news of her life - that she is to be mother to the Messiah by the power of the Holy Spirit - but her concern is for her cousin in need. Through God's grace, Elizabeth turns it into an opportunity to honor the coming Christ. "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." Yet Mary's example of selflessness should inspire us.

In these final days before Christmas, stay watchful and awake! You never know when God might invite you to welcome, hospitality, and compassion. It might be tempting to reject the opportunity for your own needs. Follow the example of Mary! If God is providing you an opportunity to love, He will provide the means to accomplish all your other tasks. This Christmas season, may you too hear, "Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled."
