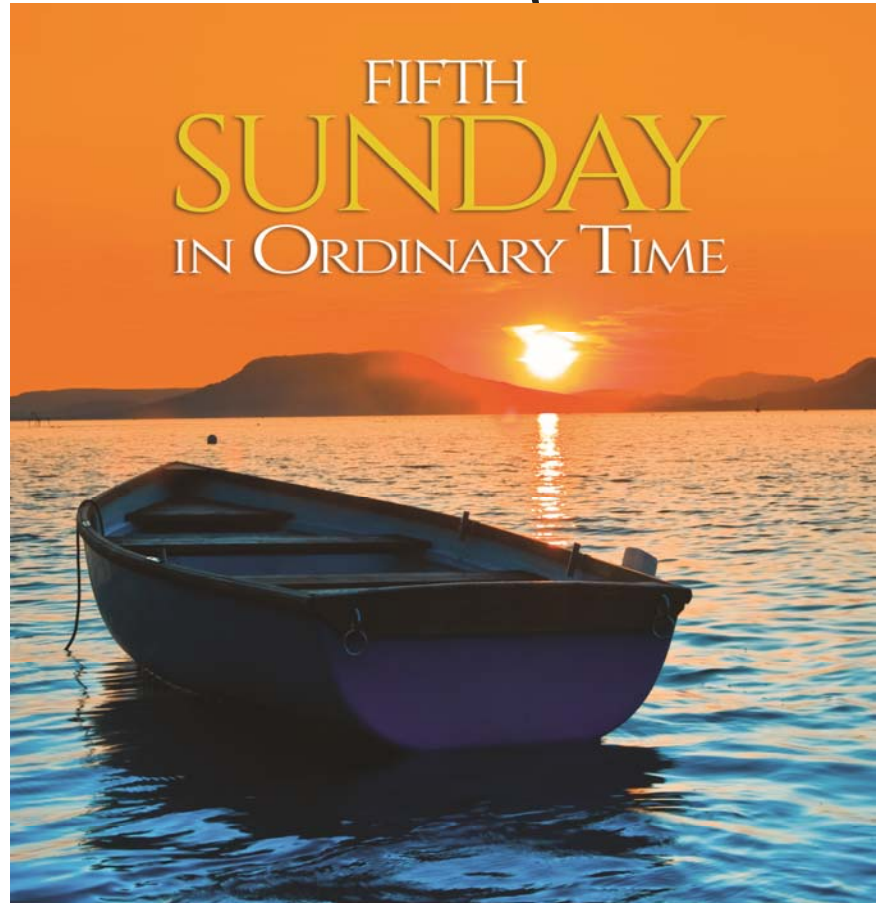

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Ministries

The Gospel this Sunday does not begin with Jesus asking Simon to follow him. Rather, Jesus begins slowly with something basic, something simple that Peter can do with relative ease. After all, he had been fishing all his life. He tells Simon to “put out a short distance.” Now this might have been inconvenient, especially since Simon has been fishing all night and caught nothing. But Simon gets back in the boat, puts out a short distance, and lets Jesus teach the crowds from the boat (more than likely listening to what was being taught at the same time). Then Jesus tells Simon to go out into the deep water and lower his nets for a catch. It didn’t make sense to Simon, but he did it nonetheless. Finally, after their amazing catch, they leave their boats and nets and follow Jesus.

As with Simon, Jesus meets most of us where we are and little by little, invites us to follow him more and more. With the Lord at our side, saying yes little by little, our lives will change, and we become more and more faithful disciples. We serve a God who knows us.

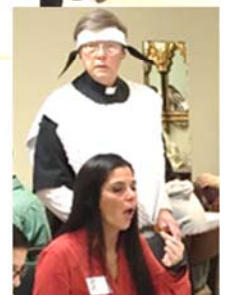
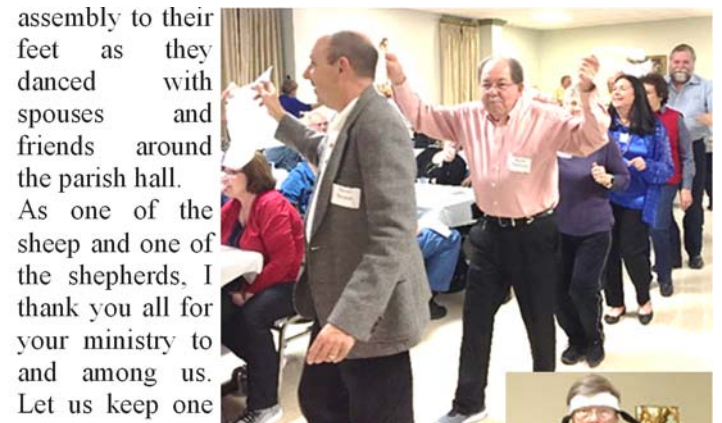

What is the RCIA Rite of Election? This Rite marks a key moment. The catechumens travel to St. Joseph Cathedral where the community with godparents representing the parish, will wholeheartedly acclaim the participants’ readiness. It is appropriate for the bishop to recognize them because he is the sign of unity of the particular Church, and it is the parish community’s responsibility to bring those in RCIA into the fullness of the life of the Church. The godparents’ role is very significant; they represent the community and are asked during this Rite to make serious statements about the catechumens. The decision of an RCIA participant to go through this Rite means that the judgment and decision-making about whether to enter the Catholic Church has ended. From this point forward, they are no longer catechumens but are called the “Elect.” They have been chosen to enter into the final period of preparation for initiation, and called by the bishop, their shepherd, to the holy mysteries to be celebrated at Easter.

This year from our parish, 108 catechumens, candidates, and their godparents and sponsors will attend the Rite of Election and Rite of the Call to Continuing Conversion at the Cathedral. For more information, contact Tammy Jackson at 225.665.9631 or tjackson@icc-msh.org.

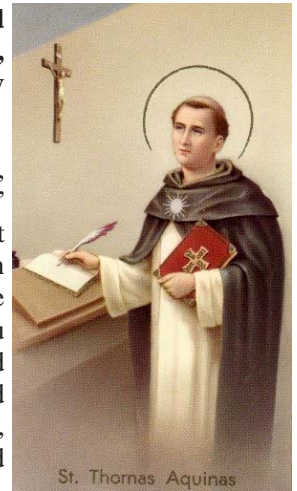

We have been taught that God can do anything. If that is true, can God create a stone too heavy for Him to lift?

To answer this questions properly, we must define what "anything" means. Does it mean "anything that you say?" or does it mean "anything that is possible?" If we say that it means "anything that you can say" that could defy logic and just does not make sense. God cannot make a four-sided triangle, or a square circle or a two-horned unicorn—there are no such things.



What we should say is that God can do "anything that is possible." St. Thomas Aquinas in *The Summa Theologica* states, "Everything that does not imply a contradiction of terms is numbered amongst those possible things, in respect of which God is called omnipotent [all-powerful]." In other words, God can do what is possible, not what is impossible.

By virtue of His unlimited power, God can lift anything. There is no limit to what He can lift. But, a stone too heavy for God to lift would have to have more than an infinite weight, but that is impossible. Nothing can have more than an infinite or unlimited weight. A stone too heavy for God to lift; therefore, cannot and will not ever exist.
