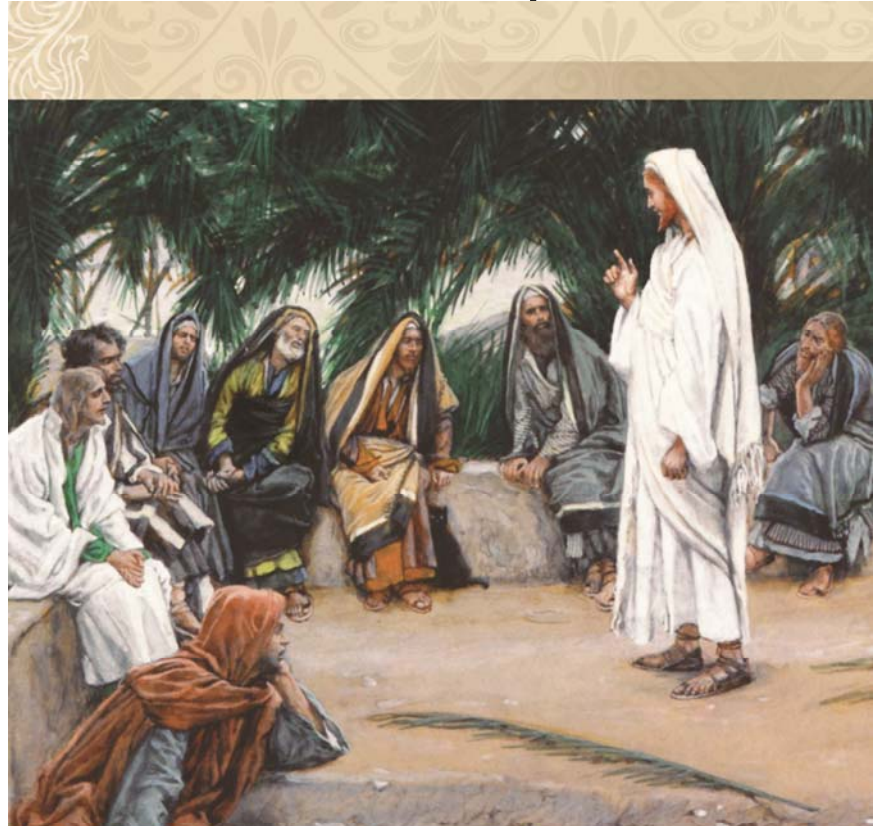

## Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Blessed

**This Sunday**, as we gather to celebrate the Sunday Eucharist, the Lord preaches the Beatitudes, the “official” introduction and beginning of his public ministry. He had already begun to make himself known, revealed to the Wise Men as King of the Jews, revealed in the Jordan as God’s beloved Son as he was baptized, and revealed at the wedding in Cana as he turned water into wine. He had already called Peter and some of the first disciples to follow him, but now he was ready to officially begin. As with all “official beginnings,” there was an introduction, a preamble to all that would follow, and this is what he does this Sunday. In Luke’s Gospel it is called the “Sermon on the Plain.” In Matthew’s Gospel which we are more familiar with because the way it is worded enjoys more popularity, it is called the “Sermon on the Mount.” Matthew says that Jesus went up on a mountain, people gathered around him and he began to preach his sermon. Luke has Jesus coming down the mountain where he had spent some time in prayer and once down, addressing the crowds in a level place, the plain. We see these differences throughout their two Gospels. Matthew and Luke use mountain top experience in different ways. For Matthew, the mountain was a place of revelation as it was in the Old Testament with Moses. He speaks of the Sermon on the Mount, the Mount of Transfiguration, the Mount of Olives. For Luke the mountain is primarily a place of prayer and retreat where Jesus goes to spend personal time with the Father.

**A few weeks ago I read something that gave me occasion to reflect upon and give thanks for the many Scripture Study groups we have in the parish.** It read, “The Bible has been compared to a pool shallow enough and safe enough for a child to swim in, but deep enough and dangerous enough for an elephant to drown in.” It’s true. Some parts of the Bible can be grasped by children, but the same parts can be so profound that scholars spend entire lifetimes trying to understand the depths of its insights and meanings. When all is said and done, all of us are lifetime learners when it comes to the Bible. This is one reason why it is good to see so many Bible Study Groups in the parish. They are listed occasionally in the bulletin and are always happy to welcome new members to join them.

**Next month we will be renewing our Stewardship of Ministry (Time and Talents), and I’d like to call your attention to a wonderful article with photographs concerning our Bereavement Ministry in the *Country Roads Magazine*.** The three page article was written by Christie Matherne Hall and shows photographs by Andrea Matherne of some of the food prepared for a funeral that was celebrated a few weeks ago. The *Country Roads* magazine is available free of charge at many public places by the

doorways – Whole Foods, Frank’s on the Airline, the Livingston and Watson libraries, and James Drug Store here in Denham Springs along with many other sites. The article relates a brief history of this ministry in the parish, how it works, and how it is appreciated. This is one of the parish ministries that we would appreciate more volunteers. You may wish to read the article and keep it in mind when we renew our Commitment to Ministry next month.

**This Sunday afternoon Terry Badeaux will begin discussion sessions for those older youth and adults who have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation** and would like to be confirmed during this coming Easter Season. These sessions are from 1:00 till 3:00 in Room Two of the Administration Building and prepare those who would like to receive Confirmation during the Easter Season. Most of those attending these sessions through the years have been baptized, made their First Eucharist, but for one reason or another were never confirmed. They are informal sessions in which participants sit around the big conference table in the meeting room. There will be four of these Sunday meetings, plus two others during Lent on Thursday evenings as we near Easter. **For more information, Terry can be contacted at 933-4925.**

What is the RCIA Rite of the Call to Continuing Conversion? For those already baptized (candidates), the reality of being chosen and claimed by Christ took place at their baptism; they are already among the elect in Christ. They are “called to continuing conversion,” and thus their intention to be fully initiated and share in the Eucharist is recognized. With their sponsors standing in support of them, the candidates are addressed by the bishop to hear the Lord’s call to conversion, and together with the Elect are moved into a period of intense spiritual preparation.

This year from our parish, we are 108 catechumens, candidates, godparents, and sponsors attend the Rite of Election and Rite of the Call to Continuing Conversion at the Cathedral.

**A Time to Love Yourself**

February is National Heart Month. Heart disease is the #1 killer of both men and women. That fact should be enough for us to be aware of what we need to do to have a healthy heart. There are many parts of heart health but today I am going to focus on the symptoms of a heart attack—Men vs. Women.

| Symptom                            | Men                         | Women                        |
|------------------------------------|-----------------------------|------------------------------|
| Pain, Shortness of breath, fatigue | Yes                         | Yes                          |
| Right-side chest discomfort        | 5 times more likely to have | Less often than men          |
| Throat discomfort                  | Less often than women       | 12 times more likely to have |
| Discomfort (overall)               | 3 times more likely         | Less often than men          |
| Dull ache                          | 4 times more likely         | Less often than men          |
| Pressing on chest                  | Less often than women       | 7 times more likely to have  |
| Vomiting                           | Less often than women       | 4 time more likely to have   |
| Indigestion                        | 4 times more likely         | Less often than men          |
| Time waited to get help            | 3 hours on average          | 5 hours on average           |

Remember that the pain associated with a heart attack can be crushing, squeezing, or burning, pressure, or fullness in the center of the chest. The pain can radiate to the neck, one or both arms, the shoulders, or the jaw. Other symptoms are dizziness, sweating, cold and clammy skin, or a gray pallor. The important thing to remember is that a heart attack does not affect everyone the same. Being familiar with the signs and symptoms are important.

**Another very important thing to remember is that calling 9-1-1 immediately saves lives. Do not drive self or have someone else drive you.** Calling for trained help is the best way to keep someone alive. Minutes count. It is vital to get help at the first symptom of a heart attack even if the patient is not sure he is having one. Minutes = Life.

While you are paying attention to your health, don’t forget your spiritual heart. Make sure to keep it healthy by gaining knowledge (attending Mass, Bible studies, etc.), filtering out dirt (gossip and negativity), and keeping the blood flowing (prayer, trusting God). After all, good health is physical, mental and spiritual.

Should I bring my small children to sit in the pews with me during Mass? They might cry and disrupt the congregation.

It is appropriate, in fact, you are encouraged to bring your child into the Church during Mass regardless of their age. This will help form your child's faith and help them to be able to fully participate in the Eucharistic celebration. They are the Church as much as the rest of us; we are all one body.

Here are some tips:

- Feed your child a good breakfast before Mass, high in protein and low in sugar.
- For toddlers, change their diaper before leaving for Mass.
- Pack a "Church" bag. Include a religious themed book, colors and a coloring book and diapers, if needed.
- Arrive early to get your child settled in the pew.
- Sit in one of the first pews so that they can see what is going on. This will help them understand what is happening.
- If the child gets fidgety, hold them until they quiet down. Bring them to the cry room only in case of meltdowns or emergencies. Don't put them down and let them play. They might realize that they can play, if they are disruptive.
- If your child cries during Mass, that's OK. When I lived in Houma, my wife and I went to a small church down the bayou. During Father's homily one Sunday, there were several babies crying. He stopped his homily one Sunday and said, "Don't worry about the babies crying. They are just saying their prayers!"
- If your child has been good, praise them after Mass.
- Set a positive example.
- Be patient!

Many parishioners love to see small children at Mass. Don't be surprised if some thank you for bringing them to Mass. One of your jobs is to pass the faith on to your child. You might feel that you are not getting much out of Mass with your child, but do the best you can and let God do the rest.
