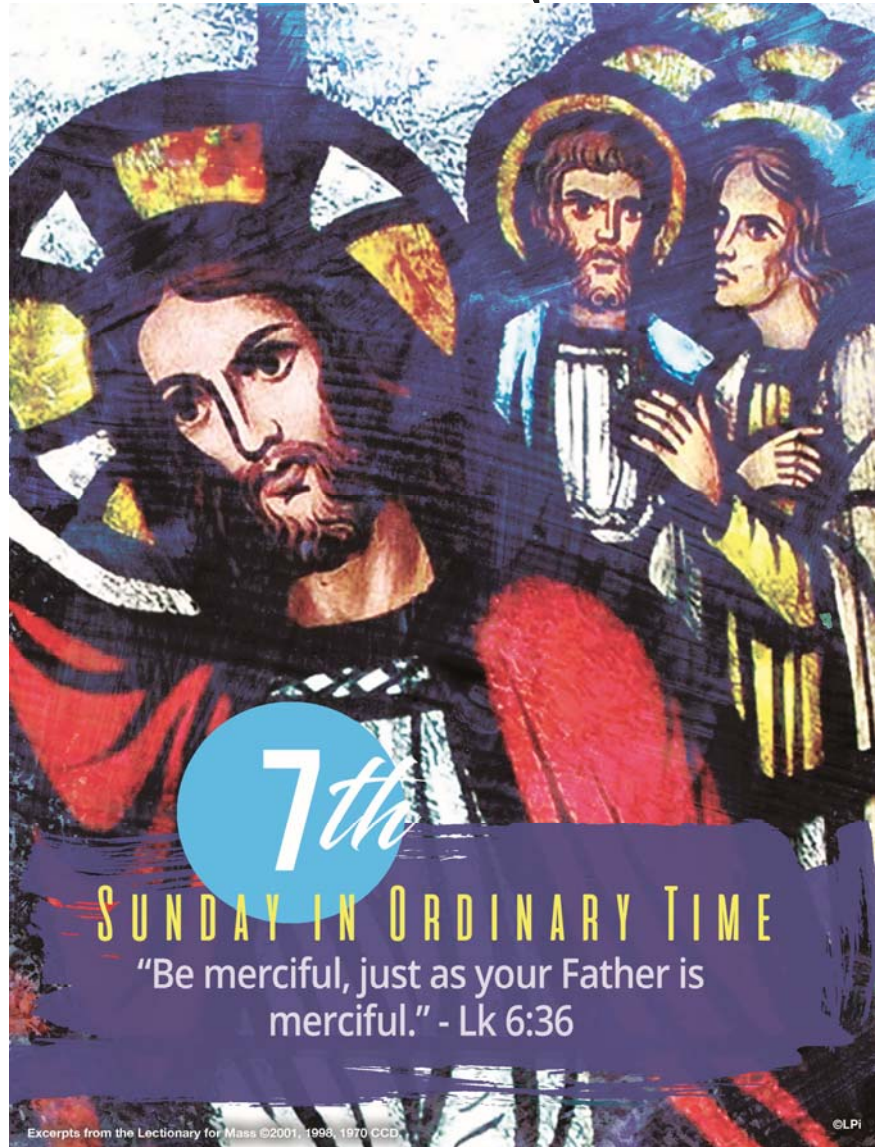

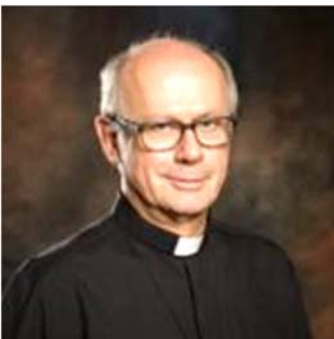
Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Preparations

**In the Gospel this Sunday** Jesus reminds us that we are called to see one another as God sees us and to return good to those who mistreat us. Because we are human, we might not live out that call consistently, but by staying close to Jesus in prayer, we can allow him to transform us into his image. As Lent approaches, we can take advantage of this season of grace and spend more time with the Lord and serving others, allowing him to transform us more and more into his image.

**HABITS ARE NOT CREATED IN ONE DAY OR OVERNIGHT. IT TAKES TIME, AS IN THE SEASON OF LENT.** One Lenten practice we encouraged all to make a couple of years ago and which we feel would be a good blessing to renew again this year is “As a special Lenten observance, if you are in the habit of leaving Mass early, try this year to remain in church until Mass is over. If, during the Lenten season, we develop this good habit of staying until after the Final Blessing, come Easter, this will be a special blessing for all.”

**Over the weekend or this Monday you will be receiving our Lenten mailings.** We are sending them to you now so that you might receive them this week and begin to prepare for the Lenten Season which begins March 6. When we prepare for a trip or journey, we usually make all sorts of advance preparations – we look for hotels, perhaps look into airline flights, plan where we like to be on this day and the next, what we might like to see. The success of our Lenten journey will also depend a lot on our preparations for it.

**One thing that we will be speaking of in March but didn't mention in our Lenten mailings is our parish mission.** As you probably know, in 2019, we celebrate the Centennial of the Oblates accepting pastoral responsibility for all of Livingston Parish. With this in mind, we have invited Father Frank Santucci, an Oblate from San Antonio, to preach our parish mission. He comes highly recommended to us as someone who is a “fabulous presenter and preacher who has an excellent background in spirituality and pastoral ministry.” We have asked him to present a mission that would apply the spirituality of St. Eugene de Mazenod, founder of the



Oblates, to our lives here in the parish. The mission will be preached Monday – Wednesday, April 1-3. In preparation for the mission, he will preach at all Sunday Liturgies

March 30-31. To take it one step further, we invited Bishop Duca to join us on the 31<sup>st</sup> to preside over the 11:00 Eucharist, and then we will celebrate the Grill Is On for You through the afternoon. **I hope you will be able to join us Sunday, March 31 for the 11:00 Eucharist, the Grill Is On for You, and then for the Mission which follows Monday-Wednesday.**

**We begin March this Friday with a day which is close to my heart.** I was ordained 50 years ago on Saturday, March 1 by Bishop Tracy in St. Joseph Cathedral. My classmates, Fr. Gerald Burns and Fr. Donald Blanchard celebrated their 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary last Sunday and this Sunday, and I was sort of thinking about celebrating it this Friday evening, but I was

asked by a young bride, a good friend whom I baptized and whose parents I had the joy of celebrating the beginning of their marriage, if I would celebrate her and her fiancée's marriage on March 1. There is no way I would have said no. They are a wonderful couple and I'm looking forward to sharing our anniversaries with



them in years to come. After speaking with Deacon Rudy, I began looking for a date to celebrate my anniversary, and decided on May 31. It was on May 31, I was first assigned to priestly ministry by Bishop Tracy. The more I've thought about it, the more I like it. Couples celebrating 50<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversaries don't so much celebrate the anniversary of their wedding as 50 years of marriage so why not simply celebrate 50 years of shared ministry. Anyhow, it all began on March 1 at St. Joseph Cathedral, fifty years ago this Friday.

What is the RCIA Rite of the Call to Continuing Conversion? For those already baptized (candidates), the reality of being chosen and claimed by Christ took place at their baptism; they are already among the elect in Christ. They are “called to continuing conversion,” and thus their intention to be fully initiated and share in the Eucharist is recognized. With their sponsors standing in support of them, the candidates are addressed by the bishop to hear the Lord’s call to conversion and together with the Elect are moved into a period of intense spiritual preparation.

This year from our parish, we are 108 catechumens, candidates, godparents, and sponsors attending the Rite of Election and Rite of the Call to Continuing Conversion at the Cathedral.

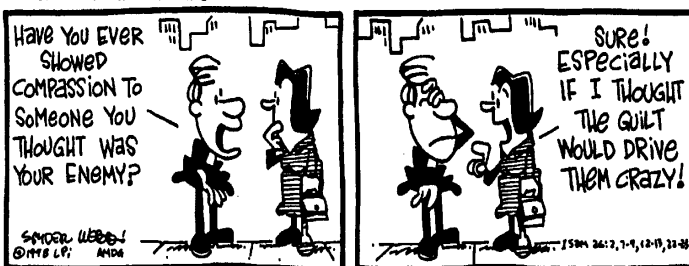

Prayer is not about giving God a lot of information to change His mind. He already knows everything. He knows what will happen tomorrow. He knows what we need.

Just like any parent who wants to have a relationship with his children, God wants us to have a relationship with Him. Prayer can deepen that relationship. Prayer should not be a one-way conversation where we tell God what we want. It should be a two-way conversation where we talk to God and listen for His answer. Prayer should help our relationship with God grow and intensify. It shows that we think about Him, that we care about pleasing Him, and that we love Him.

God wants to hear from us. By praying, we are opening ourselves to God. We are acknowledging that He is in control. He is bigger than we are. Prayer shows that we are dependent on God and will accept His will.

And, prayer works

- It worked for Moses when he asked God to provide food and water to the Israelites in the desert.
- It worked for Zechariah and his wife Elizabeth, who prayed for a child. Their prayers were answered when John the Baptist was born even though she was past the child-bearing age.
- It worked for many people in the gospels, who approached Jesus for healing. Not only were they healed, but, in many cases, their sins were forgiven.

Prayer does not change God's mind. But, we must also realize that God's time is different than ours. God may have already granted our request in advance because he knew that our prayers were forthcoming, asking for certain things.
