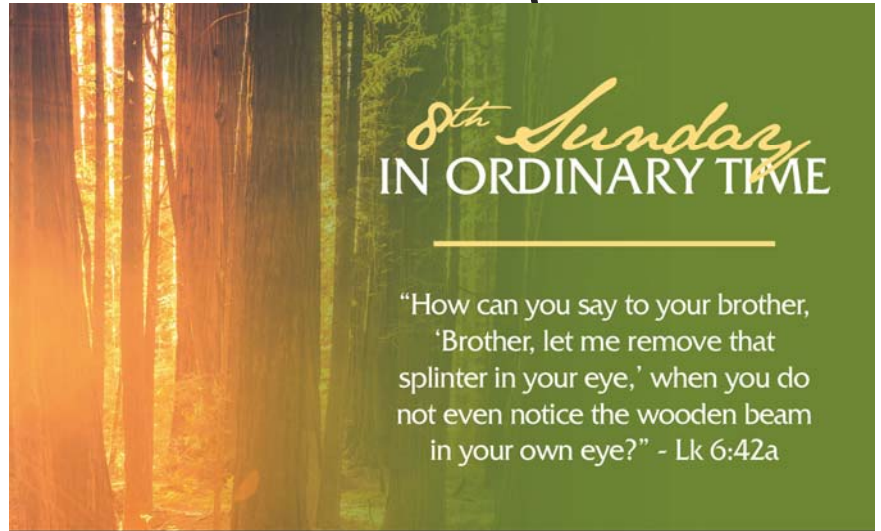

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Preparations

This Sunday as we celebrate the last weekend before the beginning of Lent, the Scriptures offer us a good suggestion as to how we might focus during this Lenten Season. A focus can bring many things together under one plan, one goal. In the Gospel today, Jesus tells his first disciples that they must accept the Kingdom of God as a child. Could he perhaps be telling us that we should enter into and observe the coming Lenten season as a child?

The famous Christian writer, C.S. Lewis once wrote that God wants us to have a child's heart but a grown-up's head. **Accepting** the Kingdom of God as a child and **learning** about the Kingdom of God as an adult could be a good combination and a nice pattern for this Lenten Season.

ACCEPTING: Why might the Lord want us to be childlike? We can think of a young child interacting with a parent. The parents are everything to that child. They provide food and clothing, bandages for scraped knees, and goodnight kisses. Children instinctively trust their parents, love their parents, and rely completely on them. They are simple – generally living in the moment. Mama and Daddy are a main focus of their world. They are affectionate toward the parents they know love and care for them.

LEARNING: Children are also eager to learn and strive to please their parents more and more (at least most of the time.) This is how the child and adult in each of us come together. The author of our first reading today marvels at God's tender care in creating humankind. Our bodies are very complex; our minds and our souls were created to interact with each other to help us know and love God.

As we prepare to enter Lent, there are many Lenten possibilities before us, but it might be good these last days before Lent begins to pray that we might enter and continue through the Lenten Season with a child's heart, trusting and hoping in our loving Father. We pray that we might be able also to contemplate and reflect on the marvels of God with an adult mind and will, bringing it all together. The Eucharistic Table is a good place to begin living this combination as we approach to receive the Body and Blood of Christ with childlike simplicity, knowing as adults that we are receiving the Son of God, the eternal Word.

As we prepare to begin Lent, I thought it might be good to refresh your memories with the Lenten Fasting regulations. It is good for each of us to enter the Lenten Season as individuals ready for a good and graced journey. It is also really good to know we are not journeying alone but rather together as the Body of Christ. Thus, one thing we

all share is a commitment to fasting and abstinence during the Lenten Season. The **rules for fasting and abstinence** in the United States are: Every person 18 years or older must abstain from meat (and items made with meat) on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of **Lent**. Every person between the age of 18 and 59 (beginning of 60th year) must **fast** (have only one main meal and do not eat between meals) on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. It is something we can all do together as a Church, and as a parish, which is really good.

Next Sunday, we will begin to revisit our Stewardship of Ministry (Time and Talent), and prepare to recommit ourselves for the coming year. There is a new ministry which will be on the commitment sheets for you to consider – **RECEPTION COMMITTEE**. This would be a group of men and women who like to decorate, set up, serve and then clean up after various receptions of the parish. They are called upon periodically for functions like the Parish Mission, First Eucharist and Confirmation receptions, the reception for newly received parishioners after the Easter Vigil, etc. We have many receptions in the parish, some are annual and some commemorate special occasions or persons, and to have such a committee is a valuable resource to the parish family. Not everyone on the committee has to be able to do everything from A-Z but together could provide a really good ministry to the parish and those we serve.

Last week under the watchful eye of Beverly Jackson, volunteers were putting together the Lenten mailings to parishioners which you hopefully have



received by now. In these last days before the beginning of Lent, we encourage you to prayerfully plan how this can be a good and graced time for you and others. There are some things that are not accomplished overnight but take time, prayer and patience – a SEASON. As we approach Ash Wednesday, let us pray for one another that it be a good and graced time for all. Love,

Wasn't Peter too flawed to be an infallible Pope?

Yes, St. Peter was flawed: when Jesus said He had to die on the cross, Peter scolded Him; during Christ's Passion, Peter denied Jesus three times; he certainly was flawed, just like all of us. No human other than Jesus and Mary is, or was, perfect, but Jesus selected Peter to lead His Church when He said "You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build My Church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it." (Matthew 16:18) Jesus knew that Peter would deny Him, but He selected him anyway. He knew that Peter could be solid as a rock, stand firm under pressure, and be a trustworthy brother to his fellow disciples. If Christ wanted His Church to last forever, it follows that the Church must be protected from teaching errors regarding faith and morals. If the Church would ever teach heresy, it would cease to exist because it would cease to be Jesus' Church. To protect the Church from teaching heresy, Jesus granted infallibility to the pope, as well as to the body of bishops, when they proclaim a doctrine of faith and morals to be infallible. This is what the Pope's infallibility is all about: teachings related to faith and morals, not being a perfect individual, never sinning. God has always guided His Church to keep it free from moral errors, but in 1870, it defined when the Pope can declare something infallible. The Pope cannot speak infallibility unless he intends to. And, he must speak in a deliberate, formal, and official way intending that the faith and moral issue must be accepted by all Catholics as official Church teaching. When he does this, he is being guided by the Holy Spirit. Only two papal pronouncements fit that criteria:

- The Blessed Virgin's Immaculate Conception—the teaching that when Mary was conceived in her mother's womb she was free from original sin.
- The Assumption of Mary—the teaching that Mary was assumed into heaven body and soul.

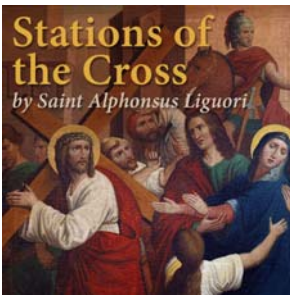
