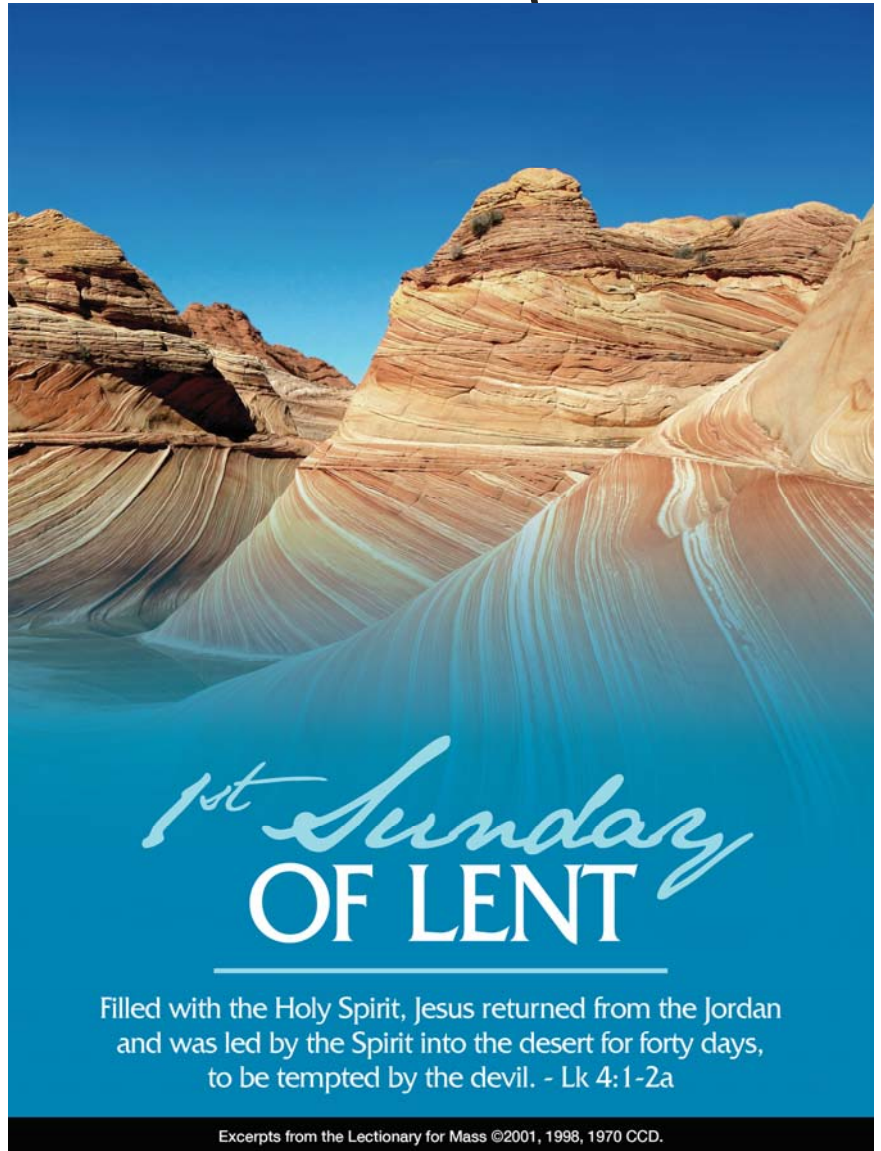

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: A Lenten Journey

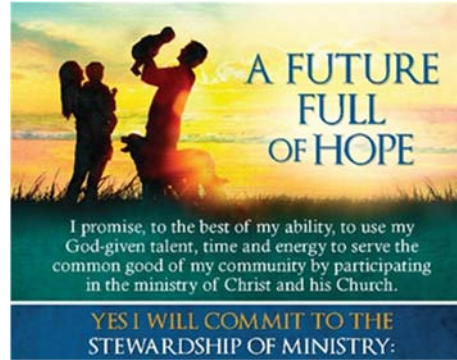
This Sunday as we celebrate the First Sunday of Lent, we take time with the Lord to reflect upon our Commitment to Ministry. The Lord went into the desert for forty days to reflect upon his commitment to minister the Father's Unconditional Love – how could he best do it. His human nature allowed him to be tempted, but the Father's love and his love for the Father prevailed.

In the Scriptures, some numbers seem more important than others. One number which shows up in our Scriptures today is the number 40. I once read that the number 40 appears 146 times in Scripture, far too many to list here, but these are just a few of the more familiar times:

- + 40 days of rain during the flood at the time of Noah;
- + 40 years Moses spent in Egypt as shepherd and leader;
- + 40 days Moses spent on Mt. Sinai receiving the commandments;
- + 40 years of wandering in the desert when Israel was disobedient;
- + 40 days Elijah spent in the cave awaiting the word of God;
- + 40 days Jonah spent preaching in Nineveh;
- + 40 days spent by Jesus in the wilderness after his Baptism;
- + 40 days Jesus appeared to his disciples between his Resurrection and Ascension.

So the number 40 appears frequently in the Scriptures, especially related to time of testing and preparation for great turning points. In the Gospel today, the 40 days Jesus was in the desert being tempted is more than a simple marking of how many days he was there. It links his experience to that of Moses, Elijah, the prophets, and the people of Israel during the Exodus. Those 40 days of testing were also days of preparation, getting him ready for all he was going to reveal. After the 40 days or years of Noah and Moses and the Israelites, **there was always a great, new beginning**, so would it be for Jesus, and through Jesus for us. One thing stands out – **AFTER THIS TIME OF TESTING, THE PERSONS BEING TESTED SEEM TO BE STRONGER THAN EVER, AND READY TO BE OF SERVICE TO GOD, ANNOUNCING THE BEGINNING OF A NEW DAY FILLED WITH GOD'S LOVE.** I think it is good as we begin Lent to remember all those who have gone through 40 days such as we are beginning. Let us, in faith, prepare for what God may wish to be doing with us, for us and through us for his beloved world. In a lot of ways this ties in with Stewardship of Ministry below.

This Sunday we traditionally begin to reconsider our commitment to Stewardship of Ministry, Stewardship of Time and Talent. If we really wanted to be dramatic, in



light of what has just been written, we might want to spend 40 days considering that commitment, emerging from Lent into a new commitment of time and talent. But I think that would probably get old fast, and you would

be ready to chase me out before Lent was over. 😊 **Instead, we have traditionally presented the invitation on the First Sunday of Lent, asking you to prayerfully consider your (re) commitments this First Week of Lent and then return your commitment cards next Sunday in the Commitment Procession.** Next Sunday, when we return them, we will hear the Gospel of the Transfiguration. **Isn't this what our commitments are intended to do? –Transfigure our lives, the lives of others, our world?**

As we celebrate the beginning of Lent, I would like to share with you another new beginning with a ministry that is associated with Lent, our R.C.I.A. Our candidates and catechumens will be received by the Bishop this Sunday afternoon in the Rites of Election at the Cathedral at 4:30. I plan to be there with them, and every family in the parish has received the names of one of our candidates or catechumens, those who are preparing to enter into Full Communion with “the living Church,” the Body of Christ, at Easter. Let us keep them all, but especially those whose names we may have received, in our prayers as we continue through lent.

You have also received the name of a parishioner or family in your packets. Keeping them in prayer is a good reminder that we are not in this alone. I have always enjoyed as we celebrate Easter, sending a card of good wishes to those whose name I received as we began Lent. Both of the cards I received are on the mirror of my bathroom in the rectory.

As we began the Lenten Season and were signed with ashes, The cross is the greatest expression of self-giving love we have ever had the grace to see. Of course while we all try to make crosses on the foreheads of those who come to us, the ashes don't always cooperate, but we know, and God also knows, what is in our hearts. Let us keep one another in prayer as we begin together this Lenten Season.

During times of illness and hardships we sometimes struggle to see God. Words like “why” or “what have I done” float through our minds. I would like to briefly share my story with you about my illness and where I saw God in it. On November 7, 2018, I came to work but was not feeling well and went to the doctor’s office thinking I would be back for lunch. I did not come back to work until January 29, 2019! I was hospitalized immediately for a heart catheterization which thankfully was for the most part normal. After that procedure I felt even worse—tired, nauseated, dizzy, low blood pressure—unfortunately nothing specific. I tried to work but just could not. That started my almost three months of sitting in the blue recliner at my house. Where was God? Thanksgiving week my daughter was let go from her job due to health issues she was experiencing. I sat in my chair and she laid on the couch. It seemed that as I sat in the chair, my mind just shut down. Abby would ask about Christmas shopping and activities. I was too tired to think about it. She stepped up and started ordering gifts and making plans. I sat in the chair, went to the doctor’s office every one-two weeks because I did not feel well, extended my medical leave and not doing anything—and definitely not getting well. Nobody seemed to have any idea what was going on with me. Where was God? The week before Christmas, I started having different symptoms. I fell asleep while talking, my speech did not make any sense most of the time which led me to be admitted to the hospital on December 20th. My electrolytes were out of balance and my calcium level was 20! (High limit is 10.) The doctor’s had never seen a calcium that high before. At least now the doctors knew what was wrong—I had a tumor on one of my parathyroid glands. We have four parathyroid glands that are located on our thyroid gland. On Christmas Eve I had a huge benign tumor removed. It took a while for my mind to clear. For example I was sure that I saw Father Cleo on TV with the Van Trapp Family Singers, but my physical symptoms improved immediately. It took about 4 weeks for me to recover due to the high calcium levels and the largeness of my tumor. So where was God? Always with me. If Abby had not been with me the week before Christmas, I could have died. Because she was with me all day every day, she noticed the change in my symptoms. He was with Abby as she stepped up and did all the Christmas shopping, wrapping and some cooking. This gave her a focus and improved her health. He was with my husband and my sister-in-law that stayed with me in the hospital and kept things straight when I had NO idea what was going on. He was with the doctors (and I had a lot of doctors) and nurses that cared for me. He was in the prayers and good wishes of friends and family. The doctors were sure my tumor was cancerous but it was not. God was there. It is so much easier to see God in the good times, but it is in the hard times that we may have to look harder to find Him. He promises in Hebrews 13:5, “I will never forsake you or abandon you.” I am not going to let the last three months go to waste. I am going to try harder to look for God everywhere.
