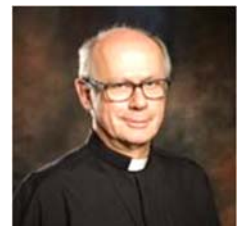

## Consideration of Our Christian Commitment: The Journey Continues

**This Sunday as we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Lent, we are happy to welcome among us both Bishop Michael Duca and Fr. Frank Santucci, O.M.I.** as we celebrate the centennial of the coming of the Oblates to Livingston Parish.

We already have a memorial on the grounds to the Oblates, not some big granite memorial but rather an old, rusty gate which prior to 1964, stood near Hatchell



Lane when our church campus was nothing but pasture and woods. Richard Young saved the gate when the property was developed, placing it in his barn, and years later pulled it out and in 2011 gave the gate to us when we celebrated the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of our parish. A few years later, Bishop Muench walked through it when we dedicated the Faith Formation Center. In 2015 the gate was placed permanently on the property as a memorial to the Oblates who served here throughout Livingston Parish from 1919 until 1983.

Two bronze plaques were made for the posts which hold up the gate. The one on the left has a brief history of the gate and dedication to the Oblates, and the one on the right has our Mission Statement which begins with our being a welcoming community.

**Plaque One reads:**

“The Missionaries of Mary Immaculate were founded in Aix-en-Provence by St. Eugène de Mazenod on January 25, 1816. Their mission as stated in their coat of arms is to minister to the “poor in our midst.” They ministered to youth, those in prison, and in those areas of the world most in need of their presence. They accepted ministry to the entire Livingston Parish on May 12, 1919, which at the time numbered very few Catholic families. Over the years, thanks to their dedicated ministry, Immaculate Conception Mission continued to grow, becoming a church parish in 1960. In 1964, this property was purchased and Immaculate Conception Church Parish continued to grow. In 1983, the Oblates felt the parish had grown strong, and faithful to their



mission, decided to relinquish their ministry here and direct their efforts in parts of the world where they were more needed. This gate was at the entrance to this property which in 1964 was a combination of pasture and wooded acreage. We dedicate this gate as a memorial to the Oblate Missionaries of Mary Immaculate who opened the gates of faith, hope and love – the gates of life – to our church parish and those whom we serve.”

**Plaque Two reads:**

“OPEN WIDE THE GATES OF MERCY

These gates were dedicated by the parishioners of Immaculate Conception Parish

In honor of the Oblate Missionaries of Mary Immaculate

On December 8, 2015, the beginning of the

HOLY YEAR OF MERCY,

Proclaimed by Pope Francis.

We pray that the Year of Mercy may always be expressed in our Parish Mission Statement:

Immaculate Conception Church Parish and the Mission of the Sacred Heart is a welcoming community, centered in the Eucharist, rooted in faith, growing in fellowship, and sharing in unity the mission of Christ entrusted to us.”

I hope you have plans to join us today for **The Grill Is On for You**, and that perhaps you will have time to go to the gate and read the plaques if you haven’t had a chance to do so already. It will be a good opportunity to read the plaques which have the seal of the Oblates on it.

**On Thursday, May 9, at 6:30 p.m. there will be an information meeting for all those who will be going on the Pilgrimage to France June 12-22.** All questions will be answered and information be given out at this meeting.

Some who may have never traveled overseas may have questions that they would like answered sooner than May 9. Feel free to call me if you wish. I cannot answer all questions, and they may have better answers, but will try to set you at ease.

**Thank you for your participation in the Woman’s New Life Center’s Baby Bottle Campaign. We raised \$6,529.15 here in the parish.** These donations are already at work saving and changing lives, and providing life-affirming services to the women who come to them. Thank you for ministering to them.

**Fr. Frank Santucci will introduce himself at all Liturgies this weekend.** I hope you will be able to join us for the Mission he will prayerfully preach this Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday at 7:00 p.m. Let us pray for the success of our parish mission and keep one another in prayer. Love,

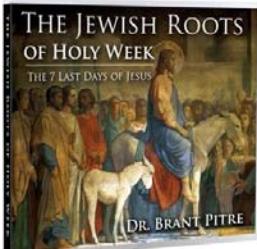

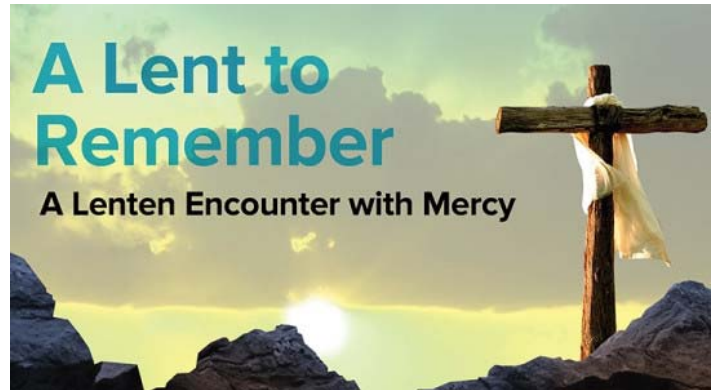

Stump the Deacon!

**If my spouse and I have been married outside of the Church, how can we get our marriage “blessed”?**

The first step would be to meet with a priest or a deacon to discuss your situation. If either you or your spouse were married before your current marriage, an annulment or a declaration of nullity must be sought for each marriage because the Church assumes all marriages to be valid, until proven otherwise.

Assuming no previous marriages (or all have been granted an annulment or a declaration of nullity), there are actually two ways to get your marriage recognized by the Church.

- Depending on the history and current state of your civil marriage, the priest or deacon may be able to write a letter to the Bishop requesting that your civil marriage be acknowledged by the Church.
- A convalidation ceremony can be celebrated, where new acts of consent (new marriage vows) are exchanged. This would be required if there was a problem with the original vows given during the civil ceremony.

The Church upholds the sanctity of marriage and we would like to help you get your marriage be recognized by the Church. You can contact any priest or deacon either here at Immaculate Conception or any other parish.
