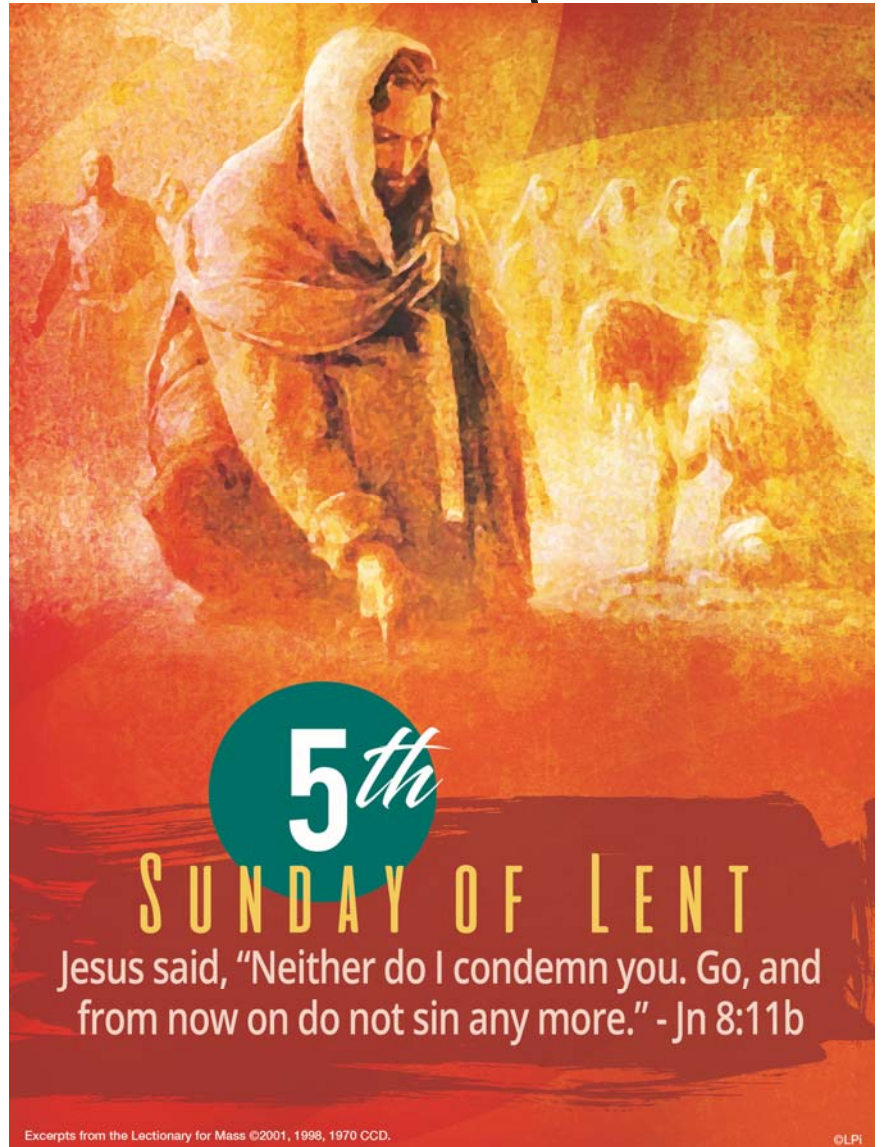

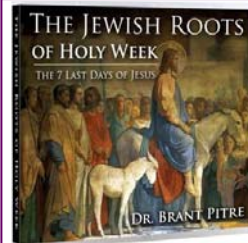

The Jewish Roots of Holy Week
Dr. Brant Pitre
Monday-Tuesday, April 15-16
6:30 p.m. | Small Hall

If you knew you only had one week left to live, how would you spend it? What would you do?

In these riveting presentations, Dr. Brant Pitre takes his knowledge of the Jewish roots of Christianity and uses it to unveil the mysteries of the most sacred and solemn week of the entire year: "Holy Week." In these two presentations, you will discover:

- *Palm Sunday*: Why did Jesus ride into Jerusalem on a donkey?
- *Holy Monday-Tuesday*: Why did Jesus curse the fig tree on Holy Monday?
- *Spy Wednesday*: What is the hidden meaning to Judas' betrayal of Jesus? And why is this day called "Spy Wednesday"?
- *Holy Thursday*: How exactly did the disciples prepare the Passover for Jesus?
- *Good Friday*: What is the meaning of the blood and water that flowed from Jesus' side?
- *Saturday*: Why did Jesus rest in the tomb? Where did Jesus' soul go on Holy Saturday?
- *Sunday*: Why did Jesus rise on the "first day of the week"?

If you're looking to get more out of the season of Lent this year and to truly enter into the mystery of Holy Week with Jesus, this Bible study is for you.

Consideration of Our Christian Commitment: Time of Purification

As we begin this Fifth Week of Lent, we observe the Third Scrutiny for the Elect and Candidates for Full Communion. For them we will proclaim the Gospel from Cycle A, Lazarus being called out of the tomb, and for the rest of the Liturgies, we will be reading the Gospel from Cycle C, the woman caught in adultery. In some ways, the two Gospels come together with the word guilt. Guilt is one of the most common of all human experiences, and often the heaviest burden to carry; we might feel like we are shut up in a tomb. Some perhaps use guilt to come to terms with their life choices and bring about renewal and change. Others may deny its reality even though it may burn like a fire within them. Others may project their guilt on to others, avoiding responsibility and the need to change. Some may even use it to punish themselves and so add to their pain and guilt.

We know nothing about the woman in today's Gospel and her life's circumstances. She is by all appearances guilty and deserving of the punishment laid down by Moses that she be stoned. When understood in strict, legalistic terms, sin is seen as a breaking of rules and regulations, but for Jesus, sin was much more when understood in terms of relationships. It is an alienation from God, from others and from ourselves. Sin's origins lie in prideful hearts so all are in need of God's forgiveness and healing. Jesus ends the passage by offering the woman forgiveness and telling her not to sin any more. In her encounter with Christ, he opened the door to a new way of life, but the decision to walk through that door was her decision and hers alone. Jesus invites but does not coerce; he challenges but does not take away our freedom. For love that is not freely given is not true love, and it is true love that God wishes us to experience and to share with him and with others.

Teachers are needed for next year for the classes which are held at the Mission of the Sacred Heart on Wednesdays. Presently three of the six teachers who are serving there will not be able to return this fall when classes resume, and we were not able to recoup the loss on Stewardship Commitment Sunday. Without teachers committed to ministry at the Mission, they may have to merge with the classes held here at Immaculate Conception. Plans are usually made in the spring and early summer for the coming Parish School of Religion year so it is important to know in the coming weeks if we will be able to staff the classes held at the Mission. Persons wishing more information or wishing to volunteer can contact Amanda Milton or call the parish office at 665-5359, and we will help with contacts.

Temporary, part time, job offers have come our way and we have been asked to publicize it. As you know, we will have the 2020 Federal Census coming up in the coming months. There are several part time jobs available which

have flexible hours, great weekly pay (I believe \$15.50 an hour), and involves different things from checking on addresses to making sure there are still homes there, to helping with information. As you may know, my 50th Ordination Anniversary was March 1, but I will not be celebrating it "officially" until Friday evening, May 31. You will be receiving invitations and information in the coming weeks. One nice thing about the delay is that it is giving me the occasion to "savor the occasion" and give thanks in different ways. One surprise



came a few weeks ago when Sandy LeBlanc's first grade class asked to see me in the hallway outside the offices. What a nice surprise! They had drawn and written thank you and appreciation cards for me (which I am holding in my hand). Little things (and "little people") mean a lot, and these have been good days. Thanks for your prayerful support. This July 1, I will have been pastor here for ten years.

Summer Vacation Bible School will be held June 17-21 here in the parish, and adults and 9th-11th graders are needed to assist with it. The theme this year is *Dive into the Mysteries of the Rosary*. Summer Vacation Bible School was inadvertently omitted from the Stewardship of Ministry brochure so we are asking you to contact Barbara Normand or leave a message at the parish office (665-5359) if you have questions or wish to help. Volunteers are needed to help with Bible stories, songs, skits, arts and crafts and snacks. This is a happy time of coming together for many of our parish youth, and we appreciate your help with it.

As we journey through this Lenten Season, we thank God for all who journey with us. Let us pray for each other.

Stump the Deacon!

Did Jesus have to die on the cross? Couldn't He have saved us another way?

I believe that God could have saved us a different way. He could have simply forgiven our sins without sending His Son to suffer and die for us. He could have snapped His fingers to save us. But, I believe Jesus accepted the cross for several reasons:

- The Jews believed in sacrifice; they embraced sacrifice. It was an important part of their religion. So, Jesus offered His life for us as the ultimate sacrifice.
- The terrible way that He died shows us how much He loves us despite our sins. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* states "God shows His love for us in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" (CCC 604; Rom. 5:8).
- Jesus' death on the cross fulfilled the Old Testament prophecies.
- His death drew on the theme of the Jewish feast of the Passover. The Passover recalls when God led the Jewish nation out of slavery of Egypt. Jesus' death on the cross leads us out of the slavery of sin.

God could have saved us any way that He wanted, but this was the best way.
