Consideration of Our Christian Commitment: Easter



Today we finish a journey that began forty days ago in the desert of temptation and repentance. That journey brought us to the cross and from darkness into light. This will be celebrated for the next fifty days as we journey together as Easter People, not just for the Easter Season however, but for the rest of our lives. In the Gospel at the Easter Vigil, the women coming to the tomb were asked, “Why do you seek the living one among the dead?” No matter how many Easter Sundays we have celebrated, we realize that we live through each Lent and Easter under different circumstances, and are invited as Easter People to see the events we have celebrated as still shaping our lives. In the coming fifty days, we can live afresh and receive anew from the appearances of Jesus, the discoveries of the first disciples, and the mission work of the Apostles. As Jesus appeared to them, let him appear to us, where each of us may find ourselves at this very time. As we begin this Easter Season, it is a good time to resolve not to seek the living one among the dead, but rather to bring His new and risen life into our hearts, minds and lives, and from there, into the hearts, minds, and lives of those around us. He is truly risen. We don’t simply recall something that happened two thousand years ago, but rather that today He lives and is present to us and among us, because He continues to save us His people. Let us be so grateful that we seek to spend our days seeking to respond to so great a gift, so great a presence in our lives and days.

I would like both personally and in the name of all to thank those who, in their own ways, have made this Lenten Journey so special. If we just stop to think of all those who gave of themselves for the good of all, it is hard to imagine so many people. There were all the Liturgical Ministers who helped with our worship in so many ways. There were the musicians, the décor people, those who helped us enjoy fellowship in the hall in so many ways – Friday evening suppers, receptions. There were those who worked with décor in the church, in the halls, and around the campus. We had elderly parishioners and young parishioners all reaching out and giving of themselves for the good of all.

As we began the Easter Season Holy Saturday Evening, we shared the Sacraments of Initiation with new parishioners, sharing Baptism with fifteen adults and youth, sharing Confirmation with eight adult parishioners

welcoming a total of thirty three around the Table of the Lord for the first time.

During the Easter Season there will be many baptisms and in a few weeks, we will welcome another seventy-one young parishioners around the Table of the Lord as they receive the Eucharist for the first time.

Then we will welcome a priest from the Diocese of Gallup who will speak of their work among the Indian Missions and invite us to share in supporting their ministry.

Carol Lapari, who has crafted the windows in the church made us a visit as we prepared to enter Holy Week. We



were requested by parishioners to have windows designed for the Cry Room which could be given in Thanksgiving for their grandchildren. The



window spaces were more narrow than in the main church but we will be pleased to have simple windows that will be appealing to the children and others that use the Cry Room – an outdoor scene with five flowers (one for each grandchild.) In the center is a white lily, representing the innocence of all children. We thank Carol for her wonderful work with us over the years and our parishioners who donated the windows.

As we begin the fifty days of Easter, it is good to remember that our good God gives us more than we could ever dream of giving him. We try to offer forty days of penance, prayer and growth in His love. He gives us fifty days to celebrate the new life given at Easter. Our God is so good and will never be outdone. Let us remember one another in prayer as we journey through the fifty days of Easter. Love,

What do Easter eggs have to do with the Catholic's celebration of Christ's resurrection on Easter Sunday?

I tried to find a good Catholic explanation. The best I could do was from *monasteryicons.com*—"The Story of the First Easter Egg". Here are a few quotes from the article:

"Before the egg became closely entwined with the Christian Easter, it was honored during many rite-of-Spring festivals. The Romans, Gauls, Chinese, Egyptians and Persians all cherished the egg as a symbol of the universe, of the earth's rebirth at springtime. With the advent of Christianity, the symbolism of the egg changed to represent, not nature's rebirth, but the rebirth of man."

"Christians embraced the egg symbol and likened it to the tomb from which Christ rose. Saint Augustine first described Christ's Resurrection from the dead as a chick bursting from an egg."

"According to tradition, Saint Mary Magdalene gained an audience in Rome with the emperor after the Crucifixion and Resurrection of Christ. She denounced Pilate for his handling of Jesus' trial and then began to talk with Caesar about Jesus' resurrection. She picked up a hen's egg from the dinner table to illustrate her point about resurrection. Caesar was unmoved and replied that there was as much chance of a human being returning to life as there was for the egg to turn red. Immediately, the egg miraculously turned red in her hand! It is because of this tradition that Orthodox Christians exchange red eggs at Easter."

"A Polish legend tells of when Mary Magdalene went to the sepulcher to anoint the body of Jesus. She had with her a basket of eggs to serve as a repast. When she arrived at the sepulcher and uncovered the eggs, lo, the pure white shells had miraculously taken on a rainbow of colors."

"One legend concerns the Virgin Mary. It tells of the time the Blessed Virgin gave eggs to the soldiers at the cross. She entreated them to be less cruel and she wept. Her tears fell upon the eggs, spotting them with dots of brilliant color."
