
Alcoholics Anonymous

Letter from Aid to the Church in Need

The following are excerpts from a very poignant letter Sacred Heart has received:

I would like to share with you a meeting we had with a young and courageous priest from Iraq, Fr. Salar Kajo. He described the heartache of returning home to St. George Parish in the Nineveh village of Batnaya after its recapture from ISIS.

"I was the first one to arrive. The ISIS flag was still here. It hurt a lot. I removed it and placed the cross. I stayed for 10-15 minutes and then left because I didn't recognize my Church. Koranic Scriptures were written on the wall and they practiced shooting in the sanctuary. But afterwards, little by little, I realized this was the reality. We have to use it as a starting point to begin again."

Our recent assessment on the ground shows that 363 Church properties and 10,712 homes damaged by ISIS need repair. Aid to the Church in Need and its donors have been a lifeline to refugees and internally displaced persons for more than three years, providing %65 million in aid in the form of food, shelter, medicine and education to over 100,000 Christina families in Erbil, Iraq. But now we have entered a new phase – one of hope – of returning faithful home.

It costs us on average \$2,000 to restore a Christian home. Your gift can go towards making a home livable again, or, if you wish, helping to repair one of many damaged churches. Either way, one hundred percent of every donation will go towards this Nineveh Plains project.

We cannot remain silent and allow the actions of ISIS to purge the Christian faith from this region. By providing for a home or church, you will not only be helping families and faithful but also protecting the sacred presence of Christianity in Iraq and, together, showing the solidarity of the Mystical Body at its best.
