

2019 Pierre Toussaint Scholarship Fund Scholarship Application

The Pierre Toussaint Scholarship Fund (PTSF) and Program is administered by the Archdiocese of New York, Office of Black Ministry. PTSF provides scholarships to graduating high school seniors of diverse backgrounds from public, private and parochial schools throughout the Archdiocese to assist them with the educational fees and expenses associated with their college studies. Students selected into the program are chosen based on their strong academic record, their active participation with their parish and school communities, and their demonstration of good character and sound leadership ability. Scholarship awards are renewable for subsequent, consecutive years of undergraduate and graduate studies, based upon their meeting certain academic and service requirements, and PTSF program requirements. To be eligible for consideration candidates must be an active member of a Roman Catholic Archdiocesan parish, be a graduating high school senior, show high academic achievement and submit the PTSF application form with the required documents. The Trinity Snowman


When you see a snowman

"Remember God is Three in One".


