



I was very impressed with "Beyond Sunday Missions," a great blend of corporal and spiritual works of mercy. Work and prayer, the essence of discipleship – a great sign of hope. The office is now up and running with new carpet and paint. Please come by and visit us. I am very happy to see the number of people coming forward to volunteer, a lot of work is getting done.

We are still in need of some religious education catechists. We are especially looking for people who both practice their faith, and have a desire to share it with the youth. I have a couple people who expressed an interest to help in the office, answering phones and helping people who come to the door, but we could use a couple more. If you have an afternoon a week, or a couple hours a week in the morning free and would like to get involved, please let me know. We had our first Finance Council meeting since I arrived and I am excited to be working with a great group of people who care a great deal about their parish. Upcoming Events

August 14th at 7:00 pm at Our Lady's and August 15th at 9:00 am at Most Blessed Sacrament- Holy Day of Obligation (Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary)

Our Gospel account this week is of the Transfiguration of the Lord where Christ went up the mountain with a few of His disciples and was transformed in the fullness of his divinity before their very eyes. These men who traveled with Jesus had spent years at His side listening to His teachings and proclamations of the coming of the kingdom, but they themselves had never seen Jesus the divine Son of God in all His glory. We can sometimes forget how incredible this event would have been to simple fisherman whom Christ called to give up everything and follow Him. These were not learned or important men, and fear and trepidation would have been the natural response to such a display of power and majesty. Peter, James and John were witnesses to Jesus Christ in His divine nature and they heard the voice of God coming from the clouds and proclaiming that Christ was His Son. This instance of unrestrained power and glory brings to mind the events we hear about in the Old Testament, where God was tangibly present with His people and worked great wonders in their midst. The glory of Jesus Christ before their very eyes caused the Disciples to become afraid and fall down to the ground in worship. Each one of us should strive to find the divine Christ present in our midst each and every day, to seek Him in our daily encounters with people and in the beauty of the sacramental life of the Church. As Christ was transformed in the presence of His Disciples, let us become more like Christ this week in all that we do and shine forth to the world proclaiming the true presence of Jesus Christ in our midst. May God bless you this week!
