Week of March 5, 2017

First Sunday of Lent

An often under-appreciated practice during Lent occurs during each liturgy just before the proclamation of the Gospel—a *certain joyful word* of celebration is omitted throughout the Lenten season in order to help us maintain a sober, penitential spirit as we pray. In its place, we sing or say an assortment of phrases acknowledging Jesus as our triumphant Lord and Savior. (Most common among these are: *Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ, King of endless glory* or *Glory to you, O Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ!*)

The Evangelists *Matthew, Mark, Luke* and *John* provide our scriptural texts describing the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. These are known as the *Good News* or *Gospels*. These texts are the ones generally reserved for a priest or deacon to proclaim. Here at St. George Parish, we see the Book of the Gospels displayed at Sunday liturgies with great reverence. It is when the Gospel Book is opened and the Word is about to be proclaimed for our hearing that the aforementioned *joyful word* of celebration is sung, usually in some repetitive fashion.

One Church tradition refers to our omission of this joyful word during Lent as its *burial*. The word and the great joy it invokes, return (*arise*) to our celebrations when the Resurrection of the Lord himself is celebrated: at the great and saving event of Easter.

LENTEN OBSERVANCES

Abstinence from meat is called for on **Ash Wednesday, Good Friday** and **all the Fridays of Lent** for those who are 14 years and older. Bishop Malone has decreed that you may switch your day of abstinence during the week of St. Patrick's Day this year!

Fasting is called for on only two Lenten days—Ash Wednesday and Good Friday—for those between 18 and 59 years of age. *Catholic fasting* is defined as taking only one full meal during the day. Two smaller meals may be taken if necessary, but snacking between meals is to be given up for the day.


