This visit is part of the Society of the Propagation of Faith Mission Cooperative program that brings missionaries to our Diocese to share their story and our contributions help missionaries around the world, including the OSFSs to continue to share the Good News. With gratitude, we remember the sister who patiently helped us learn our multiplication tables or the brother who coached our high school team, teaching us that faith must be lived out in every aspect of our life. Today, many of these sisters, brothers, and religious order priests are elderly or infirm. Most worked for years for small stipends, leaving their religious communities without adequate savings to meet growing retirement and eldercare needs. Please support this collection with your prayers, and consider

faithfully what gift you can make in thanksgiving for the faithful service of senior religious. May God bless you most abundantly in all your needs and in your faith.
