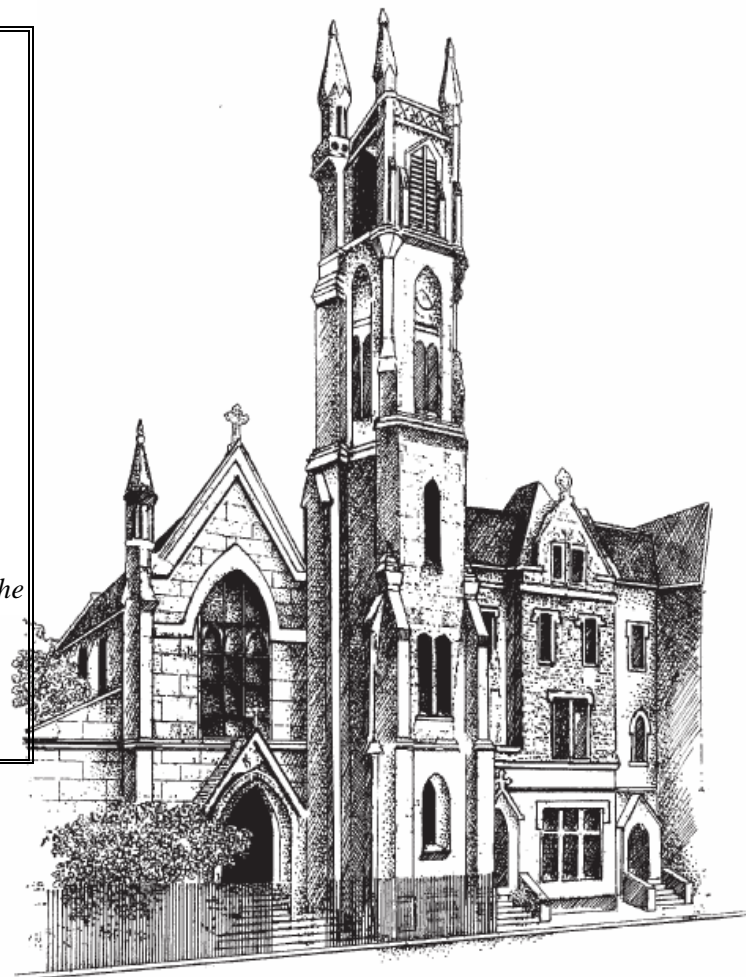

## January 24, 2016

### Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Gospel reading for the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time the opening verses of the Gospel of Luke and the start of Jesus' public ministry.

In the first part of today's Gospel reading, we hear four historical and literary facts about Luke's Gospel. First, Luke tells us that "many" others are also compiling narratives on the life and impact of Jesus. Referring to the Gospel of Mark, and may well be referring to the Gospel of Matthew, earlier versions of the Gospel of John and some non-canonical gospels, such as the gospel of Thomas and the Q sayings document. Second, Luke tells us he still has access to "eye witnesses" and "ministers of the word" in the writing of his Gospel. In other words, Luke belongs to the second generation of believers. Third, Luke has carefully investigated for himself the events associated with Jesus and has attempted to offer a fresh and more accurate and "orderly" perspective. And finally, Luke tells us who his audience is: "most excellent Theophilus" who scholars suspect may be the patron who sponsored Luke in the writing of his Gospel, since writing a Gospel would have been a costly and time-consuming endeavor. In the second half of today's Gospel reading, we hear about the start of Jesus' ministry in Galilee that will lead to his rejection at Nazareth.

### Conversations with "Recycled" Catholics

Many people—Catholics, those of other religions and of no religion—have been struck by the words and actions of Pope Francis. Included among them are former Catholics who have long felt alienated from many of the Church's positions and practices, but now may be considering giving Catholicism a second look. This series of "conversations," not lectures, is designed for such people—not for those who are comfortable in their faith and are looking for spiritual development. In a series of non-judgmental, open yet focused discussions, Fr. Madigan will help participants reflect on their lived experience of Catholicism, its positive and negative aspects, in the hope of discovering possible directions for the future. The general approach could be described as a "therapy of the imagination," an attempt to discover how familiar doctrines, metaphors and images can be mined for new insights and meaning.
