UNDERSTANDING SERVICE

In this weekend's Gospel Jesus is seen welcoming and embracing children, but what is the real message behind this powerful scene? For the second time in in the passage from the Gospel of Mark, Jesus tells His Disciples He must suffer, die and rise. Only this time, the Disciples start arguing among themselves who is the greatest. Despite what Jesus is telling them, they are more concerned about power than discipleship or does discipleship mean power?

Look at the story clearly, "Jesus sits down calls the twelve together." Jesus sits to be at their level, but it was also common for a teacher to sit when he taught with authority. This makes the teaching intimate and profound. This allowed the Disciples to take in what Jesus was about to tell them. It is important to know that in Jesus' time, children, women and servants had no legal rights; they were seen as not important. Jesus turns the standard of greatness upsidedown. Jesus wants the Disciples to see greatness as serving the poor and those who cannot pay back. By placing a little child in the midst of the Disciples and embracing the child, Jesus answers their question about greatness. To be great is to receive and serve those who are defenseless, weak and without worldly status and to show respect for each person's human dignity.

When we look at the life of Jesus, He loved to reach out to the poor, weak and forgotten. By this, he shows us to have respect for every human person.

If "Jesus came to serve and not be served," why is it so hard for us to do the same? This world is already full of people who want to be served and who exploit other human beings in the process. Why do we want more at the cost of others when we already have all that we need? Let us be more like Jesus who was comfortable with walking with all, especially the less fortunate.

Jesus, help us understand servanthood and be good servants.
