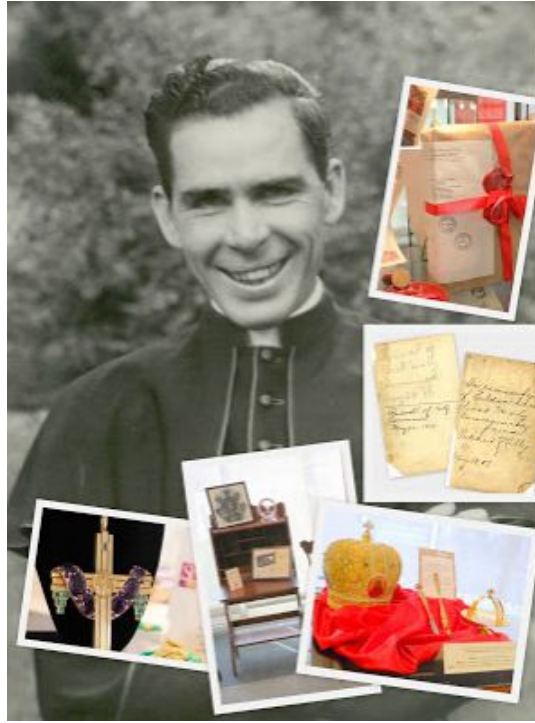

The Cathedral of St. Mary and Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen Museum in
Peoria, IL on Thursday, April 25, 2019



Fulton Sheen was ordained a priest of the Diocese of Peoria, Illinois, in 1919. An outstanding preacher, he is perhaps best remembered for his Emmy award-winning television show, *“Life is Worth Living”*, which ran from 1951 to 1957 (and was #1 in its time slot), and then another show *“The Fulton Sheen Program”*, from 1961 to 1968. The Cathedral of St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception is where young Fulton Sheen learned to serve Mass and was ordained a priest on September 20, 1919. The cathedral was beautifully restored in 2016 and is one block from The Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen Museum. The museum is located in the Spalding Pastoral Center on the same historic campus where he graduated from the Cathedral grade school and Spalding High School. The museum features collections that illustrate the story of Archbishop Sheen's life, work, and the cause for canonization. Exhibits include his writings, books, photos, a selection of authentic items which belonged to Fulton Sheen, such as his vestments and Episcopal regalia.
