Father Jimson and his associate, Father Javier Flores, are doing their best to minister to the Catholics of St. Mary of Mount Virgin Church, St. John's and a mission church, St. Theresa of the Infant Jesus, in Edison. Their particular challenge, besides finances, is the religious education program for the students of both St. Mary's and St. John's. They find it difficult to get enough volunteers for the children of St. John's to teach catechism.

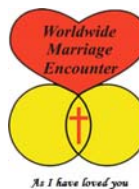

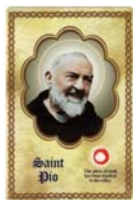
