

REFLECTING ON THE WORD

I've come to know a Dominican Sister of Peace-Sister Nadine—whose ministry is one of mercy in the Hilltop area of Columbus, Ohio. She drives through the streets of this rough neighborhood to serve people who are drug-addicted, especially women whose only source of income is prostitution. She visits her people with the fruit of Mary's womb, Jesus, by being attentive to them and helping them get treatment, food, shelter, and protection from those who harm and abuse them. By sharing the stories of their lives, the people she serves visit us. In people often ignored by society because they are considered unworthy and like Bethlehem of Judah, we see Christ's face, and he comes to us again this Advent. Sister Nadine offers our sisters and brothers an oasis of peace and comfort in a desert of abuse, addiction, rejection, and pain. Their lives challenge us to live the words we sing in our responsorial psalm: "Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved."

The Letter to the Hebrews tells us that by doing God's will, Christ has consecrated us to God, once and for all. Doing God's will mean that we visit our world with the unconditional, merciful love God made visible in Jesus Christ. In these ast two Advent days, invite Jesus to visit you in prayer. Make time to visit him. Let that visit help you discover God's will and open your eyes to see the face of Christ where we might least expect it. Like Sister Nadine, be the face of Christ for those often neglected by us and our world. There was no room for Christ in the inn. Like Mary and Sister Nadine, make room in the inn of your heart and carry him into our world.

Consider:

- Describe some times when Jesus has visited you in ways you did not expect.
- Describe God's will for you this Advent season.



LIVING AND PRAYING WITH THE WORD

Almighty and ever-present God, you visited us by becoming one with us in your Son, Jesus Christ. Help us believe that you love and care for us even when we feel small and unworthy. Fill us with your Spirit and help us to visit our sisters and brothers with the fruit of Mary's womb, Jesus.
